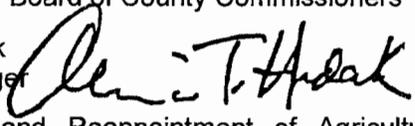

**Subject:** Appointment and Reappointment of Agricultural Practices Advisory Board Members

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## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC):

- A. Appoint the following person to a first term on the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board (APAB):
  - Tommy Vick to fill the Vegetable Industry Representative #2 seat as recommended by the Dade County Farm Bureau.
  
- B. Reappoint the following person for a second term as a member of the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board (APAB):
  - Erik Tietig to fill the Nursery Industry Representative #1 seat as recommended by the Florida Nursery Growers and Landscape Association.

## **Scope**

The Agricultural Practices Advisory Board has a countywide impact.

## **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

## **Track Record/Monitor**

This section does not apply.

## **Background**

The APAB consists of thirteen members representing a variety of agricultural industries. Section 2-935, Code of Miami-Dade County, requires that the BCC fill vacancies occurring on the APAB. By Code, each nominating organization must submit for BCC review a minimum of one nominee for their vacant position(s), the nominee's resume and the minutes of the organization's meeting at which the nominee was selected. The required documentation for each of the following nominees is attached.

- Vegetable Industry Representative #2 seat  
Mr. Tommy Vick was nominated by the Dade County Farm Bureau as one of two candidates for this appointment. Mr. Vick is a fourth generation vegetable farmer and is the owner and operator of Tom Vick Farms. Mr. Vick has also served as Director on the Dade County Farm Bureau Board of Directors, the Dade Agri Council and the Miami-Dade School Board Agricultural Advisory Committee. *The Dade County Farm Bureau recommended the appointment of Tommy Vick at their April 5, 2011 meeting.*

- Nursery Industry Representative seat

Mr. Erik Tietig completed his first term on the APAB in December 2010, and is eligible for reappointment for a second and final term. Mr. Tietig is currently the Vice President of Pine Island Nursery & Tree Farm, Inc. Mr. Tietig has also held various positions with the Dade County Farm Bureau, Tropical Fruit Growers of South Florida and the Rotary Club of Homestead. Mr. Tietig has a Bachelor of Political Science from the University of Florida. *The Florida Nursery Growers and Landscape Association recommended the re-appointment of Erik Tietig at their March 8, 2011 meeting.*

The terms for the appointment and re-appointments began on January 1, 2011 and will expire on December 31, 2014.

**WHEREAS**, Sections 2-931 through 2-936 of the Code of Miami-Dade County provides for the creation, composition, terms, purpose and duties of the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board (APAB); and

**WHEREAS**, a vacancy of the Dade County Farm Bureau Vegetable Industry Seat #2 exists on the APAB; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Erik Tietig has completed his first term as the Nursery Industry Representative #1 on the APAB and is eligible for a second term; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2-935 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that the vacancies on the APAB are to be filled by the Board of County Commissioners; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Manager and the Dade County Farm Bureau recommend that the Board of County Commissioners appoint Mr. Tommy Vick to the Vegetable Industry Representative #2 seat; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Manager and the Florida Nursery Growers and Landscape Association recommend that the Board of County Commissioners re-appoint Mr. Erik Tietig to the Nursery Industry Representative #1 seat,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that Mr. Tommy Vick is hereby appointed to the Vegetable Industry Representative #2 seat and Mr. Erik Tietig is hereby

**ITEM #1 CALL TO ORDER**

Allyson called the meeting to order at 6:05PM.

#### **1. Water Restrictions and BMP's**

She feels that there should be different rules for native plants. Some nurseries feel that the media does not represent the true facts and used scare tactics for effect.

Allyson reported that the committee did not submit three bids for the printing of the post card. Brian will speak to them about this.

**6. Immigration**

They are being put in jail for 30 days and shipped to their home land. We are losing valuable worker that have been good citizens and have lived her for years. This unfair practice continues to plague our industry.

**ITEM #8 NEW BUSINESS**

**1. Nominate Erik Tietig to Ag Practices**

The Dade Chapter FNGLA recommends to the County Commission that Erik Tietig be re-appointed to the Ag Practices Committee. Sylvia made the motion, Jenn seconded and all approved.

**2. Administrative Fee**

Ivonne reminded the BOD that the chapter is to charge 10% administration fee designed to generate money for the Chapter.

**3. Fire Marshal Visits**

Ivonne reminded the BOD that government agencies have had funds cut from their budget and are seeking to generate the shortfall. Fire- marshals are inspecting nurseries. She advised us to allow them entrance and to cooperate.

President-Elect Ivonne Alexander called the meeting to order at 12:08 p.m.

Alexander reported that on Thursday, March 31, a neighbor on 344<sup>th</sup> started shooting and locked himself in his home with an AK47. 23 of her employees were in danger. Alexander described the event details and lauded the efforts of Lt. Sheree DiBernardo in helping secure the safety of the workers.

