RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
PASS LEGISLATION PROVIDING HOMEOWNERS AND
SMALL BUSINESSES ADDITIONAL FLEXIBILITY IN
MAKING PARTIAL PAYMENTS OF PROPERTY TAXES

WHEREAS, the current economic downturn has created financial burdens for many homeowners and small businesses; and

WHEREAS, in February, 2009, this Board passed Resolution No. 122-09, which urged the Florida Legislature to pass legislation providing additional flexibility in making partial payments of property taxes; and

WHEREAS, during the 2009 regular session, the Legislature passed CS/SB 1580, which authorized Tax Collectors to accept one or more partial payments for property taxes; and

WHEREAS, prior to the passage of CS/SB 1580, only payments for the entire amount of property taxes due could be accepted pursuant to state law; and

WHEREAS, prior to the passage of CS/SB 1580, any payment less than the entire amount due for property taxes would not be accepted and if property taxes were not paid in full, interest and penalties would apply to the entire amount; and

WHEREAS, CS/SB 1580 helped homeowners and small businesses by allowing them to pay whatever amounts they could related to property taxes and then only incur interest on amounts that remained unpaid; and

WHEREAS, more can be done to assist homeowners and small businesses many of whom are struggling to pay their property tax bills during these difficult economic times; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature should provide additional flexibility related to the payment of property taxes beyond that included in CS/SB 1580, provided such additional flexibility does not create significant fiscal and cash flow problems for local governments and school districts; and

WHEREAS, providing additional flexibility in paying property taxes could assist many homeowners and small businesses given the current economic conditions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to pass legislation that would provide added flexibility to property owners in making partial payments of property taxes, provided such additional flexibility does not create significant fiscal and cash flow problems for local governments and school districts.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2010 State Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
