

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION WAIVING THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 2-11.38 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY FOR AND APPOINTING LIS-MARIE ALVARADO TO THE COMMISSION FOR WOMEN

WHEREAS, Lis-Marie Alvarado, a native of Nicaragua, has resided in the United States and in Miami-Dade County since 1999; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Alvarado, whose resume is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, has a list of accomplishments related to women's issues, including but not limited to being awarded the Certificate of Outstanding Service to the FIU Women's Studies Program, serving as a panelist on the Wayuu Women Leaders Conference in Columbia, and being awarded the Excellence in Civic Engagement Medallion of Distinction from FIU's Center for Leadership and Service, which is given to graduating undergraduate and graduate students who have excelled in the classroom, community, and as campus leaders; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Alvarado desires to serve as member of the County's Commission for Women, which is responsible, in part, for serving in an advisory capacity to the County Commission, the County administration, the community, and all agencies and persons in Miami-Dade County with respect to all matters pertaining to the status of women, including but not limited to discrimination against women, employment of women, education of women, establishment of day care centers in the community, and attitudes towards women in the community, and to make periodic reports and recommendations to these bodies in respect to such matters; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-11.38 of the Code requires that “all members of County boards shall be permanent residents and electors of Miami-Dade County unless the Board of County Commissioners, by a two-thirds vote of its membership, waives this requirement, and should have reputations for integrity and community service;” and

WHEREAS, Ms. Alvarado does not meet the “elector of Miami-Dade County” requirement since she is not eligible to register to vote because she is a lawful permanent resident rather than a United States Citizen; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding her immigration status and inability to register to vote, Ms. Alvarado would be an ideal candidate to serve on the Commission for Women,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated in this resolution and are approved.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 2-11.38 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the Board by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of its membership, hereby waives the elector of Miami-Dade County requirement for Lis-Marie Alvarado.

Section 3. The Board appoints Lis-Marie Alvarado to the Commission for Women for a four (4) year term.


