Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Competitive Contracts

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts with authority to exercise options-to-renew.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County department.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board. There is no additional fiscal impact beyond what is stated on the items in this package. Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. The department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew (OTR) and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract.

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the responsive, responsible bidder(s) who met the requirements of the respective solicitation.

Item 1.1: Liquid Chlorine In One-Ton and 150-Pound Cylinders is to award this contract to purchase and receive delivery of liquid chlorine in one-ton cylinders and 150-lb. cylinders for use at wastewater treatment plants and water distribution delivery process. The amount being requested is **\$2,098,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the four, one-year option-to-renew periods, the cumulative value will be \$10,490,000.

Item 1.2: Fire Suppression Systems Services is to award this contract to purchase fire suppression systems, repair services, and parts for the Miami-Dade Aviation Department and the General Services Administration. The amount being requested is **\$6,369,000**.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

Item 3.1: Electrical Control Panels and Start-up Services is to modify this contract for additional time and spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to continue to purchase electrical control panels and start-up services until the successor contract is awarded. The additional amount being requested is **\$70,000**.

Item 3.2: Temporary Clerical Personnel is to modify this contract for additional time to allow various County departments to continue to purchase temporary clerical personnel services until the successor contract is awarded. No additional amount is being requested.

Item 3.3: Location of Underground Utilities is to modify this contract for additional time and spending authority to allow the Public Works Department to continue to purchase services for locating underground utilities. The amount being requested is **\$150,000**.

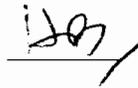

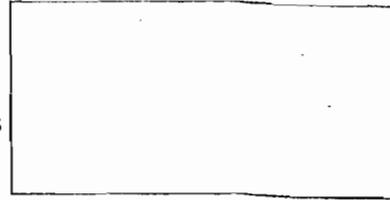

BACKGROUND

This contract is for purchase and delivery of an estimated 4,452 one-ton cylinders of liquid chlorine for the North District, Central District, and South District Wastewater Treatment Plants, and an estimated 520 150-pound cylinders of liquid chlorine for use in the water treatment and water distribution delivery process. Liquid chlorine is used for water and sewage treatment by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD).

WASD requires this product to be delivered in one-ton cylinders to the wastewater treatment plants. The 150-pound cylinders are requested to facilitate manual installation and exchange of the cylinders from various water treatment and water distribution locations by staff. These are the only packaging options for purchase of liquid chlorine available that meet WASD's delivery requirements.

The increase in the proposed contract value is due to use in the South District New chlorination requirements stem from the High Level Disinfection Project mandated by the South Florida Water Management District Consent Decree. This project increases the need for disinfection for planned wastewater reclamation. In addition, Virginia Key has to manually feed chlorine since its automatic feed system is not working properly, as use of chlorine increases when it is manually fed into the system. The manual feed process has to continue until the automatic feed system is repaired or replaced. WASD anticipates that the repair or replacement, installation and testing of the automatic feed system will take at least one year.

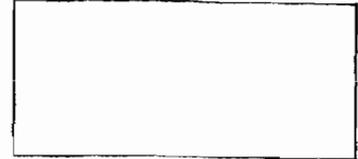

Summary

This Competitive Contracts Package includes a total of five (5) procurement actions totaling \$17.079 million including subsequent option-to-renew (OTR) periods.

Budgetary Impacts

- **Competitive Contracts:**

Item 1.1 – Liquid Chlorine In One-Ton and 150 Pound Cylinders

This item awards Contract No. 0507-4/15, for the purchase and delivery of liquid chlorine in an estimated 4,452 one-ton cylinders and 520 150-pound cylinders to various Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Wastewater and Water Treatment Plants.

Comments

Under Resolution No. 193-09, the previous contract was awarded for an estimated 3,025 one-ton cylinders and 520 150-pound cylinders of liquid chlorine. The proposed item increases the amount of liquid chlorine purchased in one-ton cylinders by an additional 1427 one-ton cylinders of liquid chlorine. According to the County Manager’s memo, this increase is due to use in the South District and the new chlorination requirements stemming from the High Level Disinfection Project; and to the manual feed process being utilized at Virginia Key.

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Item 1.2 – Fire Suppression Systems Services

This item awards Contract No. 5870-0/15 to National Fire Protection, LLC. as primary vendor and Sprinklermatic Fire Sprinklers and Fire Alarms, Inc. as secondary vendor for the purchase of fire suppression systems, inspection, certification, repair, and parts for Miami-Dade Aviation Department and General Services Administration.

The estimated monthly cost under the proposed item is less than the previous contract (see below).

Item No. 3.2 Temporary Clerical Personnel – Fiscal Impact Statement

The Office of the Commission Auditor’s Budget Division conducted a review of the departmental allocations, released and paid amounts provided under this contract (see Attachment). **To date, a total of \$15.076 million has been released from the \$17.364 million original allocation. This leaves a balance of \$2.29 million in unreleased allocated funds.**

- According to FY 2010-11 Adopted Budget, Volume 1, Page 57, the County eliminated 3,058 positions since FY 2006-07, including the reductions of an additional 966 positions through this budget.
