

RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO REFRAIN FROM
REDUCING FUNDING TO FEDERAL HOUSING PROGRAMS
IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2011-2012 NATIONAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, federal housing programs are regulated and administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (“HUD”); and

WHEREAS, according to the Secretary of HUD, Shaun Donovan, HUD housing programs have supported, among other things, 1.6 million responsible first-time homebuyers under the Federal Housing Agency, 1.8 million people with disabilities through the Housing Choice Vouchers, the Section 811, Public Housing programs, and other initiatives; and

WHEREAS, more than 900,000 seniors who live with the care they need and dignity they deserve under Section 202, Project-based Section 8, and Public Housing programs; and

WHEREAS, in today’s difficult fiscal environment, where our national government is being forced to make hard decisions and budget responsibly, it is critical that we preserve funding for those housing programs that are integral to the well-being of our community; and

WHEREAS, affordable housing has reached a crisis in our community and communities around the nation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges Congress to refrain from reducing funding for federal housing programs in the fiscal year 2011-2012 national budget.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Members of the Miami-Dade Congressional Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the legislation set forth in Section 1 above, and that same be included in the 2011 and 2012 Federal Legislative Package.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
