RESOLUTION CO-DESIGNATING SW 24TH/26TH STREET
FROM SW 115TH AVENUE TO SW 119TH AVENUE AS
“PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN BOULEVARD”

WHEREAS, Abraham Lincoln, the 16th president of the United States, guided this country through the most devastating experience in its national history, the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, elected president in 1860, on January 1, 1863, he issued the Emancipation Proclamation that declared forever free those slaves within the Confederacy; and

WHEREAS, Abraham Lincoln was reelected in 1864 as Union military triumphs heralded an end to the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, Abraham Lincoln was assassinated at Ford’s Theatre on April 14, 1865; and

WHEREAS, Abraham Lincoln statements and ideology are still valid today, and as he said at the Gettysburg Address, “these dead shall not have died in vain, that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom and that the government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from earth”; and

WHEREAS, S.W. 24th/26th Street from S.W. 115th Avenue to S.W. 119th Avenue is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor President Abraham Lincoln with this codesignation; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission Districts 10 and 11.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board :

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, co-designates S.W. 24th/26th Street from S.W. 115th Avenue to S.W. 119th Avenue as “President Abram Lincoln Boulevard”.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works Department and Land Development Division of the Public Works Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Co-Prime Sponsors of the foregoing resolution are Commissioners Joe A. Martinez and Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
