Subject: Contract Award Recommendation in the Amount of \$1,007,798.29 to General Asphalt Co., Inc. for the People's Transportation Plan Project Entitled Roadway Resurfacing - Countywide and Authorizing the Use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds

This substitute item modifies the contract award amount as directed by the Regional Transportation Committee on September 12, 2011 to discuss and renegotiate the contract award amount with General Asphalt Co., Inc. The Public Works and Waste Management Department (PWWMD) met with General Asphalt Co., Inc. (General Asphalt) on September 21, 2011, to negotiate their bid prices. General Asphalt agreed to reduce the total base amount from \$895,225.25 to \$886,179.25. Consistent with Rule 4.01(j)(2) of the Rules of Procedure for the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), this item is to be directed to the BCC for final action.

Recommendation

The attached Contract Award Recommendation for the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) project entitled *Roadway Resurfacing - Countywide* (Project MCC 7360 Plan - CICC 7360-0/08 Request for Price Quotation (RPQ) No. 20110035) in the amount of \$1,007,798.29 to General Asphalt Co., Inc. (General Asphalt) was prepared by PWWMD and is recommended for approval by the BCC.

Proceeds from a Charter County Transportation System Sales Surtax Bond Sale will be used to fund this project; therefore, review by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) is required before final approval by the BCC.

Scope

The work to be performed under the life of this contract includes roadway resurfacing at various locations within Miami-Dade County (County).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The value of this contract award is \$1,007,798.29 and will be funded from Charter County Transportation Surtax 2010 Bond Proceeds as programmed within PWD's Multi-Year Capital Budget. The base contract amount is \$886,179.25, with the total amount being inclusive of contingency and dedicated allowances. There are no recurring operating or maintenance costs anticipated with the contract.

The proposed improvements qualify under the allowable work categories included in the PTP Neighborhood Improvements Section. The funding index code for this project is CPEPTP600RSF.

Delegation of Authority

No additional authority is being requested within the body of this contract.

Track Record/Monitor

General Asphalt is currently performing work for PWWMD at a satisfactory level. PWWMD has reviewed the Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database and found 19 awarded construction contracts as follows:

- one for the Aviation Department,
- one for the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Department, and
- 17 for PWWMD.

The referenced database also lists a total of 36 contractor performance evaluations (several contracts having two evaluations on file, an interim and a project closeout) with an overall performance rating of satisfactory performance (3.6) out of a possible superior performance (4.0) rating. The Sustainability, Planning and Economic Enhancement Department's (SPEED) History of Violation's report lists no violations for this contractor.

According to the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations, General Asphalt Co., Inc., Company Principals are Robert A. Lopez, Albert Lopez J., Royal S. Webster, Curtis Simpson and Robert A. Lopez, Jr. and the Company's address is listed as 4850 NW 72 Avenue, Miami, Florida 33166.

Following PWWMD's standard operating procedures, after award of this contract, a pre-construction meeting will be scheduled. The responsible staff person for PTP projects in PWWMD is Mr. Frank Aira, P.E. Following completion of the award process, the project will be assigned to Mr. Joaquin Rabassa, P.E., Project Coordinator, for day-to-day responsibilities.

Background

As part of the PTP Neighborhood Improvements initiative, PWWMD continues to take advantage of various contracting mechanisms such as the Miscellaneous Construction Contracting (MCC) process available under the MCC 7360 Program. Through this process, PWWMD forwards a RPQ, by way of facsimile transmission, to a pool of firms that have registered with the Internal Services Department for the subject trade. Additionally, PWWMD advertises the project in the *Daily Business Review* and all solicitations are available on-line through the Miami-Dade County portal under the "Procurement Solicitations" link. The project's award evaluation is based upon the bid submitted by the lowest responsive, responsible bidder for the project.

The SPEED Review Committee met and recommended a 10 percent Community Small Business Enterprise subcontractor goal based on the project's scope of work and cost estimate of \$879,000.00. In addition, a Community Workforce Program (CWP) goal of 13 percent has been established for this project as several work locations fall within a Designated Target Area. On April 21, 2011, PWWMD forwarded RPQ No. 20110035 for the Roadway Resurfacing Contract, utilizing the MCC 7360 Plan, to a list of 55 pre-registered firms. A total of four firms purchased contract documents and all four firms proffered a bid.

H & J Asphalt, Inc. (H & J) proffered the lowest bid (\$835,309.40), however did not submit the standard Bid Bond Form required by the solicitation documents. The Bid Bond Form submitted by H & J, along with the applicable contract language was sent to the County Attorney's Office (CAO) for review on March 17, 2011. The Bid was determined to be Non-Responsive by the CAO, and as such PWWMD issued a Recommendation for Award to the second lowest bidder, General Asphalt who proffered a base bid of \$895,225.25, two percent over the County's cost estimate.

