Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Disbursement of \$260,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund to Conduct Environmental Enhancement through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the disbursement of \$260,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) for bay environmental restoration, habitat maintenance, biological monitoring and removal and disposal of bay island trash and solid waste in connection with the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program.

Scope

This Biscayne Bay disbursement request will benefit coastal areas of Districts 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, and 9.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

This resolution authorizes the disbursement of funds from the BBEETF for activities that are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF Ordinance as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Track Record/Monitor


The Director of the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) will monitor the activities performed with the BBEETF funds.

Background

Under the Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program, DERM conducts environmental restoration and enhancement activities throughout Biscayne Bay. These highly successful and popular projects are generally implemented on public lands and are assisted financially through various state and federal programs. Some of the funding agreements require long-term activities at the restored or enhanced sites. Such activities include routine trash and solid waste removal, supplemental plantings, exotic vegetation control and biological monitoring.

This disbursement request (\$260,000) will provide funding for restoration planning, permitting and monitoring (\$100,000), exotic plant control (\$30,000), restoration planting (\$50,000), and for the removal and disposal of bay island trash and solid waste (\$80,000). Restoration efforts are underway in north and central Biscayne Bay (City of North Miami, City of Miami, Florida International University, Oleta River State Park, Virginia Key, Chapman Field Park). These activities, conducted by outside contractors and County staff, are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF Ordinance described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Subject: Recommendation for Disbursement of \$260,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund to Conduct Environmental Enhancement through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program

Pursuant to Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, I am recommending the disbursement of \$260,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) to conduct environmental enhancement through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program.

This disbursement request (\$260,000) will provide funding for restoration planning, permitting and monitoring (\$100,000), exotic plant control (\$30,000), restoration planting (\$50,000), and for the removal and disposal of bay island trash and solid waste (\$80,000). Some of the funding agreements between Miami-Dade County and the funding agencies require long-term activities at the restored or enhanced sites. This disbursement will be used to meet such long-term commitments.

Restoration efforts are underway in north and central Biscayne Bay (City of North Miami, City of Miami, Florida International University, Oleta River State Park, Virginia Key, Chapman Field Park). These restoration activities are conducted by outside contractors and County staff members. The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

The \$260,000 requested to be disbursed are encumbered BBEETF monies that were deposited into the BBEETF through donations, interest and revenues (eg. State of Florida Boat Tag Registration Fee). The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent of the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund Ordinance as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
