Subject: Medical Examiner Department FY 10 Forensic Science Training Development
and Delivery Program Grant Application

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the Mayor or Mayor's designee's action in applying for United States Department of Justice FY 2010 Forensic Science Training Development and Delivery Program funds in the amount of \$500,425. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments, after approval by the County Attorney, as required by program guidelines. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to apply for, receive, and expend additional funds that may become available during the term of the grant; to file and execute any amendments to the application for and on behalf of the County; and to exercise amendments, modifications, renewal, cancellation, and termination clauses of any contracts and agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney's Office.

Scope

The scope of the project is countywide in nature, and will benefit state and local forensic science practitioners and criminal justice partners throughout the Nation. Project goals include: 1) Enhance the delivery of an existing, year-round Forensic Pathology Fellowship Program; and 2) Provide Forensic Science training opportunities at no-cost to State and local forensic science practitioners and criminal justice partners. Project funding will support 2,080 hours of intensive, hands-on, multidisciplinary training to four physician pathologists (Fellows) participating in the Forensic Pathology Fellowship Program; and 40 hours of free (required) Forensic Science training and education to an estimated 90 State and local forensic science practitioners, and criminal justice partners (3,600 total hours).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

If funded, this grant will provide a one-year grant award in the amount of \$500,425 with an option for renewal for up to three years of grant funding. A match contribution in the amount of \$278,342 comprised of personnel and fringe benefit costs for two participant Forensic Science Pathology Fellows is provided by the Medical Examiner Department.

Track Record/Monitor

Medical Examiner Department will serve as the administering agency for the grant project, and be responsible for overall grants management and fiscal administration. The department has an extensive history of managing grant projects. The Department will handle the disbursement and expenditure of grant funds, and manage programmatic and fiscal reporting in accordance with project reporting and auditing procedures stipulated by the Department of Justice.

Background

Ratification of this application is necessary because the short turnaround time imposed by the application deadline did not allow sufficient time for the processing of the resolution and its submission to the Board prior to submission of the application.

This important project will support training and staff development for the Medical Examiner Department's need to fulfill the department's mission and maintain accreditation. The need for requested grant funds is substantiated by the ongoing budgetary constraints faced by the County, as they continue to impact the department's staffing and training resources. Since 2007, the Medical Examiner Department has reduced its departmental budget by 24%, losing a total of 17 positions. With a projected County revenue reduction of 12% for FY 2010-11, the department faces an additional \$2.6 million budgetary gap, with the possibility of having to eliminate its training programs and staff altogether. As a result, the nationally accredited and internationally known Forensic Pathology Fellowship Program (a proud fixture of the department since 1963), and the Medicolegal Investigation of Death forensic training program would be impacted. Without DOJ grant funds, the Miami-Dade County Medical Examiner Department may jeopardize its ability to sustain its continuing quality and timely delivery of services, maintain its long-standing accreditation with the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME) and Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) and comply with its statutorily mandated duty to provide medicolegal death investigative services for an estimated 2.4 million residents of Miami-Dade County.
