

RESOLUTION RE-NAMING THE ARENA/STATE PLAZA
METROMOVER STATION THE WILKIE D. FERGUSON, JR.
METROMOVER STATION

WHEREAS, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. attended segregated public schools and graduated from Northwestern High School in 1956; and

WHEREAS, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Florida A&M College, where he met his wife, Betty, who later served with distinction as a Miami-Dade County Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. served his country as a paratrooper and infantry officer in the United States Army and Army Reserves, rising to the rank of Captain; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from Howard University School of Law in 1968, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. was appointed to a presidential panel to investigate the 1968 Liberty City riots; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr., upon his appointment by Governor Reuben Askew, became the first African-American to serve as a Judge in Dade County Circuit Court; and

WHEREAS, upon his appointment in 1980 to the Third District Court of Appeal, Wilkie D. Ferguson became the first African-American Judge to serve on that Court; and

WHEREAS, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. served on the Third District Court of Appeal until 1993 when President Clinton nominated him to serve as a United States District Court Judge; and

WHEREAS, Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. served as a federal judge until his passing in 2003;
and

WHEREAS, the Arena/State Plaza Metromover Station is the closest station to the new federal courthouse, which is named after Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, the Arena/State Plaza Metromover Station is located at 90 N.W. 5th Street, within County Commission District 5,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby approves the re-naming of the Arena/State Plaza Metromover Station at 90 N.W. 5th Street as the Wilkie D. Ferguson, Jr. Metromover Station.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Bruno A. Barreiro and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Barbara J. Jordan. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
