Subject: Waiver of Formal Bid Procedures Allowing Payment to Entertainers to Perform and/or Exhibit at Park Facilities

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of the formal bid procedures of Section 5.03 (D) of the Home Rule Charter and Administrative Order 3-38, to allow the Park and Recreation Department (MDPR) to contract with professional performers, visual artists and associated expenses for engagements at various park venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Nuestras Raices Hispanic Heritage Cultural Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, Zoo Miami, and The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery, in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. This waiver will remain constant for two years or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended, whichever occurs first.

Scope

These park venues have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The financial impact to Miami-Dade County will not exceed \$1,000,000.

Track Record/Monitor

The negotiated agreements will require written authorization from the MDPR Director and County Manager. This waiver will be administered and monitored by the MDPR, Assistant Director for Operations.

Background

Seven bid waivers have been authorized by the Board since 1988. The last two waivers (R-914-08 – Exhibit A and R-1002-06 – Attachment 1) limited fees in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. As of September 12, 2010, approximately \$579,360 remains of the \$1,500,000 limit authorized in R-914-08 (see attached Addendum). The initial and second waivers (R-1055-88 and R-1078-98) (Attachments 3 and 4 respectively) limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and ten-year time limit each. The third bid waiver (R-1252-01) (Attachment 5) limited fees to \$25,000 per performance with a \$600,000 cap and a four-year time limit. The fourth bid waiver (R-1161-03) (Attachment 6) limited fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee, with an

\$800,000 cap and four-year time limit. The fifth waiver (R-1470-04) (Attachment 7) limited fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition with a \$1,000,000 cap and a two-year time limit. The increase in the aggregate amounts each year was necessary to accommodate the continued growth of arts and cultural programs and services provided to the community.

Due to reduced resource allocations for performances during the past two fiscal years, approximately \$579,360 remains of the \$1,500,000 limit authorized in R-914-08. For this reason and commensurate with reduced performance allocations, the funding cap for this new waiver request has been reduced to an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 in total.


South Florida is a popular corridor for performers and visual artists from all over the world, and the opportunity to book exceptional talent on short notice often arises, usually at significantly reduced costs and contractual requirements and riders. When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all artists require an immediate deposit to retain a date. In addition, most artists have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and other special requirements that must be met by the producer/presenter. These special conditions may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, security arrangements, special assistance and certain performance or exhibition and skills requirements from sound technicians, curators, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment, and other miscellaneous purchases or rentals.

The channels for normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements which usually require a very quick turn around. Board approval of each agreement or arrangement is not feasible given the short notice of availability, the uniqueness of the artistry and the negotiations of the contracting requirements. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff makes every effort to use existing qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible as it relates to equipment, sound and lighting and other items related to the presentation of artists.

MDPR's oversight includes seven dedicated cultural facilities including the 990 seat Joseph Caleb Auditorium, the 2,500 seat Miami-Dade County Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Raices Hispanic Heritage Center, The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery, Deering Estate, and Miami Metrozoo. MDPR's cultural portfolio includes unique high quality programs that address everything from concerts, festivals, theater and other cultural opportunities in neighborhoods, to hosting major performers in large annual anchor events such as Fourth of July Concerts and the Love-in at Greynold's Park. Presentations over the course of this waiver have included artists such as Amaury Gutierrez, Marta Rauhlin, Nicole Henry, Butterfly Vaughn, Hugh Masekela, The Guess Who, Chuck Negron, Tracy Lawrence, Mountain, Charlie Daniels, Grand Funk Railroad, The Spencer Davis Group and many exceptional local performers.

It continues to be the goal of MDPR to generate additional revenue such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar initiatives now taking place throughout the parks system cost effective and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.

