SUBJECT: Retroactive Application To Apply For, Receive, and Expend Federal Funds From The
Community Policing Development Grant Program

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached Resolution retroactively authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee action to apply for, receive, and expend federal funds in the amount of \$400,000 from the Community Policing Development Grant Program from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services to support the Miami-Dade Police Department. The grant period will be effective October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2014 and does not require any matching local or in-kind funds.

Scope

The grant will provide countywide services.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source


This grant will provide \$400,000 in federal funds to implement the proposed project. The grant does not require any matching local or in-kind funds. The funding source is the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services.

Track Record/Monitor

The Chief Financial Officer of the Miami-Dade Police Department will monitor the grant.

Background

Ratification of this application is necessary because the proposal did not allow time to submit the Resolution to the Board of County Commissioners prior to submitting the application. The Community Policing Development Grant Program supports programs that advance the field of community policing. The Miami-Dade Police Department Special Patrol Bureau has developed an innovative model training program called Response to Gun Fire. Grant funds will allow the Miami-Dade Police Department to implement this model training program to teach community police officers assigned to uniform patrol how to respond when at risk of gun fire, prevent fatal shootings, and ultimately, save lives.

RESOLUTION RETROACTIVELY RATIFYING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE ACTION TO APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000 FROM THE COMMUNITY POLICING DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES; AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE AND EXECUTE SUCH CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS, MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING, MODIFY OR AMEND THE APPLICATION IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS OR TO EXTEND THE PERFORMANCE PERIOD AS REQUIRED IF AWARDED

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board retroactively ratify the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee action to apply for, receive, and expend \$400,000 from the Community Policing Development Grant Program from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, and authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding, and amendments as required by grant guidelines or to further the purposes described in the funding requests following approval by the County Attorney's Office; to expend any and all monies received for the purposes described in the funding request; to apply for, receive and expend future additional funds should they become available through the grant program; to file and execute any necessary amendments to the

application for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and to exercise and execute any amendments, modifications, renewal and extension provisions, cancellation and termination clauses of any applications, contracts, agreements, and Memoranda of Understanding on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The foregoing Resolution was offered by Commissioner who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
