Subject: Resolution Authorizing the execution of a Supplemental Joint Participation Agreement in

the Amount of \$1,319,928 with the Florida Department of Transportation to Re-Program Funds from the University Pedestrian Overpass and the NW 7th Avenue Transit Hub

Projects to the Miami Intermodal Center/Earlington Heights Connector Project

### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the execution of a Supplemental Joint Participation Agreement (SJPA), in substantially the form attached, with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to re-program funds in the amount of \$1,319,928 from the Transit Urban Capital and Intermodal Development Program from the University Pedestrian Overpass and 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue Transit Hub projects to the construction of the Miami Intermodal Center/Earlington Heights (MIC/EH) Connector project.

It is further recommended that the Board authorize the receipt and expenditure of additional funds as specified in the Agreement. An equal match of \$1,319,928 will be provided from existing local funding allocated for the MIC/EH Connector project from the Charter County Transit System Surtax (Surtax).

### **SCOPE**

While this project spans portions of County Commission Districts 2, 3, 5 and 6, the impact of this project benefits the riding public, and is therefore, countywide. In addition, the projects affected by this reprogramming are in County Commission Districts 3 and 7.

### FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

The total State participation for this SJPA is \$1,319,928. The State's \$1,319,928 funding contribution would be matched equally from the existing Surtax contribution towards this project. This SJPA will provide additional funding of \$1,319,928 from existing State funding allocated for the University Pedestrian Overpass (\$1,000,000) and the NW 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue Transit Hub (\$319,928) projects.

Reallocation of these funds to the MIC/EH Connector project increases the State's total participation to \$101,319,928 and reduces the Department's bond financing. There is no additional current or future impact on the annual County budget, as this item is requesting re-programming of already approved funding between projects. The County match for the MIC/EH has already been allocated.

#### TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

MDT has entered into numerous funding agreements with FDOT for more than twenty-five (25) years. The project manager for this grant is Patricia Barry, Administrative Officer 3, MDT Financial Services

### **DELEGATED AUTHORITY**

In accordance with Section 2-8.3 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to identifying delegation of Board authority, there are no authorities beyond that specified in the resolution, which include authority for the Mayor, or Mayor's designee, to execute the agreement and expend these and any additional funds should they become available.

### **BACKGROUND**

On June 9, 2002, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 02-116, authorizing the levy of a one half cent transit system surtax for the People's Transportation Plan (PTP), subsequently approved by voters on November 5, 2002. A program for corridor improvements was identified and included in the PTP, providing the local funding match required for future Federal and State funding to support the design and construction. Among the corridors identified was the 2.4-mile Metrorail connection between the Earlington Heights Metrorail Station and the MIC, located on the east side of the Miami International Airport (MIA).

In addition to serving as a central transfer point for Metrorail, Metrobus, South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), Amtrak and private charter services, the MIC will also consolidate all car rental agencies into one facility. The MIC will be a primary link to MIA, an employment center with over 40,000 jobs, offering transportation alternatives for workers and travelers thereby reducing traffic congestion in and around MIA.

On May 3, 2005, the Board approved Resolution No. R-486-05 authorizing a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) for State funding in the amount of \$100 million. This multi-year JPA includes funding through fiscal year 2010, subject to annual legislative appropriation.

The recommended SJPA will provide additional State funding re-allocated from the NW 7th Avenue Transit Hub and the University Pedestrian Overpass projects. The existing agreement with the State for both of these projects expires on June 30, 2010 and these monies are only eligible for transit-related projects.

At present, MDT is financially unable to provide the matching funds required by the State in the existing JPA for the University Pedestrian Overpass project. However, at present a local "overmatch" exists on the MIC/EH project given the large local contribution to this project; hence, no new local funding source would be required as a match in order to reallocate the funds to this project. Therefore, to preserve the funding, the State has approved re-programming of these funds totaling \$1,319,928 to the MIC/EH Connector project, using the existing Surtax funding allocation on this project as the funding source for the local match. With this SJPA, the State's participation is increased to \$101,319,928.

MDT continues to identify and pursue available funding sources for the University Pedestrian Overpass project that do not require a local match. In the interim, MDT will work closely with the City of Coral Gables and the University of Miami to address safety concerns and to develop a scope of work which will provide safety improvements within the same proposed location.

The NW 7th Avenue Transit Hub project is adequately funded by other funding sources such as Federal Transit Administration, Government Obligation Bonds (GOB) and Low Income Tax Credits and does not require the use of the \$319,928 funding provided in the existing JPA with the State.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING **EXECUTION** OF SUPPLEMENTAL JOINT PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT FLORIDA **DEPARTMENT** WITH THE (SJPA) TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) TO RE-PROGRAM FUNDS FROM THE UNIVERSITY PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS AND THE 7<sup>th</sup> AVENUE TRANSIT HUB PROJECTS TO THE MIAMI INTERMODAL CENTER/EARLINGTON **HEIGHTS** CONNECTOR PROJECT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,319,928; AUTHORIZING RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS AS SPECIFIED IN THE SJPA; AUTHORIZING RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURE OF ANY ADDITIONAL FUNDS SHOULD THEY BECOME AVAILABLE; AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF THE CHARTER COUNTY TRANSIT SYSTEM SURTAX FUNDS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida is authorized to enter into agreements to provide State funding for transportation programs and projects,

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That this Board approves the agreement between Miami-Dade County and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in substantially the form attached hereto and made a part hereof, in the amount of \$1,319,928 in additional State funds to re-program funds from the University Pedestrian Overpass and the NW 7th Avenue Transit Hub projects to the Miami Intermodal Center/Earlington Heights/Connector Project.

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Section 2. That this Board further authorizes the County Mayor, Mayor's designee, or the Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) Director to execute such contracts and agreements as are approved by the County Attorney's Office; to receive and expend funds in accordance with such aforementioned contracts and agreements; and to file and execute any additional agreements, revisions, or amendments as required to carry out the projects for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County.

Section 3. That the County staff is authorized to furnish such additional information as the FDO T may require in connection with the application for the improvement.
