Subject: Miami-Dade County Economic Development Web Portal Project Grant Application

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached resolution ratifying the Mayor or his designee's action to apply for, receive, and expend grant funds from the U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA), Economic Adjustment Program funds in the amount of \$100,000. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or his designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments, after approval by the County Attorney, as required by program guidelines. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or his designee to apply for, receive, and expend additional funds that may become available during the term of the grant; to file and execute any amendments to the application for and on behalf of the County; and to exercise amendments, modifications, renewal, cancellation, and termination clauses of any contracts and agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney's Office.

Scope

Miami-Dade County will design and establish an Economic Development web portal, as a tool specifically designed to encourage economic growth in Miami-Dade County. The website will combine public databases, geographic information systems and existing County technology, culminating in a one-stop resource center for entrepreneurs exploring business opportunities in the county. The site will promote Miami-Dade as a: 1) viable community to launch new businesses; 2) ideal site for business relocation or expansion; 3) uniquely diversified for regional and global investments, with a diverse and skilled work force; and 4) community with a vibrant quality of life. The award period for this grant is 12 months.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding in the amount of \$100,000 will enable the Government Information Center (GIC) to support the initial design and development of an Economic Development web portal. A required local match of \$100,000 is provided by the Enterprise Technology Services Department and GIC, in the form of in-kind staff support, infrastructure and software.


Track Record/Monitor

GIC will handle the disbursement and expenditure of grant funds, and manage programmatic and fiscal reporting in accordance with the U.S. Department of Commerce guidelines.

Background

The Government Information Center will be utilizing the \$100,000 U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant to build Phase I of an Economic Development web portal. This tool will assist businesses in determining requirements and steps necessary to start and operate a business in Miami-Dade County.

The short turnaround time imposed by the EDA application deadline and acceptance period, did not allow sufficient time for the processing of the resolution and its submission to the Board prior to submission and acceptance of the grant. The Grant Award Agreement provided by the EDA required the County Manager to accept and execute the grant award document, and return same for processing by the EDA.