The Recommendation for Award to General Asphalt was filed with the Clerk of the Board on June 28, 2011. H & J subsequently filed a bid protest on July 1, 2011 followed by a hearing held on July 21, 2011. In his ruling dated July 29, 2011 (attached), the Hearing Officer denied the bid protest filed by H & J and upheld the Mayor's recommendation. The recommendation that the subject project be awarded to General Asphalt, was presented to the Regional Transportation Committee (RTC) on September 12, 2011. During the RTC meeting the Committee directed PWWMD to attempt to negotiate a lower price with General Asphalt. On September 21, 2011, PWWMD met with General Asphalt to discuss and negotiate the bid prices proffered, and following a subsequent exchange of proposals, General Asphalt provided a final offer of \$886,179.25, effectively lowering their bid by \$9,046.00.

In accordance with PTP guidelines, this award recommendation must be presented to the CITT prior to approval by the BCC. As part of the legislative process to obtain the required approvals from the CITT, this award recommendation was inadvertently scheduled for the RTC, instead of being placed directly for BCC consideration as contemplated by Rule 4.01 (j)(2) of the Rules of Procedure for the BCC.

The work to be accomplished for this project consists of, but is not limited to, furnishing all supervision, labor, required materials, equipment and tools to perform all operations necessary for roadway resurfacing improvements. The work includes clearing and excavating of shoulder areas or build-up, grading and clean-up of adjacent shoulders and removal of roots, if required. Additional work to be performed includes the milling of existing pavement, resurfacing of the full roadway, the widening and resurfacing of intersecting streets, and the resurfacing of asphalt pathways (pedestrian, bicycle, etc.) adjacent or not to the edge of the pavement, as necessary.



This letter shall serve as your official notification that the recommendation for award for the above referenced RPQ has been revised in accordance with your final negotiated offer of \$886,179.25.

The total RPQ amount is for one million seven thousand seven hundred ninety-eight dollars and twenty-nine cents (\$1,007,798.29). This includes a base contract amount of eight hundred eighty-six thousand one hundred seventy-nine dollars and twenty-five cents (\$886,179.25), a contingency amount of eighty-eight thousand six hundred seventeen dollars and ninety-three cents (\$88,617.93), and dedicated allowances totaling thirty-three thousand one dollar and eleven cents (\$33,001.11). The contract duration is established as **450-calendar days**. However, the recommendation of award is contingent upon the submission of the required items listed below:

1. Performance and Payment Bond as required in Contract No. MCC 7360 Plan, Section 2.0 Special Conditions, Page 16, Article 2.11, **PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BOND**. (The **original attached documents** must be used and three (3) sets must be provided).
2. Letter from Bonding Agent granting Miami-Dade County authorization to date the Performance Bond.
3. Copies of current insurance certificates.
4. Copies of required license(s).
5. Submit Workforce Plan to the issuing/user department within fifteen (15) days of Notice of Award for project specific and within fifteen (15) days from Notice to proceed for work orders.

The preceding documents are required as outlined within Contract MCC 7360 Plan and to be submitted within 10 business days. Failure to submit the document(s) within the specified time, or any extension granted, will result in the award being rescinded.

Subsequent to the review and approval of the aforementioned documents, you are required to obtain the required permits in the time stipulated in the RPQ. Upon obtaining the permit(s), a copy(s) must be submitted to the Project Manager prior to commencement of work.


No work is to be performed without a permit unless the Project Manager issues a written directive to proceed without permit(s). This letter will also serve as a reminder that all work must be performed according to the scope of work and contract's terms and conditions, all permits and inspections and in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, codes and regulations.

Additionally, this contract, along with any future contracts awarded to your firm, have very similar completion schedules and competing deadlines. Please be advised that your firm must have the resources to ensure work proceeds without delay once the "Notice to Proceed" is issued. This will result in your firm working on multiple contracts concurrently. Lack of equipment and/or personnel will not be reason for delay.

Further, it shall be understood that since proceeds from the Charter County Transportation System Sales Surtax levied pursuant to Section 29.121 of the Code of Miami-Dade County may be used to pay for all or some part of the cost of this contract, no award of this contract shall be effective and thereby give rise to a contractual relationship with the County unless and until the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) and the County Commission have approved the award of the contract, and such award becomes final (either by expiration of 10 days after such award without veto by the Mayor, or by Commission override of a veto).



MEMORANDUM OPINION AND RECOMMENDATION

This matter was heard before the undersigned Hearing Examiner on July 21, 2011 on the Bid Protest of H&J Asphalt, Inc. ("H&J") protesting Miami-Dade County's Notice of Intent to Award to General Asphalt Co., Inc. ("General Asphalt") the bid pertaining to the County's Request for Price Quotations (RPQ) for project 2011-0035 People's Transportation Plan Roadway Resurfacing Project ("Project").

