RESOLUTION CO-DESIGNATING CORAL WAY/SW 24<sup>th</sup> STREET FROM SW 97<sup>th</sup> AVENUE TO SW 107<sup>th</sup> AVENUE AS "2506 BRIGADE BOULEVARD"

WHEREAS, in 1960, recruiting began among anti-Castro exiles in Miami for an infantry training camp near Retalhuleu, in the Sierra Madre Mountains on the Pacific coast of Guatemala; and

**WHEREAS**, in November 1960, with 430 men in training, the leaders of the brigade were chosen, and the brigade was named the 2506 Brigade using the membership number of the first casualty during training, Carlos Rodriguez Santana; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 17, 1961, a group of 1,334 men traveled on a seaborne force to Cuba to overthrow Fidel Castro, of whom 1,297 actually landed on Cuban shores joined by an additional 177 airborne paratroops; and

WHEREAS, the invasion was unsuccessful, and 1,183 men were captured, tried and imprisoned and eventually a group of private citizens in the U.S. negotiated to give \$53 million dollars in food and drugs in exchange for the release of these prisoners; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the members of the 2506 Brigade with this codesignation; and

WHEREAS, Coral Way/SW 24<sup>th</sup> Street from SW 97<sup>th</sup> Avenue to SW 107<sup>th</sup> Avenue is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and