RESOLUTION WAIVING FORMAL BID PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO SECTION 5.03(D) OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY HOME RULE CHARTER AND THE REQUIREMENTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 3-38, BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE TO ALLOW THE PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT TO CONTRACT WITH PROFESSIONAL ENTERTAINERS AND ARTISTS FOR ENGAGEMENTS AT PARK VENUES IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000 AND NOT TO EXCEED \$50,000 PER PERFORMANCE OR EXHIBITION AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE SUCH AGREEMENTS AND TO EXERCISE THE CANCELLATION PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board finds it in the best interest of the County to waive formal competitive bid procedures pursuant to Section 5.03 (D) of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter and the requirements of Administrative Order 3-38 by a two-thirds vote in order to allow the Park and Recreation Department (MDPR) to contract with professional entertainers and artists for engagements at Park and Recreation Department venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Nuestras Raices Hispanic Heritage Cultural Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, Zoo Miami, and The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 or \$50,000 per performance or exhibition, and authorizes the County Mayor or

County Mayor's designee to execute contracts therefore, following approval of the County Attorney's Office and to exercise cancellation provisions contained therein.



TRACK/RECORD/MONITORING

The negotiated agreements will require written authorization from the MDPR Director and County Manager. This waiver will be administered and monitored by the MDPR, Division of Arts and Culture Manager.

BACKGROUND

Six bid waivers have been authorized by the Board since 1988. The last waiver (R-1002-06) (Attachment 1) limited fees in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. As of June 12, 2008, approximately \$350,000 remain of the \$1,500,000 limit authorized, which indicates that the funding cap will be met before the two-year time limit (see attached addendum). The initial and second waivers (R-1055-88 and R-1078-98) (Attachments 2 and 3 respectively) limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and ten-year time limit each. The third bid waiver (R-1252-01) (Attachment 4) limited fees to \$25,000 per performance with a \$600,000 cap and a four-year time limit. The fourth bid waiver (R-1161-03) (Attachment 5) limited fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee, with an \$800,000 cap and four-year time limit. The fifth waiver (R-1470-04) (Attachment 6) limited fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition with a \$1,000,000 cap and a two-year time limit. The increase in the aggregate amounts each year was necessary to accommodate the continued growth of arts and cultural programs and services provided to the community.



When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all artists require an immediate deposit to retain a date. In addition, most artists have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and other special requirements that must be met by the producer/presenter. These special conditions may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, security arrangements, special assistance and certain performance or exhibition and skills requirements from sound technicians, curators, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment, and other miscellaneous purchases or rentals.

This bid waiver is in the best interest of the county because the channels for normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements which usually require a very quick turn around. Board approval of each agreement or arrangement is not feasible given the short notice of availability, the uniqueness of the artistry and the negotiations of the contracting requirements. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff makes every effort to use existing qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible as it relates to equipment, sound and lighting and other items related to the presentation of artists.

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It continues to be the goal of MDP to generate additional revenue such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar initiatives now taking place throughout the parks system cost effective and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.

Subject: Waiver of Formal Bid Procedures Allowing Payment to Entertainers to Perform and/or Exhibit at Park Facilities

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of the formal bid procedures of Administrative Order 3-38 and bid protest procedures, to allow the Park and Recreation Department to schedule and pay professional performers, visual artists and associated expenses for engagements at various park venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Nuestras Raices Hispanic Heritage Cultural Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, Miami Metrozoo, and The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery, in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. This waiver will remain constant for two years or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended, whichever occurs first.

BACKGROUND

On July 19, 1988, the Board authorized a waiver of formal bid procedures (R-1055-88) (Attachment 1), for payments to performers engaged to perform at Park and Recreation facilities (primarily Metrozoo). The initial waiver applied to performance fees not to exceed \$50,000 each or a total of \$600,000 for a ten-year period or until the aggregate amount was expended. On September 15, 1998, the Board authorized a second similar bid waiver (R-1078-98) (Attachment 2). Resolution No. R-1078-98 included performers engaged for the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center as part of the "Heart of the City Series," formerly the "Echoes of Change Series." This waiver also limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and a ten-year time limit. The Board authorized a third bid waiver under Resolution No. R-1252-01 (Attachment 3) on October 6, 2001. This waiver limited fees to \$25,000 per performance with a \$600,000 cap and a four-year time limit. A fourth bid waiver under Resolution No. R-1161-03 (Attachment 4) on October 9, 2003, limited fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee, with an \$800,000 cap and a four-year time limit. The last bid waiver was adopted on December 14, 2004 under Resolution No. R-1470-04 (Attachment 5). This waiver limits fees to \$50,000 per performance or exhibition with a \$1,000,000 cap and a two-year time limit or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended. As of June 9, 2006, there is approximately \$20,000 remaining of the \$1,000,000 limit, which is an indication that the funding cap will be met before the two-year time limit (see attached addendum).

