Subject: Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Non-Competitive Contracts

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(7)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in their discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item. Ordinance No. 07-139 provides for committee review exemption.

More specifically, the OTRs being considered by the Board in this item are described briefly below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Item 1 - Forensic Odontology Services: Seeks authority to exercise the remaining two, one-year OTR terms for forensic odontology services for the Medical Examiner (ME). Each of the remaining OTR terms is estimated at \$76,000 each, for a total of \$152,000. Approval of this item will extend the services of Dr. Richard Souviron, who is a nationally and internationally recognized expert in dental identification and key to the core mission of the ME, through July 31, 2014.

Item 2 - Artists and Exhibitions Services: Seeks authority to exercise the remaining two, one-year OTR terms for artists and exhibitions services for the Miami-Dade Public Library System (Library) and the Miami-Dade Aviation Department (Aviation). Each of the remaining OTR terms is estimated at \$158,000 each, for a total of \$316,000. Approval of this item will allow continuation of this open pool that consists of over 100 vendors and is used to provide community access to free, high quality art throughout the Library system and at Miami International Airport through August 25, 2014. Library is the primary user of this contract.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source for the ME under Item 1 is \$152,000 from the countywide general fund. Under Item 2, the funding source for OTR terms are Library District funds for Library's \$250,000 allocation and proprietary funds for Aviation's \$66,000 allocation.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amounts/values will be expended by these County departments and/or agencies. Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures as approved in their annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award. The departments' contract managers are reflected in the attached OTR package.

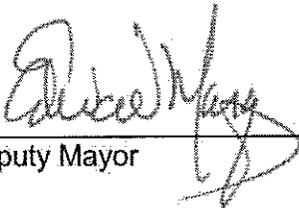
Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The non-competitive contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$100,000 for non-competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any OTR periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Contract Title: Forensic Odontology Services

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise Option-to-Renew (OTR) terms for forensic odontology services for the Medical Examiner (ME). This contract has two OTR periods remaining. Inclusive of exercising the second and third OTR terms, the cumulative value of the contract will be \$342,000.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is used by the ME to purchase professional forensic dental services for examination and evaluation of bite marks to aid in identification of human remains, and cause and manner of death. The services also include educational workshops.

Dr. Richard Souviron, the awarded vendor, has been providing forensic odontology services to the ME for over forty years. He is recognized nationally and internationally as a leading expert and authority on dental identification of deceased persons and bite mark evidence. He offers expertise and training that the department requires to carry out its core mission. Formal training courses are provided by Dr. Souviron to the Department's forensic pathology, forensic nurses and other death investigation staff. It is recommended that the Board approve the second and third options-to-renew to ensure continuity of services.

Contract Title: Artists and Exhibitions Services

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the remaining Option-to-Renew (OTR) terms for artists and exhibitions services for the Miami-Dade Public Library System and the Miami-Dade Aviation Department. The contract is currently in the second OTR period. This contract has two remaining OTR terms. Exercising the remaining OTR terms will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$828,000.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is used by the Miami-Dade Public Library System (MDPLS) and Miami-Dade Aviation Department (Aviation) for artists and exhibitions services. The artist presentations and exhibits provide community access to free, high quality art.

This contract supports the Library's mission to improve public library services by heightening the library's visibility in the community, cultivating broader community involvement and support, and encouraging visual and cultural literacy. Aviation utilizes the contract to procure art and art installation services for Miami International Airport.

A selection committee composed of MDPLS staff and arts and culture representatives from the community conduct extensive market research to identify and select companies and individuals offering distinct art exhibits. Through this contract, the County can procure art exhibits which are unique in nature and cannot be acquired through the County's traditional procurement process. This contract is an open pool, allowing for the addition of vendors.
