Subject: Resolution Ratifying the County Mayor's or County Mayor's Designee Action in Authorizing the Department of Procurement Management Contracts Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.7 of the Code of Miami-Dade County Relating to the Economic Stimulus Plan

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) adopt the attached resolution ratifying the County Mayor's or County Mayor's designee actions taken on May 14, 2010 in expediting the purchase of services funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) projects identified on the attached schedule (Exhibit A) as authorized by Ordinance No. 09-60 extending the "Economic Stimulus Plan" (ESP). The following project was awarded:

- Thirteen vendors under a pre-qualification pool in the amount of \$5,088,578 to provide **Weatherization and Rehabilitation Services to area residents through Federal grants** acquired by the Community Action Agency (CAA). The contract term is for a three year period with no options-to-renew.

SCOPE

The contract award detailed in Exhibit A is to identify and make available to the County, qualified suppliers, installers and service providers for the purpose of repairing and/or upgrading existing residential homes in accordance with Request for Quotes (RFQ) that will be issued by the County. The work may require a general, electrical, roofing, plumbing and/or solar water heating systems contractor.

TRACK RECORD / MONITOR

The staff assigned to the day-to-day operations of this contract is listed in the contract award memorandum for the project. This project is being monitored by CAA Project Manager, Shawn Angell. Contract management support is being provided by Albert Falcon, DPM Senior Procurement Contracting Agent.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

CAA received federal grants to fund the Weatherization and Rehabilitation Programs. Some of these grants are funded, in part, by ARRA. The Office of Strategic Business Management has confirmed that funds have been allocated for this project as part of the adopted Fiscal Year 2009-10 Capital Budget, under Project No. 632902.

There is no additional fiscal impact beyond what is stated in the recommendation to award memorandum.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The authority of the County Mayor or County Mayor's Designee to execute and implement this contract is consistent with those authorities granted under the Code of Miami-Dade County, Ordinance No. 09-60 amending the Economic Stimulus Plan Extending the Sunset Provision

BACKGROUND

The Community Action Agency (CAA) received over \$5 million in federal grant funding designed to benefit low income, single family homes and elderly residents approved through various home rehabilitation and energy conservation programs. These programs provide construction trade services that include general, electrical, plumbing, roofing and solar heating improvements to qualifying homeowners throughout Miami Dade County. CAA has also secured funding from the State of Florida, Department of Community Affairs for the Weatherization Assistance Program. One hundred percent of these funds were required to be obligated by March 18, 2012. Fifty percent must be expended by March 18, 2011, and the remainder expended by March 18, 2012.

The resulting contract establishes a pool of pre-qualified vendors for subsequent work order competitions to perform weatherization and rehabilitation services on homes of low income and elderly residents. Additional vendors that meet the pre-qualification criteria specified in the solicitation can be added at any time during contract term.

Section 2-8.2.7 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, known as the "Economic Stimulus Plan" (ESP), adopted by the Board on July 17, 2008 through Ordinance No. 08-92, provides for expeditious treatment of professional service agreements and construction contracts associated with funded capital improvement projects. On June 30, 2009, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 09-60 amending the ESP Ordinance to include extending the sunset provision and the inclusion of capital projects and purchases of goods and services funded by the ARRA. The ARRA includes funding for projects in Miami-Dade County that require fast spend-out rate.

The ESP is an effective way to stimulate the local economy and accelerate the County's capital program by moving funded projects through the contracting process at a quicker pace. This provides an opportunity for our government to lessen the negative impact of the current economic conditions on the affected professions and trades. The ESP reduces the timeline, about 90-120 days on each procurement cycle, to advertise solicitations and competitive bids and award qualifying projects, resulting in significant efficiencies in the implementation of those grant projects.

CAA has also secured funding from the State of Florida's Department of Community Affairs for the Weatherization Assistance Program

This contract establishes five pools, one for each of five construction trades. CAA will evaluate properties and determine the type of work needed to rehabilitate and/or weatherize each home. The applicable pre-qualified vendors within the group will be invited to bid through a request for quotation process.

There are currently thirteen approved vendors, and an additional twenty-one that are being reviewed for inclusion in the pools once they provide all required documentation. This contract allows additional qualified vendors to be added to the pool.
