

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
AUTHORIZE THE USE OF CHARTER COUNTY
TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM SURTAX PROCEEDS FOR ON-
DEMAND TRANSIT SERVICE FOR LOW-INCOME SENIOR
CITIZENS

WHEREAS, section 212.055, Florida Statutes, authorizes charter counties to impose a sales surtax of up to one cent for transportation systems; and

WHEREAS, the statute enumerates what can be funded with the Charter County Transportation System Surtax, including construction, operation and maintenance of a countywide bus system and a fixed guideway rapid transit system; and

WHEREAS, the statute also allows a portion of surtax proceeds to be distributed to municipalities pursuant to an interlocal agreement, with such proceeds to be expended by the municipality for the purposes authorized by the statute; and

WHEREAS, in 2002, the voters of Miami-Dade County approved a one-half penny transit surtax proposed pursuant to the authority set forth in section 212.055; and

WHEREAS, 20 percent of the proceeds of the one-half penny transit surtax are distributed to those municipalities in existence as of November 5, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the City of Miami desires to use some of its share of the one-half penny transit surtax for on-demand transit service for low-income senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, section 212.055 currently does not authorize the use of Charter County Transportation System Surtax proceeds for on-demand transit services, and did not allow for such a use at the time the one-half penny transit surtax was passed in 2002; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to urge the Legislature to amend section 212.055 to authorize the use of Charter County Transportation System Surtax proceeds for on-demand transit service for low-income senior citizens in the event the half-penny transit surtax goes back to the voters at some future date,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to authorize the use of Charter County Transportation System Surtax proceeds for on-demand transit service for low-income senior citizens.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the issue identified in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2010 state legislative package.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Bruno A. Barreiro. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
