RESOLUTION DIRECTING COUNTY MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO INVESTIGATE THE FEASIBILITY OF RELOCATING THE WOODEN ROLLER-COASTER IN BROWARD COUNTY CALLED THE "HURRICANE" TO ZOO MIAMI AND TO REPORT TO THIS BOARD ON SUCH INVESTIGATION

WHEREAS, in November of 2000, a wooden roller-coaster measuring 100 feet tall and 3,200 feet long opened in Broward County (in Dania Beach, Florida) and it was called the "Hurricane"; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane roller-coaster was once ranked by Amusement Today magazine as one of the top 20 wooden coaster in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane roller-coaster is one of only 182 wooden roller-coasters that remain worldwide; and

WHEREAS, the company that operates the Hurricane roller-coaster has decided to stop operating the roller-coaster; and

WHEREAS, relocating the Hurricane roller-coaster to Zoo Miami and operating it at Zoo Miami may be an attraction desired by visitors to Zoo Miami, may attract new visitors to Zoo Miami, may generate additional revenues for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department and may save the roller-coaster from falling into disuse and disrepair,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Mayor or Mayor's designee to investigate the feasibility of relocating the wooden roller-
