Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Acquisition of the Designated Property Known as Parcel 1 for Right-of-Way Needed for the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) Project Entitled Roadway Expansion, Beautification and Improvements to SW 176 Street, from US Highway 1 to SW 107 Avenue, to be a Public Necessity and Authorizing the Use of Charter County Transit Surtax Funds

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve the attached resolution declaring the acquisition of Parcel 1 for right-of-way needed for roadway expansion, beautification and improvements to SW 176 Street from US Highway 1 to SW 107 Avenue, to be a public necessity, and authorizing the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee and the County Attorney to employ appraisers, expert witnesses, obtain required environmental audits, and to take any and all appropriate actions to acquire the subject property in fee simple, by donation, purchase at values established by appraisals, or by eminent domain proceedings, including a declaration of taking as necessary for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County. Proceeds from future Charter County Transit System Sales Surtax (the Surtax) bond sales will be used to fund this project, therefore, approval by the BCC and Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) is required.

Scope

This project is located within Commission District 9.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding for the right-of-way acquisition, design and construction of this project has been budgeted at \$5,815,000 and will be provided by the Surtax levied pursuant to Section 29.121 of the Code of Miami-Dade County. This project was specifically listed in Exhibit 1 of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) as one of the Board requested Major Roadway and Neighborhood Improvement projects within Commission District 9. The additional Operation and Maintenance (O&M) costs associated with this project once built out are estimated to be approximately \$9,000.00 per year.

The initial acquisition cost has been budgeted and no additional fiscal impacts are expected; however, the ultimate acquisition cost in the event of litigation would be subject to a future ruling by the Court.

Background

This Resolution is for the acquisition of Parcel 1 of six (6) separate parcels needed by the Public Works Department (PWD) for programmed improvements to SW 176 Street from US Highway 1 to SW 107 Avenue. This project consists of reconstructing the existing roadway to include a raised landscaped median, bicycle facilities, sidewalks, curb and gutters, continuous storm drainage system, signalization, pavement markings and signage, and roadway lighting. The area to be acquired by PWD for the street improvements is legally described in "Exhibit A" and illustrated in the parcel location map in "Exhibit B" attached. These improvements will improve traffic mobility and improve drainage as well as beautify SW 176 Street from US 1 to SW 107 Avenue.

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE ACQUISITION OF PARCEL 1 FOR RIGHT-OF-WAY NEEDED FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO SW 176 STREET FROM US HIGHWAY 1 TO SW 107 AVENUE TO BE A PUBLIC NECESSITY; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE AND THE COUNTY ATTORNEY TO TAKE ANY AND ALL APPROPRIATE ACTIONS TO ACCOMPLISH ACQUISITION OF THE SUBJECT PROPERTY IN FEE SIMPLE, BY DONATION, PURCHASE AT VALUES ESTABLISHED BY APPRAISALS OR BY EMINENT DOMAIN COURT PROCEEDINGS INCLUDING DECLARATIONS OF TAKING, AS NECESSARY AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF CHARTER COUNTY TRANSIT SURTAX FUNDS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds and declares the acquisition of the parcel of land in fee simple as legally described in "Exhibit A" and shown on the project location map in "Exhibit B" attached hereto and made a part hereof, for the public purpose of improvements to SW 176 Street from US Highway 1 to SW 107 Avenue, to be required and necessary to accomplish such improvements; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is authorized under the Constitution and Laws of Florida, including Chapters 73, 74, 125, 127 and 341, Florida Statutes, and Sections 1.01 (A) (1), (2) and (21), of the Home Rule Charter of Miami-Dade County, to acquire said property by eminent domain proceedings,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board ratifies and adopts these matters set forth in the foregoing recital.

Section 2. This Board finds and declares that the acquisition of Parcel 1 as legally described in “Exhibit A” attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is needed for the public purpose of improvements to SW 176 Street from US Highway 1 to SW 107 Avenue.

Section 3. This Board authorizes and directs the County Mayor or the County Mayor’s designee and the County Attorney to employ appraisers, review appraisers and expert witnesses, to obtain required environmental audits and to take any action to acquire Parcel 1 in fee simple, as legally described in Exhibit “A” by donation, purchase at values established by appraisals or eminent domain proceedings, including a declaration of taking, as necessary for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County.

Section 4. Pursuant to Resolution R-974-09, this Board (a) directs the County Mayor or the County Mayor’s designee to record the instruments of conveyances accepted herein in the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and provide a recorded copy of instruments to the Clerk of the Board within thirty (30) days of execution of said instruments; and (b) directs the Clerk of the Board to attach and permanently store a recorded copy of said instruments together with this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

The Chairperson thereupon declared the resolution duly passed and adopted this 8th day of July, 2010. This resolution shall become effective as follows: (1) ten (10) days after the date of its adoption unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board, and (2) either i) the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) has approved same, or ii) in response to the CITT's disapproval, the County Commission reaffirms its award by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Commission's membership and such reaffirmation becomes final.

Parcel 1


A portion of Lot 1, Block 5, TOWN OF PERRINE, according to the Plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book B at Page 79 of the Public Records of Miami-Dade County, Florida; being more particularly described as follows: Commence at the Northeast corner of said Lot 1; thence South 22°32'27" West along the Easterly line of said Lot 1 for a distance of 189.01 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING of the herein described parcel of land; said point lying on a non-tangent circular curve concave to the Northeast; the center of said curve bearing North 69°00'48" East from said point; thence Northwesterly along said circular curve to the right, having a radius of 390.00 feet through a central angle of 5°18'19" for 36.11 feet to a non-tangent point; thence North 2°47'12" West for 173.41 feet to a non-tangent point on a circular curve concave to the Southeast; the center of said curve bearing South 14°16'41" East from said point; thence Southwesterly along said curve to the left, having a radius of 25.00 feet through a central angle of 78°30'31" for 34.26 feet to a point of tangency; thence South 2°47'12" East along a line 35.00 feet west of and parallel to the west line of the Northeast ¼ of Section 32, Township 55 South, Range 40 East for 210.25 feet to a point of curvature of a circular curve concave to the Northeast; thence Southeasterly along said curve to the left, having a radius of 25.00 feet through a central angle of 48°08'08" for 21.00 feet to a point on the Easterly line of said Lot 1; thence North 22°32'27" East along said Easterly line for 49.96 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING.





These items authorize the acquisition of certain parcels of land which the County has declared to be required for construction of certain public infrastructure improvement projects.

Background and Relevant Legislation

The Florida Constitution, State Statutes and the Home Rule Charter of Miami-Dade County authorize the Board of County Commissioners to initiate the taking of property through eminent domain proceedings. See Chapters 73, 74, 125, 127 and 341, Florida Statutes; and §§1.01(A)(1)(2) and (21) of the Home Rule Charter of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Policy Change and Implication

These resolutions to acquire land are consistent with current County and State policy regarding land acquisition.

Budgetary Impact

The fiscal impact to the County has been budgeted at \$5,815,000 and will be funded by future Charter County Transit System Surtax bond funds. However, these items only authorize the acquisition of certain parcels by donation, purchase or by eminent domain proceedings. The true fiscal impact to the County will be quantified once the County enters into negotiations with the owners of the parcels.

Once completed, operation and maintenance of this project is estimated at \$9,000 per year.
