SUBJECT: Resolution setting policy for Miami-Dade County, whereby the Commissioner Auditor shall provide a Tourism Impact Statement on all legislative matters before the County Commission; and the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs shall track bills in the Florida Legislature for potential impact on Miami-Dade County Tourism

This item was amended at the 6-13-2011 Recreation and Cultural Affairs Committee to limit the type of legislative items that require a Tourism Impact Statement. Specifically, as revised, the Commission Auditor shall provide a Tourism Impact Statement on only those legislative matters coming before the Board for approval that may positively or negatively impact Miami-Dade County Tourism.

The accompanying resolution was prepared and placed on the agenda at the request of Prime Sponsor Senator Javier D. Souto.

RESOLUTION SETTING POLICY FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, WHEREBY THE COMMISSIONER AUDITOR SHALL PROVIDE A TOURISM IMPACT STATEMENT ON CERTAIN LEGISLATIVE MATTERS BEFORE THE COUNTY COMMISSION; AND THE OFFICE OF INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS SHALL TRACK BILLS IN THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE FOR POTENTIAL IMPACT ON MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TOURISM

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is one of the country's top tourist destinations; and

WHEREAS, approximately 11.9 million visitors stayed at least one night in Miami-Dade County in 2009, according to the Greater Miami Convention and Visitor's Bureau (the "Bureau"); and

WHEREAS, according to the Bureau, these visitors spent approximately \$16.6 billion in direct expenditures in 2009; and

WHEREAS, the tourism industry plays a critical role in the health and vitality of Miami-Dade County's economy, and as such should be overseen with great care; and

WHEREAS, any matter that may negative negatively impact the image of Miami-Dade County or deter visitors from coming to our hotels, beaches or other attractions, or in any way harm the local tourist industry should be considered to be of critical importance and, as such, be heard by the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") and appropriate action taken, as soon as the Board becomes aware of the matter; and

WHEREBY, the Board must be made aware of such vital matters in a timely manner, so as to provide ample opportunity for well informed decision-making,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The Commissioner Auditor shall provide a Tourism Impact Statement on ~~[[a]]~~¹ >>those<< legislative matters coming before the Board for approval, if the item ~~[[will]]~~ >>may<< positively or negatively impact Miami-Dade County tourism. Such Tourism Impact Statement shall detail: (a) the nature of the matter or event that could impact Miami-Dade County's tourism industry, including background information regarding its origin and reach; (b) whether the matter poses a likely positive or negative effect on Miami-Dade County's tourism; and (c) any other relevant information which would assist the Board in its analysis and decision making in connection with the matter.

Section 2. The Miami-Dade County Office of Intergovernmental Affairs shall track all bills in the Florida Legislature that could have a positive or negative impact on Miami-Dade County tourism and submit a report to the Board. Such report shall detail: (a) the bill's sponsor; (b) an analysis of the bill, including a summary of all relevant sections, the current state of the law that the bill is intending to address, and the effect of the proposed changes on Miami-Dade County tourism; (c) the potential fiscal impact on Miami-Dade County; and (d) the bill's likelihood of passage.