H&J was represented by William Cea and Elinette Ruiz of Becker & Poliakoff, and Miami-Dade County was represented by Bruce Libhaber, Esq. of the Office of the County Attorney. There were no appearances by the recommended bidder, General Asphalt, nor did they move to intervene in these proceedings.

In its Letter of June 24, 2011 the County informed H&J that the bid of H&J was being rejected. The reason stated in the letter was that H&J was being found non responsive to the bid.¹ The basis for this determination of non-responsiveness was the submission by H&J in its response to the bid of a Bid Bond on a form that was different than the required form included in the bid package.

In its Bid Protest, H&J raises several points, however at the Bid Protest Hearing counsel for H&J stated that the only issue that was before this Hearing Officer was the

issue related to the language and submission of the Bid Bond.²

That issue can be fairly summarized as follows: whether the different form of Bid Bond submitted by H&J is substantively different than the form required by the County. Further, whether the Bid Bond H&J submitted satisfied the requirements of the Bid Documents and that the disqualification of their bid was a question of the County putting form over substance and any technical differences were simply minor irregularities.

H&J argues that both of these questions weigh in their favor and any decision to disqualify them under these circumstances amounts to an arbitrary and capricious exercise of the County's power.³

The County argues that the differences in the form of the Bid Bonds create substantive issues which if ignored would result in H&J obtaining a competitive advantage over the other bidders. Further, the differences in the H&J Bid Bond leave the County unprotected from the very risk and potential exposure a Bid Bond is intended to cover.

The parties concede that there are no factual issues in dispute and the entire resolution of this matter hinges on a determination of whether the Bid Bond submitted by H&J satisfied the requirements of the RPQ. The only testimony taken at the Bid Protest Hearing was given by Jose Pimentel, the corporate representative of H&J who testified as to the circumstances which led to the submission of the Bid Bond form submitted by H&J. He further testified that H&J had used the Bid Bond form requested by the County in the past and had no problem with its requirements. H&J also submitted an affidavit of Michael Kline of the Great American Insurance Company (Great American), H&J's surety company which provides assurances that Great American stands ready, willing and able to provide a Bid Bond which in all respects would meet the requirements set forth in the RPQ.⁴

The threshold question is whether the language of the two Bid Bond forms, the one required by the County in its RPQ Bid Package and the one submitted by H&J are, from a substantive standpoint, different. And if they are substantively different is the difference a material difference which deprives the County of the protection it sought in requiring a Bid Bond from all bidders who responded to this RPQ.

As a public body the County is not entitled to omit or alter material provisions required by the RFP because in doing so the public body fails to "inspire public confidence in the fairness of the [RFP] process." *State, Dep't of Lottery v. Giech Corp.*, 816 So.2d 648 (Fla. 1st DCA 2001). In determining whether a specific noncompliance constitutes a substantial and hence non-waivable irregularity, the courts have applied two criteria--first, whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the municipality of its assurance that the contract will be entered into, performed and guaranteed according to its specified requirements, and second, whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. *Robinson Electrical Co., Inc. v. Dade Co.*, 417 So.2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982). If the differences in the Bid Bond relate to a material provision of the RPQ, the County would therefore be compelled to reach the conclusion it reached.

Central to the language of the Bid Bond submitted by H&J is the language which sets forth how and when Miami-Dade County will be entitled to recovery under the Bond. The language of the Bid Bond form included in the RPQ package states, in relevant part as follows:

"Principal and Surety, jointly and severally, bind themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to pay to Miami-Dade County, Florida (herein after County) upon default of Principal the penal sum set forth on the face of this bond.....Default of Principal shall occur in the event that the Principal withdraws Bid within 180 days after bid opening (or any extension thereof agreed to in writing by the Bidder and the County); or, after proper notification of the intent to contract from the County, fails to comply with all pre-award requirements, including but not limited to providing Payment and Performance Bonds with good and sufficient surety....."

The language of the H&J Bid Bond states in relevant part as follows:

"...if the Obligee shall accept the bid of the Principal and the Principal shall enter into a Contract with the Obligee in accordance with the terms of such bid, and give such bond or bonds as may be specified in the bidding or contract documents.....or in the event of the failure of the Principal to enter such contract and give such bond or bonds, if the Principal shall pay the to the obligee the difference not to exceed the penalty hereof between the amount specified in said bid and such larger amount for which the Obligee may in good faith with another party to perform the Work covered by said bid, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect."