The attached recommendation increases the aggregate amount to \$1,500,000, a \$500,000 increase over the cap that was approved under Resolution No. R-1470-04. The increase is necessary to accommodate the continued growth of arts and cultural programs and services provided to the community. It is important to note that the \$1,500,000 figure, like the caps in previous versions of this resolution, does not represent the addition of "new" or additional money. Rather, this figure represents funds that are already contained in the normal annual operating budget of the facilities and programs

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that contract with entertainers.


South Florida is a popular corridor for performers and visual artists from all over the world, and the opportunity to book exceptional talent on short notice often arises, usually at significantly reduced costs and contractual requirements and riders. When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all artists require an immediate deposit to retain a date. In addition, most artists have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and other special requirements that must be met by the producer/presenter. These special conditions may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, security arrangements, special assistance and certain performance or exhibition and skills requirements from sound technicians, curators, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment, and other miscellaneous purchases or rentals.

The channels for normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements which usually require a very quick turn around and Board approval of each agreement or arrangement is not feasible, given the short notice of availability, the uniqueness of the artistry and the negotiations of the contracting requirements. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff will continue to make every effort to use existing qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible as it relates to equipment, sound and lighting and other items related to the presentation of artists.

The Park and Recreation Department provides much leadership and opportunity for the booking of artists, as its oversight includes seven dedicated cultural facilities including the 990 seat Joseph Caleb Auditorium, the 2,500 seat Miami-Dade County Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Raices Hispanic Heritage Center, The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery, Deering Estate, and Miami Metrozoo. The Park and Recreation Department's cultural portfolio includes unique high quality programs that address everything from concerts, festivals, theater and other cultural opportunities in neighborhoods, to hosting major performers in large annual anchor events such as the Fourth of July Concerts at Black Point and Amelia Earhart Parks. Presentations over the course of this waiver have included artists such as Hugh Masekela, The Guess Who, Chuck Negron, Tracy Lawrence, Mountain, and Charlie Daniels.

It continues to be the goal of the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department to generate additional revenue such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar initiatives now taking place throughout the park system cost effective and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a Waiver of Formal bid procedures, and of the requirements of Administrative Order 3-2, in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per event, thereby allowing the Park and Recreation Department to schedule and to customarily pay entertainers as required by their unique individual contracts, plus certain related expenses, all of which may occur at various park facilities but primarily at Metrozoo.

This recommendation has received concurrence from the General Services Administration - Procurement Management Division.

BACKGROUND

Contracting with professional performers, and preparing for their shows, was, at first, a new and complex task for our Park and Recreation Department, and therefore was handled through an agent (P.A.C.F.). However, through this direct experience, staff acquired much ability within this specialized area of production and entertainment. Over the past two years, acting on our own behalf, staff successfully utilized a similar bid waiver to arrange 23 major concerts, resulting in net revenue of over \$71,000 and exposure of our parks to thousands of patrons.

The demands of these productions are great and we should hasten to point out many complexities. More often than realized, entertainers are booked unexpectedly and on short notice and usually at a reduced price if already in the region. But when a booking occurs, virtually all performers require an immediate deposit to confirm a date. In addition, most entertainers have unique setup and individual requirements in their contract - such as a specific model microphone, on-site accommodations, etc. This often determines special assistance needed in the form of sound technicians, stagehands, miscellaneous purchases, etc.

As in many other endeavors by the Park and Recreation Department, normal County purchasing procedures simply are not adequate. Board approval of each agreement is not feasible, nor is our typical bid procedure applicable - especially in view of these unknown unique requirements and short advance notices. A waiver of formal bid procedures appears to be the most reasonable approach. Staff would, however, attempt to use existing and appropriate vendors and/or to obtain at least three quotes when possible.

