Subject: Application for Funds, Protecting Children from Commercial Sexual Exploitation

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution retroactively authorizing the County Mayor and/or County Mayor's designee's action to apply for, receive, and expend federal funds in the amount of \$300,000 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP), to support a joint collaboration project between Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO), the lead applicant and the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD). The grant period will be effective October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2013 and does not require any matching local or in-kind funds.

Scope

This grant will provide countywide services for both Broward and Miami-Dade County.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

This grant will provide \$300,000 in federal funds to implement the proposed project. The grant does not require any matching local or in-kind funds. The funding source is the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Justice and Delinquency Prevention.

Track Record/Monitor

The grant will be monitored by the Broward Sheriff's Office, Bureau of Grants Management and the Chief Financial Officer of the Miami-Dade Police Department.

Background

Ratification of this application is necessary because the proposal did not allow time to submit the resolution to the Board prior to submitting the application. This proposal will allow the BSO and MDPD to develop regional strategies that will improve the response to victims of commercial sexual exploitation. A primary strategy will be the training for law enforcement, service providers, and other key organizations. The training will be provided by Kristi House, a leader in this subject area and also a certified training organization, using a federally recognized curriculum. Other services will include victim oriented investigations, appropriate provider services, and a public awareness and education campaign.

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE COUNTY MAYOR AND/OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE'S ACTION TO APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300,000 FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS OFFICE OF JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION PROGRAMS; AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR AND/OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE AND EXECUTE SUCH CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS, MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING, MODIFY OR AMEND THE APPLICATION IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS OR TO EXTEND THE PERFORMANCE PERIOD AS REQUIRED IF AWARDED

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves the County Mayor and/or County Mayor's designee's action to apply for, receive, and expend \$300,000 from the United States Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs' Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention , and authorizes the County Mayor and/or County Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments as required by grant guidelines or to further the purposes described in the funding requests following approval by the County Attorney's Office; to expend any and all monies received for the purposes described in the funding request; to apply for, receive and expend future additional funds should they become available through the grant program; to file and execute any necessary amendments to the

application for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and to exercise and execute any amendments, modifications, renewal and extension provisions, cancellation and termination clauses of any applications, contracts, agreements, and MOUs on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
