

RESOLUTION CO-DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF SW
22ND STREET (“CORAL WAY”), FROM SW 147TH AVENUE
TO SW 152ND AVENUE, AS “WIZARDS WAY”

WHEREAS, Zelda Glazer grew up in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and, upon graduating from high school, could not afford to attend college, so she took a job and paid her mother for room and board; and

WHEREAS, one day, Ms. Glazer’s mother surprised her by returning the money she had given her for room and board to provide Ms. Glazer the means to pay for college tuition; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Glazer married Leonard Glazer and the couple had two children, after which the family moved to Miami, Florida where Ms. Glazer applied for a teaching job at the Ida Fisher Junior High School on Miami Beach; and

WHEREAS, before being hired, the principal asked her why she should be hired and she responded “I can create magic in the classroom;” and

WHEREAS, Zelda Glazer began her teaching career believing that she could “create magic in the classroom;” and

WHEREAS, Ms. Glazer strove to create magic as an English teacher, vice-principal and ultimately as the Director of Language Arts for the entire public school system of Miami-Dade County before her untimely death in a car accident in late 2006; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Glazer’s vision of teaching and learning inspired the naming of West Miami-Dade’s new middle school the Zelda Glazer Middle School; and

WHEREAS, Zelda Glazer Middle School opened its halls on August 18, 2008 to approximately 400 sixth graders, with the school’s capacity being 1,500 students; and

WHEREAS, the mission of Zelda Glazer Middle School is “[t]ogether we will nurture a society of thinkers who are knowledgeable and confident;” and

WHEREAS, the school in recognition of Ms. Glazers desire to create magic in the classroom, has chosen a wizard for its mascot and has made its motto: “we can all create magic;” and

WHEREAS, in recognition of Zelda Glazer Middle School’s recent beginnings and the high academic goals and standards it has set for its students, SW 22nd Street from SW 147 Avenue to 152 Avenue should be co-designated “Wizards Way;” and

WHEREAS, this proposed co-designation is a county road located in County Commission District 11,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having conducted a public hearing, co-designates the portion of SW 22nd Street from SW 147th Avenue to SW 152nd Avenue as “Wizards Way.”

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board is directed to send certified copies of this Resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works Department and Land Development Division of the Public Works Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairman Joe A. Martinez. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