The H&J Bid Bond sets forth the conditions and circumstances which under which the obligation to pay under the Bid Bond would take effect. It begins with the language, "If the Obligee." It further adds the condition ".....and the Principal shall enter into a Contract with the Obligee in accordance with the terms of such bid." So at the outset, the moment the Bid Bond becomes effective is upon the fulfillment of these two conditions. The Obligee (County) must first accept the Bid of the Principal (H&J) and H&J shall enter into a contract with the County.

In contrast, the Bid Bond form included in the County RPQ defines default as the withdrawal of the Principal's bid within 180 days after the bid opening or the failure on the part of the bidder to enter into a contract with the County after being given a proper notice of intent. It is the existence of the default that triggers the obligation to pay under the Bid Bond.

The County argues that the condition in the H&J Bid Bond requiring the County to accept the bid of H&J prior to the Bid Bond being effective is indeed a substantive difference. The County form triggered the potential liability of the Surety at the time of the bid opening. The H&J Bid Bond form triggered the potential liability of the Surety only after the acceptance of the H&J Bid.⁵

Contrary to the argument being made by H&J, the difference in the language of these two bonds is different in both form and substance. H&J would enjoy a substantial advantage over its competitors if it could within the One Hundred Eighty (180) day

While I do believe that under these circumstances, the H&J Bid Bond will be adequate to cover the potential liability contemplated in this RPQ that result is less a product of the language of the Bid Bond and more a result of the specific facts present here.

period, be free from the prices quoted in its bid. Both prongs of the test articulated in *Robinson* are present here. The possibility that H&J could change its bid prices or withdraw its bid without the County having any recourse against the Bid Bond would deprive the County of its assurance that it would be able to enter into a contract with H&J. Further, there is nothing in the H&J Bid Bond which would require H&J to hold its bid open for any period of time.⁶ The difference in the obligation of H&J as it relates to the other bidders was and is material and substantial and the County's determination in this regard was within its discretion.

This is more than simply a case of form over substance as H&J argues. While I do not accept the notion that only the exact Bid Bond document or form that was included in the RPQ Bid Package would be adequate to meet the "responsiveness" threshold, I do believe that at a minimum whatever form is used cannot provide less protection to the County than they sought in the RPQ. Had H&J provided a Bid Bond that provided the equivalent protection to the County but on a different form or using different language to say the same thing, the H&J's argument would be well taken.⁷ However, when looking at the language of the H&J Bond, it does not provide the same assurance.

The Case law submitted by H&J in support of its argument all hinge upon the fact that the differences in those case were technical and immaterial. I do not find that is the situation here. Under *Robinson*, the difference in the language meets both prongs of the two (2) part test of materiality. As such, the Bid Bond form used by H&J does not provide the County with the same certainty and security that it required in the RPQ.

H&J belatedly attempted to provide the assurance its Bid Bond was supposed to

⁶ H&J states that the language of the Bid Bond it submitted is not inconsistent with the RPQ Bid Documents. Section 1.02 of the Special Provisions section of the RPQ imposes the requirements necessary for the Bid Bond. This language includes the 180 day requirement. The H&J Bid Bond refers back to the bid documents. However, the language which refers back to the bid documents follows the condition referred to above related to the actual "entering into a contract". To the extent that this condition is inconsistent with the Bid Documents, the H&J Bid Bond is substantively different.


give the County with the inclusion of the Affidavit from Great American indicating that Great American would be willing to provide a Bid Bond in the form requested by the County. However, the validity of H&J's bid must be evaluated at the time of the bid opening.

The difference in the Bid Bond of H&J as it relates to the other bidders was and is material and substantial and the County's determination in this regard was within its discretion. While a minor irregularity can be waived or overlooked, A minor irregularity being defined as a variation which "does not affect the price of the bid, or give the bidder an advantage or benefit not enjoyed by other bidders or does not adversely impact the interests of the agency." *Tropabest Foods, Inc. v. State, Dept. of General Services*, 493 So.2d 50 (Fla. 1st DCA 1986); *Procacci Commercial Realty, Inc. v. Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services*, 690 So.2d 603 (1st DCA 1997). The other bidders are bound by their bids for the entire 180 day period and the other bidders' Bid Bonds became effective immediately upon the opening of the Bids.

CONCLUSION

Based on the facts presented as to the inadequacy of the language of the Bond the Bid Protest of H&J ought to be DENIED. I therefore recommend that the County Manager's recommendation of award to General Asphalt be UPHELD.

Inc. fulfilled the contract measure requirement and is in compliance with the CSBE Participation Provisions.

H & R Paving, Inc. (#2), submitted the required SOI Affidavit committing to utilize Striping Technology Corp., a certified CSBE firm, to perform pavement marking/signs work at 12.5%. 


