

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY OF MIAMI
CODESIGNATION OF NW 32ND AVENUE FROM NW 13TH
STREET TO NW 17TH STREET AS "REV. OBEL GUZMAN
WAY"

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2011, the Miami City Commission adopted Resolution No. R-11-0325 which codesignated NW 32nd Avenue from NW 13th Street to NW 17th Street as "Rev. Obel Guzman Way," in recognition of his contributions to the City of Miami, a copy of which is attached and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Guzman was born in Cuba and ordained to the ministry at the age of 21; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Guzman arrived in Miami in 1970 and shortly thereafter was sent by the Baptist Convention of Florida to minister to Hispanic resident of Sarasota and Bradenton; and

WHEREAS, during this period, Guzman started a weekly Spanish-language Christian radio program for the area he served; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Guzman moved to Miami in 1978 to take over the pastorate of Bautista Buenas Nuevas de Miami Church where he has served for over 30 years; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Guzman passed away on November 24, 2011; and

WHEREAS, NW 32nd Avenue from NW 13th Street to NW 17th Street is a city street located in the City of Miami; and

WHEREAS, the City of Miami wants the County to install signage indicating this codesignation on County street signs and traffic signal masts arms; and

WHEREAS, this codesignation is located in County Commission District 5,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. Approves the City of Miami codesignation of NW 32nd Avenue from NW 13th Street to NW 17th Street as “Rev. Obel Guzman Way.”

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to send certified copies of this Resolution to the City Manager of the City of Miami, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department and Land Development/Right-of-Way Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department, the City of Miami Police Department, and the City of Miami Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Bruno A. Barreiro. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MIAMI CITY COMMISSION, CODESIGNATING NORTHWEST 32ND AVENUE FROM NORTHWEST 13TH STREET TO NORTHWEST 17TH STREET , MIAMI, FLORIDA, BY A FOUR-FIFTHS VOTE, AS "REV. OBEL GUZMAN WAY;" FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO INSTRUCT THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE HEREIN DESIGNATED OFFICES.

WHEREAS, the Code of the City of Miami Section 54-137 requires four votes to codesignate a street for a living individual; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Obel Guzman is the beloved pastor at the Bautista Buenas Nuevas de Miami church; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission wishes to honor his devotion to the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The recitals and findings contained in the Preamble to this Resolution are adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth in this Section.

Section 2. By a four-fifths vote, Northwest 32nd Avenue from Northwest 13th Street to Northwest 17th Street, Miami, Florida, is codesignated as "Rev. Obel Guzman Way".

Section 3. The City Manager is directed to instruct the Director of Public Works to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Departments of Police, Fire-Rescue, Solid Waste, Miami-Dade County Public Works, and the United States Postal Service.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and signature of the Mayor.{1}

Footnotes:

{1} If the Mayor does not sign this Resolution, it shall become effective at the end of ten calendar days from the date it was passed and adopted. If the Mayor vetoes this Resolution, it shall become effective immediately upon override of the veto by the City Commission.
