

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY OF WEST MIAMI CO-
DESIGNATION OF THE PORTION OF SW 15TH STREET
BETWEEN 57TH AND 67TH AVENUES AS "MARCO RUBIO
WAY"

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2011, the Mayor and City Commission of the City of West Miami adopted Resolution No. 2011-19, a copy of which is attached and incorporated for reference, which co-designated the portion of SW 15th Street, between 57th Avenue and 67th Avenue, as "Marco Rubio Way," in recognition of the public service career and achievements of Florida Senator Marco Rubio; and

WHEREAS, Marco Antonio Rubio was born in 1971 in Miami, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio is the second son of Cuban exiles Mario Rubio and Oria Garcia; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio moved to West Miami in 1985, grew up in the City of West Miami community and attended South Miami Senior High School; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio attended Tarkio College for one year on a football scholarship from 1989 to 1990 before transferring to Sante Fe Community College and then graduating in 1993 with a Bachelor of Science from the University of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio continued his studies at the University of Miami School of Law where he graduated *cum laude* in 1996; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio was elected to the Florida House of Representatives for the 111th District by overwhelming margins on January 2000, and in November 2006 was elected Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives for the 2006-08 term; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio, during his legislative career, authored the book “100 Innovative Ideas for Florida’s Future”, a compilation of ideas or “Idearaisers” of his travels around the State of Florida gathering ideas from citizens; and

WHEREAS, all 100 ideas were passed by the Florida House and fifty-seven of them ultimately became law; and

WHEREAS, on November 2nd, 2010, Mr. Rubio was elected as United States Senator to represent the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio has served in numerous committees of the U.S. Senate, such as the Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation, the Committee on Foreign Relations, the Select Committee on Intelligence, and the Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Rubio and his wife Jeanette Dousbedes Rubio have been married since 1998 and are parents to four children: Amanda, Daniella, Anthony and Dominick; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Commission of the City of West Miami request that the County install signage indicating this co-designation on County street signs and traffic signal masts arms; and

WHEREAS, this co-designation is located in County Commission District 6,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Approves the City of West Miami’s co-designation of the portion of SW 15th Street, between 57th Avenue and 67th Avenue, as “Marco Rubio Way,”

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board is directed to send certified copies of this Resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the

Public Works Department and Land Development Division of the Public Works Department, the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

WHEREAS, Marco Rubio devoted his early career to serve the people of the City of West Miami as City Commissioner in 1998; and



WHEREAS, Marco Rubio the son, the husband, the father, the friend has envisioned his public service career into a realization of a dream for many, serving and dedicating his efforts in the procurement of a better future for generations to come and the preservation of the American dream.

NOW, THERETOFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the City Commission of the City of West Miami as follows:

Section 1. That in recognition of Marco Rubio's achievements as a son, husband, father, public servant and friend, it is resolved that S.W. 15th Street between S.W. 57th and 67th Avenues be designated as "Marco Rubio Way."

Section 2. By unanimous vote of the Mayor and City Commission it is hereby respectfully requested, a co-sponsorship of this Resolution from Miami-Dade County District Six Commissioner, Rebeca Sosa for a similar Resolution to be approved by the Board of County Commissioners.
