Subject: Repayment to US HUD Regarding Miami-Dade County's 2007 CDBG Program

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve a reimbursement plan for \$3,632,636 from the countywide general fund to the County's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) line of credit with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (US HUD). Each payment under the reimbursement plan will be credited to the County's CDBG line of credit, which can then be reallocated to other CDBG-eligible activities. This reimbursement is to be made to the line of credit for failure to demonstrate compliance with US HUD's requirements in meeting the national objectives and performance goals as outlined in the US HUD Office of Inspector (OIG) audit of the 2007 Program Year. The repayment plan includes an initial payment of five percent (\$181,632) of the total amount and equal disbursements of the remaining balance of \$3,451,004 over a three year period.

It is important to note that activities originally funded in Program Years 1994 through 2006 were also closed in the 2007 Program Year; therefore, the findings in the OIG's audit are also associated with activities funded prior to the 2007 Program Year.

SCOPE

The countywide general fund is being recommended to repay the line of credit on the County's CDBG program, which serves low to moderate income residents throughout Miami-Dade County with priority in the Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas and eligible census tracts.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

Approval of this resolution will have an impact of \$3,632,636 on the County's general fund over a three-year period. The first payment of \$181,632, a five-percent upfront payment, will be paid within 60 days after US HUD approves the County's repayment plan and the remaining balance of \$3,451,004 will be disbursed equally over a three-year period as indicated in the table below. This payment will be made from the reserve set aside for community redevelopment studies. Staff does not anticipate the creation of any community redevelopment areas this fiscal year. The balance in the reserve after this payment will be \$18,400. Future payments will be included in the budget.

It is important to note that each time the County makes a repayment to the line of credit, that same amount of funding becomes available for other CDBG-eligible activities. Upon each payment to the line of credit, the additional funds will be reallocated to CDBG eligible activities through an Action Plan amendment.

TRACK RECORD/MONITORING

The repayment plan will be monitored by the County's Office of Strategic Business Management. The Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) staff will supervise implementation of the corrective action plan to address the audit findings.

BACKGROUND

Miami-Dade County receives annual CDBG program funds from US HUD to carry out a wide range of community development activities directed toward revitalizing neighborhoods, economic development, and providing improved community facilities and services, principally for low and moderate income persons. The program is managed by DHCD (formerly Office of Community and Economic Development), which funds several entities, including County departments to complete approved projects/programs in targeted communities. US HUD provides funding through a line of credit to the County from which the County requests draw downs to make progress payments on approved program activities. An activity that receives CDBG funds must meet one of three national objectives:

- Benefit low and moderate income families;
- Aid in prevention or elimination of slums or blight; or
- Meet community development needs having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community and when other financial resources are not available

In late December 2008, US HUD's OIG began an audit of Miami-Dade County's CDBG Program for those activities closed in the 2007 Program Year and concluded its audit on June 1, 2009. At that time, the US HUD OIG identified seven activities without adequate documentation to demonstrate that the national objectives were met; one activity without adequate documentation to demonstrate that performance goals specified in the sub-recipient agreement were met; and eight cancelled activities for which the County had not recaptured the funds expended by the recipient. The audit also cited the County for failure to report CDBG financial and program information according to federal requirements. The US HUD OIG initially recommended a total repayment amount of \$4,728,807. The County subsequently met with US HUD on several occasions and provided documentation to clear several findings which reduced the total repayment amount to \$3,632,636 (See Attachment).

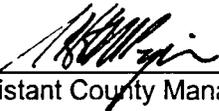
Based on the results of the audit, DHCD's detailed assessment of reporting requirements and discussions with US HUD's Miami Office, DHCD took steps in June 2009 to improve oversight and administration of the CDBG program:

- Revised the progress report format and review procedures. This includes a checklist that staff must complete to confirm the review of progress reports and identifies items the implementing agencies must include with each report to confirm the completion of the projects and the achievement of proposed national objectives.
- Provide a higher level of technical assistance to agencies regarding the proper documentation needed to demonstrate achievement of the national objectives and performance goals.
- Promptly suspend payments to those agencies that do not comply with reporting requirements per US HUD rules and regulations.
- Provide ongoing training to DHCD staff on US HUD rules and regulations, data collection, reporting and monitoring practices to ensure recipients can demonstrate achievement of the national objectives and performance goals.

- Ensure that projects awarded federal funds are eligible for funding and that receiving agencies have the capacity to meet the stipulated national objectives and performance goals.

We are confident that these reforms and additional ongoing improvements in DHCD have strengthened our ability to meet the national objectives. Building upon these advancements will be a top priority for the new DHCD director. Following Board approval of the repayment plan, US HUD will be formally notified and the initial five percent payment will be credited to the line of credit.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF A REIMBURSEMENT PLAN TO CREDIT \$3,632,636 FROM GENERAL FUND TO MIAMI-DADE COUNTY'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) LINE OF CREDIT WITH US HUD; TO MAKE A MINIMUM INITIAL PAYMENT OF \$181,632 AND PAY THE REMAINING BALANCE IN INSTALLMENTS OVER A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PAYMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes a reimbursement plan of \$3,632,636 from general funds to Miami-Dade County's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Line of Credit with US HUD; authorizes a minimum initial payment of \$181,632 within sixty (60) days after the approval of the payment plan by US HUD and pay the remaining balance in installments over a period of three years; and further authorizes the Mayor or Mayor's Designee to execute such agreements and amendments, as are required, following approval by the County Attorney's Office and subject to proper execution by the parties to initiate the payment plan.