The public has shown acceptance of these concerts which has contributed toward Metrozoo's record attendance. Staff will continue to market events, as each will typically be cosponsored by one or more supporters. This ongoing relationship with cosponsors places an added responsibility on staff to produce quality concerts, well received by both the public and the entertainment industry. Naturally, our financial goal is to continue to generate off-setting revenue, and hopefully to realize a net profit.

Therefore, in the interest of increasing revenues at our parks, and public awareness of leisure time opportunities offered by Metrozoo, while maintaining good relations with a broad scope of performers and business supporters, the Board's approval of this waiver of formal bid procedures respectfully requested and believed to be in the best interest of the county.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of formal bid procedures and the requirements of Administrative Order 3-2 to allow the Park and Recreation Department (Department) to schedule and pay professional entertainers and associated expenses, to perform at various park facilities (Miami Metrozoo, Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center and other park venues) in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per event. This amount remains the same as in the previous ten (10) years with no need to increase and will remain constant for ten (10) years or until the \$600,000 is spent.

BACKGROUND

On July 19, 1988 the Board authorized a waiver of formal bid procedures in an amount not exceed \$600,000 in total nor \$50,000 per event, in connection with payments to engage entertainers to perform at Park and Recreation Department facilities (primarily Metrozoo). This bid waiver (R-1055-88) was recently used to pay performers at the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center as part of the Heart of the City series, formerly the Echoes of Change series. There is approximately \$5,000 remaining in the budget from 1988.

More than often realized, entertainers are booked unexpectedly, on short notice and usually at a reduced price, if already in the region. When a booking occurs virtually all performers require an immediate deposit to confirm a date. In addition, most entertainers have a unique set-up and individual requirements in their contracts, such as a specific type of microphone and on-site accommodations, which determine the special assistance needed in the form of sound technicians, stagehands, and miscellaneous purchases.

Normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these types of arrangements. Board approval of each agreement is not feasible especially in view of the unknown unique contract requirements and short advance notices. The General Services Administration, Procurement Management Division reviewed this recommendation and advised that a bid waiver would be the appropriate method for acquiring these services. Staff will attempt to use existing vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible.

The public has shown acceptance of the Heart Of The City/Echoes Of Change performances at the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and African Heritage Cultural Arts Center. The goal of the Park and Recreation Department is to continue to generate revenue to offset costs, and hopefully realize a net profit.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of the formal bid requirements of Administrative Order 3-2, to allow the Park and Recreation Department to schedule and pay professional entertainers and associated expenses for engagements at various park venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, and Miami Metrozoo in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 in total, nor \$25,000 per performance. This waiver will remain constant for four (4) years or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended, whichever occurs first. Increasing the aggregate amount over previous similar waivers (R-1078-98 and R-1055-88) is recommended to accommodate the expanding demand for arts programming in County parks.

BACKGROUND

On July 19, 1988, the Board authorized a waiver of formal bid procedures (R-1055-88), for payments to performers engaged to perform at Park and Recreation facilities (primarily Metrozoo). That waiver applied to performance fees not to exceed \$50,000 each or exceed a total of \$600,000 for a ten (10) year period or until the aggregate amount was expended. On September 15, 1998, the Board authorized a second similar bid waiver (R-1078-98) after expiration of the ten-year limit on the first waiver. Resolution R-1079-98 includes performers engaged for the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center as part of the "Heart of the City Series," formerly the "Echoes of Change Series." This waiver also limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and a ten-year time limit. As of September 2001, there is approximately \$1,905 remaining of the \$600,000 meaning that the funding cap will be exceeded well before the ten-year time limit.

South Florida is a highly trafficked corridor for entertainers from all over the world, and the opportunity to book exceptional talent on short notice often arises, usually at reduced fees. When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all performers require an immediate deposit to confirm a date. In addition, most entertainers have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and special requirements that must be met by the producer. These special requirements may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, special assistance and certain performance and skills requirements from sound technicians, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment and other miscellaneous purchases.