**Ag Patrol:** Capt. Steve Rasmussen thanked Robert Moehling for providing refreshments for the Ag Patrol officers who worked the stand-off with the shooter. Rasmussen reported that for the month of March, Ag Patrol received 139 calls for service, 41 arrests, 7 felonies. Moreno asked about problems in North Miami regarding crimes against cattle and other livestock. Rasmussen said he hasn't received a request for assistance from the Miami Lakes area, but he will call and check with them. LaPradd mentioned that livestock is not permitted in that area of the county. Discussion ensued. LaPradd continued to say that the county code needs to be amended. The process is in place to change the code.

**Extension Report:** Teresa Olczyk reported on the Extension Open House -- 350 people attended. Olczyk thanked Brady for hosting the Farmer's Market, which was stocked by generous local growers. All proceeds were donated to 4-H. Olczyk thanked Theresa Smith for continuing the communications of their opportunities. Olczyk reviewed recent and upcoming workshops. UF/IFAS will conduct a listening session on April 28, 2011 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the Ag Extension Auditorium.

**County Ag Manager:** LaPradd reported that the Ag Bill (previously vetoed by Gov. Crist last year) flew through the Florida House and the Senate last week. It expected to become law on April 29, 2011. Alexander asked about the recent fire inspection and reported that no fees were required of her. LaPradd explained the Health/Safety license does require a fee, but wholesales nurseries are not required to have business licenses and therefore are exempt from fire inspections. If wholesale growers do get a bill -- they

make a copy of the exemption letter, staple to bill, and mail it back to the county.

LaPradd reported that a recent aerial survey shows 105 dead bay trees, resulting from the Red Bay Ambrosia Beetle.

**Federation Report:** A printed report from staff is enclosed in the board packet.

**Treasurer's Report:** Pena presented the written financial statement to the directors. Epling moved to accept the financial report, Butler seconded. Motion carried.

**Secretary's Report:** March minutes were presented by email. Phil Marraccini requested a correction to show his presence at the meeting. Butler moved to accept minutes as corrected. Wilson seconded. Motion carried.

**Agency Manager's Report:** Timmons reported "income up, expenses down." Agents and staff are selling barbecue and truck tickets. Alexander inquired about homeowners' insurance policies now being sold. Alexander recently referred a friend who was very pleased with the service she received here at Farm Bureau. Timmons reported that Farm Bureau was given the only "A" rating in the state.

**Women's Committee Report:** Jessica Borek reported on the upcoming Ag Literacy Day where Women's Committee members have volunteered to read at schools. Members of the committee will also be on hand volunteering at the barbecue.

Charlie Shinn reported on current water situations in South Dade. He offered the opportunity of a presentation from SFWMD. Shinn reported that the filling of the seats on the SFWMD governing board is in progress, and he expects that all candidates will be personally interviewed. The governor has yet to make the appointments. Alexander reported that the water restrictions guidelines stated that growers that are BMP compliant are exempt from restrictions. Shinn will verify. Discussion ensued.

Smith reported on the communications with Miami-Dade Department Planning and Zoning regarding nominations to the Ag Practices board. All directors received a link to the county code that addresses the Ag Practice Board members via email. Discussion ensued. LaPradd provided clarification. Tommy Vick remains the board's first choice to serve. Since Bill Losner is not eligible to be the alternate candidate, Lenny Cavallaro volunteered to serve. Butler moved to submit Lenny Cavallaro as an alternate candidate. Wilson seconded. Motion carried.

Timmons reported on ticket sales, and encouraged directors to sell, sell, sell. Rodriguez recommended that directors that don't sell their tickets should buy them.

Brady provided barbecue sponsorships update – we have received \$21,000 so we're at the halfway mark to last years' numbers- \$41,000.

Alice mentioned asking COFFO to bring volunteers to work the barbecue.

Epling reported that the Strategic Planning Committee will meet on May 10.

Moreno reported that YF&R on the state level is organized and looking good. He has plans for the future of DCFB's YF&R. He'd like to see more involvement in the YF&R summer conference. He reported that they had a good turnout in Tallahassee. Rodriguez asked about the immigration issue. Moreno restated the FFB position – immigration is a national issue. Alexander reported that her business has seen a huge drop in seasonal labor. Losner expressed that we understand the need for migrant workers, but the rest of the county, state and nation do not.

Butler reported on the Farm Bureau Days in Tallahassee. Discussion revealed that due to the number of freshmen in the Senate and House, a farm tour is essential.

The Farm Bureau seat on the Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors needs to be filled. Butler nominated Smith. Delliveneri seconded. Motion carries.

Brady offered that the scholarship presentation be done at the barbecue. The directors agreed that the sound system is too poor for that. The scholarship winners will be notified to attend the April 26, 2011 board meeting to receive their checks.

Smith announced that Jessica Borek was named Volunteer of the Year by the Homestead Women's Club. She will be honored at a luncheon on Saturday, April 9, 2011.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 1:44 p.m.
