Subject: Top Shuttle Service, Inc. application for a transfer of Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation No. 30201

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the transfer of Passenger Motor Carrier (PMC) Certificate of Transportation No. 30201 from Top Shuttle, Inc. to Top Shuttle Service, Inc.

SCOPE

This PMC Certificate of Transportation is countywide, allowing the certificate holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

Applicant is a new permit holder; however, the principal of the corporation, Mr. Gabriel Mejia, has been a registered chauffeur since 2003. There has been some enforcement history. During the last five years, Mr. Mejia has received three (3) citations: two for failure to maintain trip sheets and one for operating an unsafe vehicle. All citations have been satisfied. The Consumer Services Department (CSD) will be responsible for monitoring this company.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Miami-Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 31-103 (m) of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by Miami-Dade County in processing transfer applications. No certificate may be sold, assigned or transferred to another until the proposed sale, assignment, or transfer has been approved by the Board. In considering the proposed transfer of ownership or control of the certificate, the Board shall determine whether or not said transfer is contrary to the public interest, upon evidence submitted at the June 8, 2010 Government Operations Committee (GOC) meeting (Attachment A). The Board may approve or refuse to approve said transfer upon such terms and conditions or may reasonably alter, restrict or modify the terms and provisions of such transfer if in the public's interest.

Top Shuttle, Inc. has filed an application to transfer PMC Certificate of Transportation No. 30201 to Top Shuttle Service, Inc. Originally issued on December 5, 1995, to Sunflower Tours via Resolution R-1674-95 (Attachment B), transferred to BLT Ventures, Inc. in 1998 via Resolution R-600-98 (Attachment C), and transferred to Top Shuttle, Inc. in 2003 via Resolution R-428-03 (Attachment D), PMC No. 30201 authorizes special operations services. This class is defined as transportation of persons in a motor vehicle to a common destination or series of common destinations where the person may be charged

as an individual or as part of a group, including but not limited to charter, sightseeing, or subscription service, not between fixed terminals or on a regular route.

The company is required to adhere to the terms of the resolution, which approved the initial certificate (R-1674-95). Top Shuttle Service, Inc., located at 418 NW 4 Street, Suite 104, Miami, Florida 33128, seeks to continue providing this class of service by transporting resident and tourist groups to and from various locations throughout Miami-Dade County 24-hours a day, seven days a week. Transportation is required to be pre-arranged at least 24-hours prior to service, using chauffeur driven vehicles with a seating capacity of nine or more, but less than 28 passengers, excluding the driver. The proposed rates are listed on the attached rate schedule (Attachment E).

The management plan submitted by Mr. Gabriel Mejia, President of Top Shuttle Service, Inc., includes maintenance, communication, and record keeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted and the proposed service standards adequately meet passenger transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation reveals no criminal conviction for the applicant or any corporate officers within five years of the date of the application.

As required by the Code, the applicant has provided disclosure of the terms and conditions regarding the transfer of the certificate. A Sales Agreement (Attachment F) between Mr. Mejia, Inc. and Carlos M. Correa, former president of Top Shuttle, Inc., establishes the acquisition by Mr. Mejia of PMC Certificate of Transportation No. 30201 for a total price of \$6,000.00.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the application of Sunflower Tours, Inc., for a Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation to provide pre-arranged special operations service.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Metropolitan Dade County.

Section 31-103 of the Code provides the procedure to be followed by Metro Dade County in processing certificate applications. Based on these requirements, a public hearing has been scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners. At the conclusion of the public hearing the Board may issue or refuse to issue the certificate or issue the certificate with such modifications or upon such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public interest may require. In reaching its determination, the Board shall consider the application, the County Manager's report and recommendation, all matters presented at the public hearing, and among others, the following criteria:

- (1) That the applicant is fit, willing and able in accordance with the requirements of this section, to provide the transportation to be authorized by the certificate, and is able to comply with this article and regulations of the commission.
- (2) That the transportation to be provided under the requested certificate is consistent with the public interest.
- (3) That the proposed transportation service will improve the quality of transportation available to the public.

Sunflower Tours, Inc., located at 1080 94th Street, #609, Bay Harbour Island, Florida 33154, seeks to obtain a Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation to provide pre-arranged special operations transportation to passengers throughout all of Dade County. This class of service is defined as the transportation of persons in a motor vehicle to a common destination or series of common destinations where the person may be charged as an individual or as part of a group, including but not limited to charter, sightseeing, or subscription service, not between fixed terminal or on a regular route.

The company seeks to transport tourist groups to various points throughout Dade County. Transportation will be pre-arranged on a 24-hour minimum basis. These services will be provided 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, using chauffeur-driven vehicles with a seating capacity of nine (9) or more, but less than twenty-eight (28) passengers, excluding the driver. The proposed rates are listed on the attached fare schedule.

The management plan submitted by Ms. Beatriz Semino, President of Sunflower Tours, Inc., includes maintenance, communication, and record keeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted and the proposed service standards adequately meet passenger transportation and comfort needs. 


