Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Disbursement of \$800,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund for Wetlands Restoration along the Oleta River at Miami-Dade County's Highland Oaks Park through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program

Recommendation

It is recommended that the board of County Commissioners authorize the disbursement of \$800,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) for wetlands restoration along the Oleta River at Miami-Dade County's Highland Oaks Park.

Scope

This Biscayne Bay disbursement request will benefit coastal areas of District 4 (Comm. Heyman).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

This resolution authorizes the disbursement of funds from the BBEETF for activities that are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF Ordinance as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Index code: TFDE400010, Subobject: 22430, available balance: \$801,000.

Track Record/Monitor

The Director of the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) will monitor the activities performed with the BBEETF funds. The activities include all project-related tasks including overall program administration, outside funding requests and agreements, contractor selection, contract administration, restoration contract compliance, success monitoring, and final reporting.


Background

Under the Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program, DERM conducts environmental restoration and enhancement activities throughout Biscayne Bay. These highly successful and popular projects are generally implemented on public lands and are assisted financially through various state and federal programs.

This disbursement request (\$800,000) will provide funds to restore three (3) acres and enhance an additional 14 acres of wetlands within Miami-Dade County's Highland Oaks Park at 20300 NE 24 Avenue, Miami. Activities will reestablish the hydrological connection to the northern portion of the Oleta River, remove invasive exotic plants and plant supplemental native wetland species.

These activities, conducted by outside contractors and County staff, are consistent with the goals and intent of the BBEETF Ordinance described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Pursuant to Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, I am recommending the disbursement of \$800,000 from the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) to conduct wetlands restoration along the Oleta River at Miami-Dade County's Highland Oaks Park through the County's Biscayne Bay Restoration and Enhancement Program.

This disbursement request will provide funds to restore three (3) acres and enhance an additional 14 acres of wetlands within Miami-Dade County's Highland Oaks Park, located at 20300 NE 24 Avenue, Miami. Activities will reestablish the hydrological connection to the northern portion of the Oleta River, remove invasive exotic plants and plant supplemental native wetland species. These wetlands serve as the tidal headwaters for the Oleta River, which flows through Maule Lake into northern Biscayne Bay.

These restoration activities are conducted by outside contractors and overseen by County staff members. The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

The \$800,000 requested to be disbursed are encumbered BBEETF monies that were deposited into the BBEETF for the purpose of restoration and enhancement of Biscayne Bay and its foreshore. The proposed activities are consistent with the goals and intent of the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund Ordinance as described in Section 24-40 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DISBURSEMENT OF \$800,000 FROM THE BISCAYNE BAY ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENT TRUST FUND TO CONDUCT WETLANDS RESTORATION ALONG THE OLETA RIVER AT MIAMI-DADE COUNTY'S HIGHLAND OAKS PARK THROUGH THE COUNTY'S BISCAYNE BAY RESTORATION AND ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
