

RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO INCREASE  
FUNDING TARGETED AT FIGHTING MEDICARE FRAUD

**WHEREAS**, Medicare is a \$368 billion a year federal program; and

**WHEREAS**, Medicare fraud arises when individuals and corporations seek to collect Medicare reimbursements from the federal government under false pretenses; and

**WHEREAS**, it is estimated that Medicare fraud costs U.S. taxpayers as much as \$60 billion every year in stolen taxpayer money, which equals \$200 for every man, woman and child in the U.S.; and

**WHEREAS**, estimates of Medicare fraud are just that, estimates, because the federal government does not keep track of the total amount of Medicare fraud; and

**WHEREAS**, Medicare fraud in South Florida is estimated to be at least \$2.5 billion annually; and

**WHEREAS**, in December, 2009, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Inspector General issued a report finding that Medicare paid \$520 million to Miami-Dade home healthcare agencies for treating diabetic patients, more than what the agency spent in the rest of the country combined on such patients and despite the fact that Miami-Dade County is home to just 2 percent of the nation's diabetic patients eligible for Medicare; and

**WHEREAS**, Congress has for years underfunded programs to combat Medicare fraud, with just 3/100ths of 1 percent of Medicare funding dedicated to ensuring the integrity of the program; and

**WHEREAS**, since 2006, Medicare administrators each year have asked Congress for an additional \$300 million to fight fraud, but so far Congress has refused to fund the request; and

**WHEREAS**, Medicare fraud costs the American taxpayers tens of billions of dollars per year and diverts health care funds from people on Medicare who need the services; and

**WHEREAS**, more funds to fight Medicare fraud could yield a substantial return on the investment,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges Congress to increase funding targeted at fighting Medicare fraud.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the members of the Miami-Dade Congressional Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2010 Federal Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