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~~Normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements and Board approval of each agreement is not feasible, given the short notice of availability and contracting requirements. The General Services Administration and the Procurement Management Division reviewed this recommendation at its initial implementation and advised that a bid waiver would be an appropriate method for acquiring these services. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff will continue to make every effort to use existing qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible.~~

The Heart of the City Series has garnered local and national accolades for the Department and the County from the community and other professionals for its high-quality presentation of some of the most renowned artists in the world. Presentations in 2000-2001 include the Temptations, the premiere of an original play, "Love Will Come Again," Jimmy "J.J." Walker of the television show, "Good Times," Cecily Tyson, Halle Berry, the Spinners, and the African musical group, "Lady Smith Black Mozambo." It continues to be the goal of the Park and Recreation Department to generate additional revenues such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar performance initiatives now taking place throughout the Park system, cost effective, and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of the formal bid requirements of Administrative Order 3-38, to allow the Park and Recreation Department to schedule and pay professional entertainers, visual artists, clowns and associated expenses for engagements at various park venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Nuestras Raices Hispanic Heritage Cultural Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, Miami Metrozoo, Roxcy Bolton Women's History Park, and Amelia Earhart Park in an amount not to exceed \$800,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. This waiver will remain constant for two (2) years or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended, whichever occurs first. Increasing the aggregate amount over previous similar waivers (R-1252-01, R-1078-98, and R-1055-88) is recommended to accommodate the expanding demand for arts programming in County parks.

BACKGROUND

On July 19, 1988, the Board authorized a waiver of formal bid procedures (R-1055-88), for payments to performers engaged to perform at Park and Recreation facilities (primarily Metrozoo). That waiver applied to performance fees not to exceed \$50,000 each or exceed a total of \$600,000 for a ten year period or until the aggregate amount was expended. On September 15, 1998, the Board authorized a second similar bid waiver (R-1078-98) after expiration of the ten-year limit on the first waiver. Resolution 1078-98 included performers engaged for the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center as part of the "Heart of the City" Series, formerly the "Echoes of Change Series." This waiver also limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and a ten-year time limit. On November 6, 2001, the Board authorized a third bid waiver (R-1252-01) after the aggregate amount on the second waiver had depleted to \$1,905. Resolution 1252-01 limited performance fees to \$25,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and a four year time limit. As of April 30, 2003, there is approximately \$10,000 remaining of the \$600,000 limit indicating that the funding cap will be met before the four-year time limit (Attachment A).

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It is important to note that the \$800,000 figure, like the caps in previous versions of this resolution, does not represent the addition of 'new' or additional money. Rather, this figure represents funds that are already contained in the normal annual operating budget of the facilities/programs that contract with entertainers.

South Florida is a highly trafficked corridor for performers and visual artists from all over the world, and the opportunity to book exceptional talent on short notice often arises, usually at significantly reduced costs and contractual requirements and riders. When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all artists require an immediate deposit to retain a date. In addition, most artists have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and other special requirements that must be met by the producer/presenter. These special conditions may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, security arrangements, special assistance and certain performance or exhibition and skills requirements from sound technicians, curators, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment, and other miscellaneous purchases or rentals.

The channels for normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements and Board approval of each agreement or arrangement is not feasible, given the short notice of availability, the uniqueness of the artistry and the negotiations of the contracting requirements. The General Services Administration and Procurement Management Division reviewed this recommendation at its initial implementation and advised that a bid waiver would be an appropriate method for acquiring these services. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff will continue to make every effort to use existing qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible.

