On October 20, 2009, the Board of County Commissioners approved a 30-day contract extension for Item 2, Financial Advisory Services General Segment, and Item 3, Financial Advisory Services Enterprise Segment. The Terms and Conditions of these contracts remain the same.

This substitute item differs from the original item as authorization is requested for one Option-to-Renew period for each of the contracts. The initial contract value of Item No. 2 increased from \$850,000 to \$941,000.

Recommendation

At the October 8, 2009 Board of County Commission meeting, Agenda Item No. 801B was bifurcated. Items 1, 3, 7, and 8 were adopted by the Board; items 2, 4, 5, and 6 were deferred. Following discussion by Board members, the Administration is offering an alternative recommendation that calls for the authorization to exercise the next Option-to-Renew term only for the four previously deferred items. The previously deferred items have been renumbered. The initial contract value of Item No. 2 has been modified. The amount was increased from \$850,000 to \$941,000.

Scope

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are past performance issues noted in Item 4, Towing Services. The departments' contract managers are reflected in the individual agenda items.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The competitively bid contract listed in this item requires approval to exercise OTRs contained in the contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million.

This contract was awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

On August 11, 2008, the Board was informed that, prospectively, Board approval would be sought when awarding contracts exceeding \$1 million in value if the OTRs are exercised. The following contracts were awarded prior to August 11, 2008: Items 1, 2, 3, and 4.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure that continuing to purchase from the awarded vendor is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: Printed Case File Folders seeks authority to exercise the second OTR period to purchase printed case file folders for the Clerk of Courts. The amount being requested for this option term is **\$344,000**.

Item No. 2: Financial Advisory Services General Segment seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for financial advisory services for Miami-Dade County. The amount being requested for this option term is **\$567,000**.

Item No. 3: Financial Advisory Services Enterprise Segment seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for financial advisory services for Miami-Dade County. The amount being requested for this option term is **\$567,000**.

Item No. 4: Towing Services (County Vehicles) seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for several County departments. The amount being requested for this option term is **\$1,467,000**.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE OPTION-TO-RENEW PERIODS FOR COMPETITIVE CONTRACTS AWARDED UNDER THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR DESIGNEE'S DELEGATED AUTHORITY FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF CHARTER COUNTY TRANSIT SYSTEM SURTAX FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is being utilized to purchase printed case file folders for documents stored by the Clerk of Courts. The contract allocation was increased by 84% during the initial term due to demand resulting from a significant increase in the number of foreclosure filings. Current market prices are 8.7% higher than the County's current contract prices. The vendor has maintained current pricing for the next option to renew term. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the second option to renew period.

Performance Data:

Several performance issues were identified on this contract and on Contract No. RFQ 97, Police Towing, with vendors who are also on this contract. The performance issues are noted below.

Excalibur Towing Service , Midtown Towing of Miami and Westbrook Motors, Inc.

During this contract's current term, difficulties were identified with invoicing procedures. These issues have been resolved following notifications to, and meetings with, the vendors.

Westbrook Motors, Inc.

On RFQ 97, while conducting a site inspection due to the sale of the company, Miami Dade Police Department staff discovered that this firm did not have sufficient inside storage space. This issue was resolved and the proper storage space is now available.

Kauff's of Miami, Inc.

On RFQ 97, this firm was overcharging citizens for towing services and failed to send letters notifying owners of tows via certified mail, and in a timely manner. These issues were resolved and the company provided refunds to those that were overcharged.

A-1 Redland Economy Towing

On RFQ 97, this firm was overcharging citizens for towing services. These issues were resolved and the company provided refunds to those that were overcharged.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is for purchase of towing services for County owned vehicles and equipment. The contract includes unallocated funds totaling \$168,751 that are administered by the Department of Procurement Management. These funds may be used to supplement department allocations in order to satisfy service requirements.

Market research has shown that that the County's pricing is lower than the base prices being paid by other jurisdictions in the South Florida area, for the most frequently used types of tows. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise the first option to renew period.
