

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR HIS
DESIGNEE TO PREPARE AND IMPLEMENT AN
EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO INFORM THE PUBLIC
ABOUT WAYS TO RECYCLE OR SAFELY DISPOSE OF
FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS

WHEREAS, fluorescent light bulbs are increasingly being used to save energy in homes and businesses, as well as County-owned and County-operated buildings; and

WHEREAS, fluorescent light bulbs contain a small amount of mercury; and

WHEREAS, mercury can contaminate the air, surface water, and ground water; and

WHEREAS, the recycling or proper disposal of fluorescent light bulbs may reduce the risk of such mercury contamination; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida prohibits the incineration of spent lamps which contain mercury, Fla. Stat. 403.7186(3); and

WHEREAS, used fluorescent light bulbs may be taken to private businesses which have fluorescent light bulb recycling programs, and used fluorescent light bulbs from homes or residences may also be taken to the Miami-Dade County Department of Solid Waste Home Chemical Collection Centers; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection has instructed consumers to visit www.earth911.org or call 1-800-CLEANUP to find a place to recycle fluorescent light bulbs in their area; and

WHEREAS, the risk of contamination from broken fluorescent light bulbs may be reduced by properly ventilating the room and following the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Guidelines for Cleaning up Broken Fluorescent Lamps, available for viewing online at www.dep.state.fl.us/waste/quick_topics/publications/shw/mercury/CFLCleanupGuidelinesLetterheadFinal062507.pdf; and

WHEREAS, these Guidelines suggest, among other things, wearing disposable gloves, using cardboard and sticky tape to pick up the lamp pieces and powder, thoroughly cleaning the area with a damp paper towel or disposable wet wipe, and sealing the lamp pieces and cleanup materials in double plastic bags; and

WHEREAS, education of the public on ways to recycle or properly dispose of fluorescent light bulbs may reduce the risk of mercury contamination,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that that the County Mayor or his designee is directed to prepare and implement an educational campaign to inform the public about the ways to recycle or properly dispose of fluorescent light bulbs, and this educational campaign shall be prepared and implemented in a way that minimizes costs and uses existing Miami-Dade County resources, such as Miami-Dade County's web portal, the Miami-Dade County 311 hotline and a media relations campaign.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
