## **Recommendation**

- John DeMott to fill the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District Seat as recommended by the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District.

## **Background**

The APAB consists of thirteen members representing a variety of agricultural industries. Section 2-935, Code of Miami-Dade County, requires that the BCC fill vacancies occurring on the APAB. By Code, each nominating organization must submit for BCC review a minimum of one nominee for their vacant position(s), the nominee's resume and the minutes of the organization's meeting at which the nominee was selected. The required documentation for each of the following nominees is attached.

### **Allied Agri-Business seat**

Mr. Larry Caudle was selected for re-appointment by the Dade County AgriCouncil, Inc. Mr. Caudle has several years of experience as a cattle and grove farmer and has attended the University of Miami and North Carolina State University. *The Miami-Dade AgriCouncil recommended the re-appointment of Larry Caudle at their July 14, 2009 meeting.*


### **South Dade Soil & Conversation District**

**WHEREAS**, one vacancy of two Nursery Industry representative seats exists on the APAB; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Larry Caudle has completed his first term as the Allied Agri-Business representative on the APAB and is eligible for a second term; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. John DeMott has completed his first term as the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District representative on the APAB and is eligible for a second term; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2-935 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that the designated organizations shall submit at least one nominee; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2-935 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that vacancies on the APAB are to be filled by the Board of County Commissioners; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Manager and the Dade County AgriCouncil, Inc. recommend that the Board of County Commissioners re-appoint Mr. Larry Caudle to Allied Agri-Business seat; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Manager and the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District recommend that the Board of County Commissioners re-appoint Mr. John DeMott to represent the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District seat,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that Mr. Larry Caudle and Mr. John DeMott are hereby re-appointed to the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board for one four-year term to begin on January 1, 2010 and to end on December 31, 2013.



**Meeting Called to Order** by Cooper McMillan, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors at 9:45 a.m.

Meeting was held at 1450 North Krome Avenue, Suite 104, Florida City, Florida – USDA Service Center.

**Last Month's Meeting Minutes were approved;** John DeMott made motion to accept last month's financials that were presented at last meeting with the correction made to the Advisory Board's Report to reflect that John DeMott stated that the State Law supersedes the County Ordinance regarding recycling on the east side of Krome Avenue. Florida State Law supersedes the county regulation stating that you can recycle waste on your own property. Presently there are no Best Management Practices for this particular item and the district should look into writing policy BMP procedures.

Also, Bill Townshend to Administrator's report, he received the 2009 Recycle Florida Today – Outstanding Waste Reduction Recipient Award. Bill was able to attend this ceremony even after his arm accident that he had recently. We are very proud of Bill; his dedication and hard work at the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District is quite admirable.

**Financial Report – Thomas Davenport**

Financials for the month of June 2009 were approved; Cooper made motion to accept financials, and Louise King second the motion, a unanimous vote was made to accept June 2009 financials.

Wendy explained some of the items that needed clarification on the financial statements. Payroll is running smoothly and all quarterly reports have been filed.

Wendy and Norma have been working on setting up a better EPA reporting system for the EPA grant.

Norma Wilson reported that the situation with Pastran, CPA's is finally over. We have received our financial records that we had requested for a very long time. We had to make final telephone calls to Raul Pastran, owner, regarding the critical need to return our 2008 financials immediately.

We can now start our internal 2008 financial audit with our auditor Nestor Caballero. We need to check into finding another accountant to do our financials; taxes and final annual reports.

**Chairman's Report - Cooper McMillan**

Cooper advice us of the red bay ambrosia beetle, xyleborus gladbratus Eichhoff, and the associated fungus is affecting our Florida agricultural community. This beetle's fungus germinates in the avocado trees' tissue and can cause a tree to die in a matter of 30 days.

State officials and the agricultural farmers are very concerned about this infestation of the red bay beetle because it is very hard to detect which trees have been infested until the tree begins dying in a matter of weeks or months after it has been infected. The potential damage to the agricultural market could be devastating to the South Dade area. Researchers are working very hard to come up with an effective method of ridding the avocado groves of this major problem.

Cooper presented our guest, Dr. Reiza from the USDA, he spoke regarding his job position transfer to Georgia. The SDSWCD has written letters to the state representatives asking that Dr. Reiza from USDA be kept in the Dade County area and not be transferred because we need his service very much in this area.

The second guest Adam Kanter was introduced, he spoke to the SDSWCD Board and explained his interest in helping the District as an investor financier and bring funds to help finance composting projects. Morgan explained that Adam Kanter has financial expertise and we have the knowledge and field operations and technical experience in working with composting.

The Board has asked Adam Kanter to provide the Board with a draft letter explaining what exactly he is offering to do, how this funding works and how it will benefit the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District.

Cooper asked Morgan to send this information to the Board before the next board meeting.

**Nursery BMP Lab Report – Donald Grimsley**

Nursery Lab is running smoothly and contractually on track. Donnie has negotiated a better contract for the new fiscal year. He has finished his last fiscal year very well.

Sonny stated the the CBO Grant's annual audit is requiring the District to have two signers added to each check that is written from CBO Grant funds.

A motion was made to change from one signature needed to two signatures needed on CBO Grant checks; Morgan is the first signer and either Cooper McMillan or Tom Davenport will be alternate signers. Louise seconds the motion and the board voted unanimously.

**Mobile Irrigation Lab Report – Robert Perez**      *See attached report.*

Robert stated that the MIL is doing very good. The South Florida Water Management District- Mr. Berman says that he is a supporter of the MIL Lab.

Robert asked the Board to write letters to the AFDAC to support the MIL Lab.

**Ag Practices Advisory Board Report** – John De Mott said that he was interested in continuing his participation as Ag Practices Advisory Board for the next two years. Louise made a motion to have John De Mott continue in his position, Waldy second the motion and the Board voted unanimously to keep his in this position.

**NRCS Report - see attached report**

Christine Coffin gave a report on the NRCS activities.

She reported that the EPA was awarded \$2 million dollars. The NRCS is accepting applications for the 2010 Farm Bill, October 30, 2009 is the deadline.

NRCS is transferring Marcos Loperena to Kissimmee, FL in August 2009. He will no longer be working with Christine.

**Administrator's Report – Morgan Levy**

Morgan stated that Bill Crispin advised us on how to resolve the problem with Raul Pastran at Pastran, CPA.

SDSWCD has received a renewal of contract for the next 3 years.

The sludge situation is better this month. This sludge is essential to the agricultural growers in the community and we have been having a very hard time getting it on a timely basis from MDWS. Hopefully this problem will not continue in the future.

The Board has been working on several power-point presentations for composting and educational purposes.

Louise, Waldy, and Tom along with Morgan, Bill and Norma from the District have been working with the composting power-point presentation that will be sent presented at the AFCD – Jacksonville, FI annual conference.

We will be using a new composting sales company. BW Organics had some problems with one of the in-vessel composters and now we will be using Bright Star, Inc. as soon as possible.

Morgan stated that Tom and Waldy have experience in writing grants and that they will be working with the District to request funds from grants.

We had Sandi Nanni and Robin Wright come and give the Distric a presentation of their grant writing experience. We are looking for funds to help the District be able to work more projects and create more revenue.

**Project Manager Report: Bill Townshend**

Bill Townshend is re-cooperating very well from his arm accident. He has been talking to customers about the Pilot Composting Projects at the Breakers Resort and other sites.

He has been looking into getting a meat grinder for another one of our other projects.

He is also working with Morgan on getting a patent on the composting expertise that he has gathered during the past.
