RECOMMENDATION

This recommendation to award construction Contract No. S-829 (A) to Poole & Kent Company of Florida in the amount of \$11,364,490 has been prepared by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) and is recommended for approval pursuant to Miami-Dade County Code, Section 2-8.2.11, Water and Sewer Department Contracting Authority. This project is one in a series of projects under the High Level Disinfection (HLD) Program to comply with Consent Order No. 03-1376 negotiated by the County and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). It also adheres to regulatory requirements resulting from a rule change implemented by the US Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to meet effluent quality standards for deep well disposal. Upon the completion of the entire project, the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (SDWWTP) will be rated as a 285 million gallons per day (MGD) plant.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The authority of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute and implement this contract is consistent with those authorities granted under the Code of Miami-Dade County.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The work consists of furnishing all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to construct the "Fats, Oil, and Grease (FOG) Process Building" at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant, located at 23300 SW 88th Avenue, in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The scope of work includes, but it is not limited to the following: the construction of a concrete block structure to house the sewage receiving and solids process, including the concrete foundation and prestressed concrete roof; construction of two (2) 50,000 gallon reinforced concrete FOG Tanks; furnishing and installing seven (7) stop/slide gates, two (2) overflow pumps, two (2) grit pumps, two (2) submersible sludge pumps, coarse and fine screens, screw conveyors, seventeen (17) motorized

control valves, an odor control system, a two (2) ton overhead crane, HVAC and associated plumbing, an irrigation system, two truck scales complete with truck washing facilities; a control panel, meters, transmitters and associated process equipment instrumentation; electrical wiring and conduits, electrical power, lighting and switchgear, and all other appurtenant and miscellaneous items.

It is WASD's intent to obtain a completely functional and satisfactory installation under this project, and any items of labor, equipment or materials which may be reasonably assumed as necessary to accomplish this end shall be supplied whether or not they are specifically shown on the plans or stated in the specifications. The contractor shall provide all sheeting, shoring, bracing and all other labor, material or equipment required to preclude damage to, or loss of functionality of, any existing facility or system.

EXPLANATION: WASD received six bids for this project, one of which was incomplete and therefore considered "non-responsive". Four of the five responsive bids were under the Engineer's estimate. WASD's recommendation is to award this contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Poole & Kent Company of Florida, whose base bid is 36.78% under the Engineer's base estimate. There was a 4.48% difference between the two lowest bidders and a 8.66% difference between the second and third lowest bidders, showing good competition.

In 2008, Poole & Kent Company of Florida was awarded three (3) high level disinfection (HLD) multi-year projects at the County's South District Wastewater Treatment Plant. Final evaluations are not available for two (2) of the projects because they are still ongoing. There are a total of three (3) evaluations for Poole & Kent Company of Florida in the OCI database showing a 3.6 out of a possible 4.0 rating. This indicates overall satisfactory performance. On the one (1) completed HLD project, the CIIS data base reveals that Poole & Kent Company of Florida earned a superior performance rating of 4.0.

CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on the _____ day
of _____, 20_____, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida,
acting by and through the Office of the Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes called the "County"),
and Pool & Kent Company of Florida, party of the second part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

WITNESSETH

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as

"South District Wastewater Treatment Plant, HLD Upgrade to 285 MGD, Septage Receiving and Solids Process Building, Contract No. S-829 (A)"

for the aggregate amount reflected by the Proposal, said aggregate amount being of Eleven Million Three Hundred Sixty Four Thousand Four Hundred Ninety Dollars and No Cents (U.S. Dollars) \$11,364,490.00.

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer, and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of his proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Covenants and Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at his own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Questionnaire, the Advertisement for Bids, the Instructions to Bidders, the Proposal, the Certified Resolution (Proposal/Prescribed Bid Bond), the Prescribed Bid Bond, the Contract, the Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the Certified Resolution (Contract/ Surety Performance and Payment Bond), the General Covenants and Conditions, the Supplemental General Conditions (if Ordinance 90-143 is applicable) including Wage and Benefit Schedules, the Specifications, the Plans, any Addenda which may be issued, the Subcontractor /Supplier Listing Form (Ordinance 97-104 as amended by Ordinance 00-30), the Reporting Subcontracting Policies and Procedures (Ordinance 98-159), the Community Small Business Enterprise Program (CSBE) Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), and the provisions for the following: Affirmative Action Plan (Ordinance 98-30) and Disclosure Form; Bidder's (Debarment) (Ordinance 93-129); Code of Business Ethics (Ordinance 01-96); Criminal Record (Felony) (as amended by Ordinance 00-30); Disability Nondiscrimination (Resolution R - 3 8 5 -95 as amended by Resolution R-182-00); Domestic Violence Leave (Ordinance 99 - 5 as amended by Resolution R-185-00); Due Fees or Taxes Paid (Ordinance 95-178 as amended by Ordinance 00-30); Metro-Dade Employment Drug-Free Workplace (Ordinance 92-15 as amended by Ordinance 00-30); Metro-Dade Employment Family Leave Plan (Ordinance 91-142 as amended by Resolution R-183-00); Fair Wage (Ordinance 90-143 as amended by Ordinance 95-183); Mandatory Clearinghouse for Posting Notice of Job Opportunities (Resolution R-937-98 as amended by R-1145-99); Obligation (Ordinance 99-162); Office of Miami-Dade County Inspector General (IG) (Dade County Code Sec. 2-1076); Sworn Statement - Public Entity Crimes [Florida Statute Sect. 287.133 (3) (a)]; and Metro-Dade County Disclosure (Ordinance 90-133).

CONTRACT

The terms and conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that he has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the General Covenants and Conditions, Section 41 "Audit Rights and Review of Records."

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or his designee, pursuant to Section 2-8.2.11 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, may negotiate and settle contractor claims, waive liquidated damages, extend contract time, and issue change orders for additional work. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed \$500,000 in cumulative dollar amount and shall not exceed 15 percent of the contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to environmental remediation or health requirements and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Contract in six (6) counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original Contract, all as of the day and year first hereinbefore written.