The Heart of the City Series has garnered local and national accolades for the Department and the County from the community and other professionals for its high quality presentation of some of the most renowned artists in the world. Presentations over the course of this waiver under this program have included Broadway star, Melba Moore, Isaac Hayes, "Martin" television show star, Tommy Ford, and Halle Berry. Additionally, the Parks Department has expanded its Touring Arts Programs beyond the Caleb Auditorium using county-wide neighborhood park facilities to present programs like the July 4, 2002 concert at Amelia Earhart Park featuring the Miami Symphony Orchestra, "La Noche Encantada" at the Raices Hispanic Cultural Center in West Kendall which featured flamenco and salsa artists and musicians, world renown violinist Vicki Richards and dancer, Dale Andree at the "Arts to Nature" exhibit at Tropical Park and the University of Miami Woodwind Quartet in performance at "Art Expressions" at Greynolds Park. The Gallery at the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center also became one of the Miami sites for the international Art Basel, the world's leading art show, by hosting both an exhibit and accompanying performance that was billed as one of the important locations for Art Basel-goers to visit.

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In 2002, the Department initiated the "Touring Arts Installations Program," which provides visual and performance arts experiences in cultural facilities, neighborhood and natural settings, such as parks. The series has generated much positive attention from artists, residents, tourists, and the media for its innovative approach to bringing the gallery, theater, concert hall and/or

museum directly to a park. Visual and performance artists have created work around a park's natural environment and assets, its people, and involved the community in both the artistic process and as arts consumers, which makes the inclusion of 'visual' artists a natural addition to the artists covered under this bid waiver. Visual artists provide many of the same immediate opportunities, conditions and requirements as fall under the general scope of the bid waiver. As this program grows, and the scope of the arts and entertainment activities provided throughout Miami-Dade's many 'natural' theaters, concert halls and galleries expands, so must our abilities to provide these opportunities as efficiently as possible to meet booking deadlines and contractual retainers and conditions.

It continues to be the goal of the Park and Recreation Department to generate additional revenue such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar initiatives now taking place throughout the Park system, cost effective, and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.

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

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,



Subject: Waiver of Formal Bid Procedures to Schedule and Pay Performers, Visual Artists and Associated Expenses for Engagements at Various Park Venues

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve a waiver of formal bid requirements of Administrative Order 3-38, to allow the Park and Recreation Department to schedule and pay professional performers, visual artists and associated expenses for engagements at various park venues including the Joseph Caleb Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center, Nuestras Raices Hispanic Heritage Cultural Center, Miami-Dade County Auditorium, Charles Deering Estate, Miami Metrozoo, and The Women's Park and Roxcy Bolton Women's History Gallery in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 in total, nor \$50,000 per performance or exhibition fee. This waiver will remain constant for two years or until the aggregate recommended amount is expended, whichever occurs first. Increasing the aggregate amount to \$1,000,000, a \$200,000 increase over the cap requested in Resolution No. R-1161-03 is recommended to accommodate the continued growth of arts and cultural programs and services provided to the community.

BACKGROUND

On July 19, 1988, the Board authorized a waiver of formal bid procedures (R-1055-88), for payments to performers engaged to perform at Park and Recreation facilities (primarily MetroZoo). That waiver applied to performance fees not to exceed \$50,000 each or a total of \$600,000 for a ten year period or until the aggregate amount was expended. On September 15, 1998, the Board authorized a second similar bid waiver (R-1078-98) after expiration of the ten-year limit on the first waiver. Resolution No. R-1078-98 includes performers engaged for the Joseph Caleb Auditorium and the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center as part of the "Heart of the City" Series," formerly the "Echoes of Change Series." This waiver also limited performance fees to \$50,000 per event with a \$600,000 cap and a ten-year time limit. On October 9, 2003, the Board authorized the third bid waiver under Resolution No. R-1161-03. As of August 1, 2004, there is approximately \$60,000 remaining of the \$800,000 limit. An unusually high amount of bookings related to the recognition of the 75th anniversary of the Parks' Department and increased cultural activities in the Department's Division of Arts and Culture and at the Deering Estate resulted in reaching the funding cap in a much shorter period of time.

It is important to note that the \$1,000,000 figure, like the caps in previous versions of this resolution, does not represent the addition of 'new' or additional money. Rather, this figure represents funds that

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are already contained in the normal annual operating budget of the facilities/programs that contract with artists.

