

RESOLUTION URGING ALL MUNICIPALITIES IN MIAMI-  
DADE COUNTY TO ADOPT A ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY  
RELATED TO GRAFFITI

**WHEREAS**, with the declining economy, rising unemployment and reductions in municipal maintenance funds we are experiencing a proliferation of graffiti vandalism throughout Miami Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, some cities have allowed graffiti to remain on walls and buildings near major transit corridors and County facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the County's main economic engine is the tourism industry; and

**WHEREAS**, the image that graffiti vandalism displays to out of town tourists and visitors is one of lawlessness, crime and violent gangs; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County has always prided itself on its image as a clean, manicured, inviting destination for tourists and visitors; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has created the Community Image Advisory Board to improve the image of the County along major corridors and tourism destinations; and

**WHEREAS**, the volume of graffiti currently throughout the County reflects poorly on cities and the county alike; and

**WHEREAS**, the ubiquitous presence of graffiti also reflects poorly on residents, taxpayers and businesses of Miami-Dade County, especially when major conferences, conventions and events bring visitors from all over the world and throughout the U.S. to our community; and

**WHEREAS**, the County and municipalities within the County all need to work to eliminate graffiti,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board:

**Section 1.** Strongly urges all municipalities in Miami-Dade County to adopt a zero tolerance policy with regards to graffiti.

**Section 2.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Mayor or Council Chair of each municipality in Miami-Dade County and to the Executive Director of the Miami-Dade County League of Cities.
