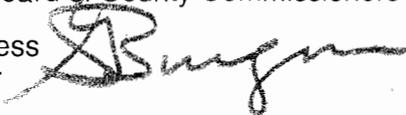

This substitute item differs from the original item as it removes the contract modification for Janitorial Services for the Downtown Government Complex at the request of the General Services Administration Department.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts, contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew, and a bid rejection. ***Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.***

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract .

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the lowest priced, responsive, responsible bidder who met the bid specifications in accordance with established polices and procedures.

Item 1.1: Automotive and Truck Replacement Parts and Specialized Repair Services is to award a contract to supply automotive and truck replacement parts and specialized repair services for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$7,698,000**.

Item 1.2: Janitorial Services for Miami-Dade Housing Agency is to award a contract to provide janitorial services to various Miami-Dade Housing Agency facilities. The amount being requested is **\$2,016,468**.

Item 1.3: Landscaping and Lawn Maintenance Services for Miami Dade Transit's Metrorail, Metromover, and Busway is to award a contract to provide landscaping maintenance services for Miami-Dade Transit's Metrorail, Metromover, and Busway. The amount being requested is **\$1,007,000**.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County.

Item 2.1: Hydraulic Cranes for Miami-Dade Public Works Department is to reject all bids received in response to a solicitation for the purchase of two hydraulic cranes for the Public Works Department.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

Item 3.1: Protective Clothing (Bunker Gear) is for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department to purchase 130 sets of protective clothing. The additional amount being requested is **\$183,430**.

Item 3.2: Juvenile/Adult Photo Imaging System is for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Police Department to upgrade existing imaging software and equipment to ensure adequate back-up of the Imaging System at prisoner booking facilities at the Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department and the Juvenile Services Department in the event of power outages. The additional amount being requested is **\$210,000**.

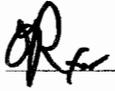

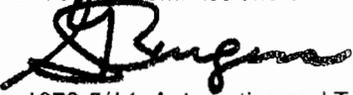

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the award of the referenced contract to the vendors listed below, to supply automotive and truck replacement parts and specialized repair services for various County departments.

CONTRACT NUMBER: 1070-5/14

CONTRACT TITLE: Automotive and Truck Replacement Parts and Specialized Repair Services

TERM: One year with five, one-year options-to-renew

APPROVAL TO ADVERTISE: July 31, 2008

CONTRACT AMOUNT: \$7,698,000 for the one-year term

PREVIOUS CONTRACT AMOUNT: \$13,735,000 for 28 months

METHOD OF AWARD: Award of Group 1, Warehouse Distribution of Automotive and Truck Parts for Equipment Less Than 1½ Ton, will be made to all responsive, responsible bidders who meet the pre-qualification requirements, offer a minimum of ten categories of product lines and a minimum 20% discount from the most recent available Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) List per manufacturer or brand, as applicable.

Award of Group 2, Warehouse Distribution of Automotive and Truck Parts for Equipment Over 1½ Ton, will be made to all responsive, responsible bidders who meet the pre-qualification requirements, offer a minimum of ten categories of product lines and a minimum 20% discount from the most recent available MSRP List per manufacturer or brand, as applicable.

Award of Group 3, Specialized Automotive and Truck Parts Suppliers, will be made to all responsive, responsible bidders who meet the pre-qualification requirements, offer a minimum of 20 categories of product lines and a minimum 20% discount from the most recent available MSRP List per manufacturer or brand, as applicable.

Award of Group 4, Automotive and Truck Specialized Repair Services, will be made to up to three responsive, responsible bidders who offered the lowest labor rate per hour, and percentage discount for parts when added in the aggregate, on an item-by-item basis. Bidders shall offer a minimum 10% discount from MSRP for parts and a minimum 10% discount from their posted regular hourly shop labor rate in order to be considered for award.

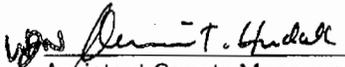
BACKGROUND

The Department of Procurement Management worked with GSA to create a solicitation that meets GSA's needs and simplifies contract management. It also allows the opportunity to acquire parts, when urgent needs arise, from the vendors who offer the best solution in cost and reduced vehicle down time.

Twenty-eight bids were received. A total of 13 vendors are being recommended for award, and 15 vendors are not being recommended for award, because they did not comply with the minimum requirements.

BACKGROUND

This contract will provide janitorial services for 30 sites operated by the Miami-Dade Housing Agency. Sites include tenant complexes, community centers, community kitchens, and management offices. The awarded vendors are required to provide all necessary supplies, equipment and labor. The solicitation is structured as a performance-based contract which defines the results the County is seeking, rather than prescribes the process by which those results are attained. The total savings resulting from use of this method is 8.3% from the current contract pricing. The benefits of performance-based contracting are better pricing and performance.

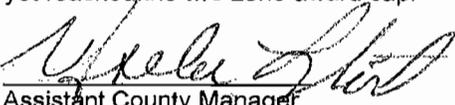

BACKGROUND

This contract will provide general grounds maintenance services to all Miami-Dade Transit Metrorail, Metromover, and Busway locations. The increase in contract value from the previous contract is due to the addition of Busway Zones K & L. Zone K covers the area of SW 264th Street to SW 308th Street. Zone L covers SW 308th Street to SW 344th Street.

Award is recommended to the lowest responsive, responsible bidders(s) on a zone by zone basis, factoring in the following considerations to ensure equitable distribution of work. A single bidder may be awarded a maximum of two zones. In the event a bidder offers the lowest price on more than two zones, recommendation for award of the zone(s) that remain after the first two zones are covered is made by identifying the next low bidder who has not yet reached the two zone award cap.

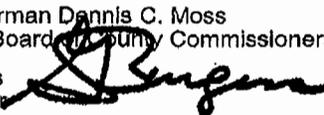

REASON FOR REJECTION

The solicitation was issued to all enrolled and registered vendors, and advertised on the County website, on November 27, 2007. A "no bid" offer was received and opened on January 16, 2008. Staff inadvertently extended the opening date to February 6, 2008, even though a "no bid" offer had been received from Kelly Tractor. An extension of time should not follow an opening, even if it results in a "no bid" offer. During the extension period, one proposal was received from Kelly Tractor.

In consultation with the County Attorney's Office, it was determined that due to the inadvertent error in accepting a proposal after the bid opening, the bid received from Kelly Tractor must be rejected. Upon Board approval to reject this bid, DPM will re-solicit bids or access another agency's competitive contract, whichever is in the County's best interest.

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REASON FOR CHANGE

In 2004, the County awarded Request for Proposals No. 403 for a Photo Imaging System contract. This contract provides Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) with the ability to digitize all images and populate arrest data that is then shared with partner agencies. Authorization is requested for additional spending authority for the MDPD to install equipment and software at additional facilities. This modification will allow upgrades to existing imaging software and purchases of additional equipment to ensure adequate backup should power outages occur.

A portion of the additional allocation will be utilized by MDPD to proceed with several proposed equipment/software expansions within the Miami-Dade Corrections Department (MDCR) facilities which will facilitate the booking and intake processes. Expansion of the Photo Imaging System at Jackson Memorial Hospital, Ward D location, and the implementation of a mobile booking station will require funding and final project authorization from the MDCR.

The remaining additional allocation will be utilized by MDPD for equipment replacement and software enhancements to the existing Photo Imaging System maintained by MDPD, along with software enhancements to the Juvenile Services Department system.