South Florida is a highly trafficked corridor for performers and visual artists from all over the world, and the opportunity to book exceptional talent on short notice often arises, usually at significantly reduced costs and contractual requirements and technical riders. When a booking opportunity occurs, virtually all artists require an immediate deposit to retain a date. In addition, most artists have contractual conditions that may include unique set-ups and other special requirements that must be met by the producer/presenter. These special conditions may include a specific type of microphone, venue accommodations, availability of large instruments or other backline items, security arrangements, special assistance and certain performance or exhibition and skills requirements from sound technicians, curators, stagehands, lighting and sound equipment, and/or other miscellaneous purchases or rentals.

The channels for normal County purchasing and bid procedures cannot accommodate these special requirements and Board approval of each agreement or arrangement is not feasible, given the short notice of availability, the uniqueness of the artistry and the negotiations of the contracting requirements. The General Services Administration and Procurement Management Department reviewed this recommendation at its initial implementation and advised that a bid waiver would be an appropriate method for acquiring these services. In keeping with County procurement policies, staff will continue to make every effort to use existing-qualified vendors and/or obtain three quotes whenever possible as it relates to equipment, sound and lighting and other items related to the presentation of artists.

The Park and Department provides much leadership and opportunity for the booking of artists, as its oversight includes seven dedicated cultural facilities including the 990 seat Joseph Caleb Auditorium, the 2,500 seat Miami-Dade County Auditorium, African Heritage Cultural Arts Center and Gallery, Raices Hispanic Heritage Center, The Women's Park and Roxcy O'Neal Bolton Gallery, Deering Estate, and MetroZoo. The Department's cultural portfolio includes unique high quality programs that address everything from concerts, festivals, theater and other cultural opportunities in neighborhoods, to hosting major performers in large annual anchor events such as the Fourth of July Concerts at Black Point and Amelia Earhart Parks. Nationally recognized performance series such as the Heart of the City and Indigo Series have garnered local and national accolades for the Department and the County for its high quality presentation of some of the most renowned artists in the world. Presentations over the course of this waiver have included Peru Negro Dance Company of Peru, Maupaucitos Folkloric Company of Chile, and the Ars Flores Symphony Orchestra. Renowned photographer Michael Nye's "Children of Children" photographic exhibition depicting audio and visual profiles of early child bearing and the social economic impact on families was seen by more than 1,000 visitors at the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center Gallery. Additionally, the Parks Department has expanded its Touring Arts Programs beyond the Caleb Auditorium by using county-wide neighborhood park facilities to present programs like noted theater company "Teatro Avante's"



family theater presentations at the Raices Hispanic Cultural Center in West Kendall. The Gallery at the African Heritage Cultural Arts Center has been contacted to become one of the Miami sites for the international Art Basel, the world's leading art show, by hosting both an exhibit and accompanying performances. The Parks Department celebrated its 75th anniversary with several large community events attended by thousands including the appearance of Richie Havens at the Greynolds Park Love-in, Tap dancer Savion Glover and the Tii Dye Project at Joseph Caleb Auditorium, and Tito Puento Jr. at the 4th of July Concert at Amelia Earhart Park.

The programs brought to Miami-Dade County under this bid waiver have garnered local and national attention from the media. The "Touring Arts Installations Program," was the recipient of the Dorothy Mullens Arts Award from the Florida Park and Recreation Association. This program provides visual and performance arts experiences created especially for natural outdoor settings. The series has generated positive attention for its innovative approach to bringing traditionally indoor arts experiences directly to parks. Visual and performance artists have created work around a park's natural environment and assets, and involved the community in both the artistic process and as arts consumers. This involvement makes the inclusion of 'visual' artists a natural addition to the artists covered under this bid waiver. As this program grows, and the scope of the arts and entertainment activities provided throughout Miami-Dade's many 'natural' theaters, concert halls, and galleries expand so must our abilities to provide these opportunities as efficiently as possible to meet booking deadlines and contractual retainers and conditions.

It continues to be the goal of the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department to generate additional revenue such as grants and contributions to offset fees and ancillary costs, and to work towards the goal of making this series and other similar initiatives now taking place throughout the park system, cost-effective, and of the highest quality for residents and visitors.
