RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO  
ENACT LEGISLATION THAT WOULD ENCOURAGE THE  
FORMATION OF CAPTIVE INSURANCE COMPANIES IN  
FLORIDA

**WHEREAS**, corporations establish captive insurance companies with the specific objective of financing risks emanating from their parent company or group; and

**WHEREAS**, creating a captive insurance company is a risk management technique by which a corporation forms its own insurance company subsidiary to finance its retained losses; and

**WHEREAS**, captive insurance companies are established to meet the individual needs of the captive insurance company's owners or members, and the captive insurance company may provide complete insurance coverage or partial insurance coverage, with excess risks reinsured with a third party reinsurer; and

**WHEREAS**, each captive insurance company is distinct but all seek certain common advantages that include reduced cost of coverage, mitigation of market swings in commercial insurance, improved cash flow, spreading of risk, improved risk retention capability and integration with an overall risk management plan; and

**WHEREAS**, captive insurance companies have become an important part of the insurance industry and allow states to attract substantial captive insurance industry business through a favorable state legislative and regulatory climate; and

**WHEREAS**, captive insurance involves bringing together a host of experts in drafting and pricing insurance coverage, including actuaries, tax specialists, risk managers, insurance

accountants, corporate and regulatory lawyers, domicile representatives and independent certified public accountants; and

**WHEREAS**, fostering a captive insurance industry in a state also can result in a significant boost to tourism revenue, as annual meetings must be held in the domicile state of the captive insurance company; and

**WHEREAS**, in the U.S., Vermont is home to more captive insurance companies than any other state, with nearly 900 licensed captive insurance companies as of August 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, a number of other U.S. states also have encouraged significant numbers of captive insurers to locate there, including Arizona, Hawaii, Montana, Nevada, New York and South Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, enactment of captive insurance legislation during the 2011 session of the Florida Legislature would be a means of encouraging economic development in Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board supports enactment of captive insurance legislation during the 2011 session,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to enact legislation that would encourage the formation of captive insurance companies in Florida, similar to such legislation in existence in other states such as Arizona, Hawaii, Montana, Nevada, New York, South Carolina and Vermont.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs that the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2011 and 2012 State Legislative Packages.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairman Joe A. Martinez. It was offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


