Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Homeless Trust to Issue a Request for Proposals to Design and Construct a Domestic Violence Center and for Domestic Violence Center Operation

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to utilize the Homeless Trust to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for qualified vendors to: 1) design and construct a second domestic violence center; and 2) operate the domestic violence center. The results of the RFP process shall be reviewed by the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, who shall bring a recommendation for selection of providers to the Board for award of contracts and lease agreements for a developer and center operator.

Scope

The proposed domestic violence center is planned for an underserved area in Southwest Miami-Dade County. However, the impact would be countywide in scope because the center will serve domestic violence survivors and their dependents throughout Miami-Dade County. The proposed new domestic violence center plans are for forty (40) additional emergency shelter beds based on budget projections with flexibility for expanding capacity to fifty (50) beds in the future.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The design, construction and operation of the proposed domestic violence center would be funded by the County's Domestic Violence Oversight Board (DVOB) Trust Fund. The Trust Fund receives fifteen (15) percent of the Local Option Food and Beverage Tax specifically designated for construction and operation of new domestic violence centers. This project will not require support from the County's General Fund.

Track Record/Monitor

The RFP process will be directed and monitored by the Homeless Trust as the department delegated to provide staff support to the Domestic Violence Oversight Board.


Background

The first domestic violence center constructed and operated with the Food and Beverage Tax, The Lodge, opened in March 2004 and has since provided emergency shelter for more than 2,500 domestic violence survivors and their dependents. In addition to emergency shelter, The Lodge provides a broad array of services including but not limited to face-to-face and telephone counseling; assessments of service needs for children affected by domestic violence; court advocacy for domestic violence survivors; community education and professional training; safety planning and danger assessments; information and referral services; outreach services for women, children and men who are domestic violence survivors; daycare for children of

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domestic violence survivors; transitional housing placements and alternative placements when no shelter beds are available.

Currently, the existing certified domestic violence centers in Miami-Dade County are often operating at capacity. Consequently, there is a lack of available dedicated emergency shelter beds for domestic violence survivors and their dependents at an extremely critical and dangerous time in their lives. Presently, one hundred three (103) of the County's certified emergency shelter beds are located in the northwest area and twenty-four (24) are located in southwest Miami-Dade County. The need for additional capacity is urgent and was re-emphasized in the 2010 Update to the DVOB Domestic Violence Plan that called for an increase in emergency shelter beds and support services by 30% over the next five (5) years. Construction and operation of this second center will significantly address some of the unmet needs for domestic violence survivors and their dependents in Miami-Dade County.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO UTILIZE THE HOMELESS TRUST AS THE ISSUING DEPARTMENT TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT A SECOND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CENTER AND FOR THE CENTER'S OPERATION

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:
