

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PRESENT TO THE BOARD SEVERAL OPTIONS OF CONSTRUCTION SIGN DESIGNS FOR THE BOARD TO SELECT A STANDARD CONSTRUCTION SIGN TO BE USED BY ALL DEPARTMENTS AS PART OF THE COUNTY'S BRANDING STYLE AND USAGE GUIDE

WHEREAS, on May 11, 2004, this Board approved Resolution #R-643-04 requiring that all County departments adhere to the graphic standards outlined in the County's Branding Style and Usage Guide when developing construction signage; and

WHEREAS, on November 28, 2006, this Board approved Resolution #R-1343-06 directing the County Manager to locate an informational sign in close proximity to each capital project that reflects the support and sponsorship of the District Commissioner in bold writing; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to consider different options of construction sign designs in order to select the sign that the Board feels is most appropriate to ensure uniformity and a consistent message,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is hereby directed to present to the Board within sixty (60) days ~~[[several]]~~¹ >>at least four different<< options of construction sign designs>>, including a sign

design where the name of the project is removable so that the sign may be reused for other projects.<< for the Board to select a standard construction sign to be used by all County departments as part of the County's Branding Style and Usage Guide.

Summary

This resolution directs the County Mayor to present to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) several design options of construction sign designs to be used by all departments. During the May 12, 2009 Government Operations Committee, the item was amended to direct the County Mayor to present the Board with four options of construction sign designs instead of three. The Committee also amended the resolution to state that the new sign design should include removable project names to ensure that the construction signs are reusable.

Background and Relevant Legislation

Prior to 2004, Miami-Dade County did not have a standard branding style that was being utilized throughout departments.



On October 9, 2003, through Resolution R-1156, the BCC directed the County Manager to recommend policy direction to brand County government services.

On April 23, 2004, the BCC accepted the County Manager's recommendation and adopted a refreshed County logo as the official County brand. On May 11, 2004, the BCC adopted Resolution R-643-04 directing the County Manager to implement procedures for the use of the "refreshed" County logo as the official County brand.

According to the Miami-Dade Branding Style & Guide, branding county services with a consistent identifier, increases public awareness of what the County does, builds confidence in County government and increases support for county services and programs.

All County construction projects will be identified using the Standard Construction Sign. This Construction Sign must be ordered through the General Services Department, and will include all required information. It is the responsibility of the capital Departments managing construction projects to ensure that subcontractors utilize the standard construction signage.

Attached below are samples of the construction signage; the sign on the left is what is currently being used and the sign on the right represents what was being done to incorporate changes that were approved by the BCC through Resolution R-1343-06. According to the Government Information Center Department, as a way to reduce the labor and material costs of the signs, the design was modified to conform the original, standard size of 4" x 8." The information on the separate sign showing the Mayor and Commissioner names was incorporated into the 4'x8' board.
