

Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Execution of Joint Funding Agreement No. 11E4FL2550FL005 for Water Resources Investigations with the United States Geological Survey to be Funded by Miami-Dade County in the Amount of \$732,056

Agenda Item No. 8(D)(1)(B)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the execution of Joint Funding Agreement (JFA) No. 11E4FL2550FL005 between Miami-Dade County and the US Geological Survey (USGS) for Water Resources Investigations for FY11.

Scope

The water level recording stations are operated countywide with the saltwater interface monitoring stations nearer the coast.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact to the County for this JFA is \$732,056 to be funded between the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) for \$271,718 and the Water and Sewer Department (WASD) for \$460,338. The USGS will match \$108,929 towards the total estimated project cost of \$840,985. The DERM funding source is the DERM proprietary revenues, Fund GF030, Subfund 039. The WASD funding source is WASD operating revenues.

Track Record/Monitor


The Director of the Department of Environmental Resources Management will monitor this contract.

Background

Through JFA No. 11E4FL2550FL005, the USGS will provide services for continuing equipment maintenance and data collection relating to groundwater elevations and saltwater intrusion. These services are needed by the County to conduct stormwater management/modeling, to support infrastructure development, to perform environmental restoration/protection activities and to comply with WASD permit requirements. The data generated under this agreement also will be used in updating the Stormwater Master Plan and may be used to evaluate the effects of sea-level rise and hurricanes on water supply, existing drainage infrastructure and wetlands. County records indicate that the County has contracted with the USGS for these and related services since the 1950s. The USGS is a federal agency that is regarded as the national expert in the field of groundwater studies.

The services funded by DERM include: (1) the operation and maintenance of 50 water level recording stations, one canal stage meter and Doppler flow instrumentation and the related data reporting (\$218,598) and (2) the monitoring and maintenance of 26 saltwater interface monitoring stations (\$53,120). The services funded by WASD include the operation and maintenance of 54 water level and 28 saltwater interface monitoring stations, the operation and maintenance of six Doppler instruments and one rain gauge, the installation of additional water level/saltwater monitoring stations and satellite data platforms and the collection of additional data during droughts (\$460,338).

This agreement will become effective upon execution and will terminate September 30, 2011.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF JOINT FUNDING AGREEMENT NO. 11E4FL2550FL005 FOR WATER RESOURCES INVESTIGATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES GEOLOGICAL SURVEY TO BE FUNDED BY MIAMI-DADE COUNTY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$732,056; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE THE PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby authorizes the Mayor or Mayor's designee to execute Joint Funding Agreement No. 11E4FL2550FL005 with the United States Geological Survey for Water Resources Investigations to be funded by Miami-Dade County in the amount of \$732,056, in substantially the form attached hereto and made part hereof; authorizes the Mayor or Mayor's designee to execute any necessary amendments to the agreement and for time extension and to accept additional funds that may become available under this agreement; and authorizes the Mayor or Mayor's designee to exercise the provisions contained therein.



**FOR
WATER RESOURCES INVESTIGATION**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of the 1st day of October, 2010, by the U.S. GEOLOGICAL SURVEY, UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, party of the first part, and the MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, party of the second part.

- The parties hereto agree that subject to availability of appropriations and in accordance with their respective authorities there shall be maintained in cooperation AN INVESTIGATION OF WATER RESOURCES, herein called the program. The USGS legal authority is 43 USC 36C; 43 USC 50; and 43 USC 50b.
- The following amounts shall be contributed to cover all of the cost of the necessary field and analytical work directly related to this program. 2(b) includes In-Kind Services in the amount of \$0.00.

(a) \$108,929.00 by the party of the first part during the period
October 01, 2010 to September 30, 2011

(b) \$732,056.00 by the party of the second part during the period
October 01, 2010 to September 30, 2011

(c) Additional or reduced amounts by each party during the above period or succeeding periods as may be determined by mutual agreement and set forth in an exchange of letters between the parties.

(d) The performance period may be changed by mutual agreement and set forth in an exchange of letters between the parties.

- The costs of this program may be paid by either party in conformity with the laws and regulations respectively governing each party.
- The field and analytical work pertaining to this program shall be under the direction of or subject to periodic review by an authorized representative of the party of the first part.
- The areas to be included in the program shall be determined by mutual agreement between the parties hereto or their authorized representatives. The methods employed in the field and office shall be those adopted by the party of the first part to insure the required standards of accuracy subject to modification by mutual agreement.
- During the course of this program, all field and analytical work of either party pertaining to this program shall be open to the inspection of the other party, and if the work is not being carried on in a mutually satisfactory manner, either party may terminate this agreement upon 60 days written notice to the other party.
- The original records resulting from this program will be deposited in the office of origin of those records. Upon request, copies of the original records will be provided to the office of the other party.

- 8. The maps, records, or reports resulting from this program shall be made available to the public as promptly as possible. The maps, records, or reports normally will be published by the party of the first part. However, the party of the second part reserves the right to publish the results of this program and, if already published by the party of the first part shall, upon request, be furnished by the party of the first part, at costs, impressions suitable for purposes of reproduction similar to that for which the original copy was prepared. The maps, records, or reports published by either party shall contain a statement of the cooperative relations between the parties.
- 9. USGS will issue billings utilizing Department of the Interior Bill for Collection (form DI-1040). Billing documents are to be rendered **QUARTERLY**. Payments of bills are due within 60 days after the billing date. If not paid by the due date, interest will be charged at the current Treasury rate for each 30 day period, or portion thereof, that the payment is delayed beyond the due date. 
