Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of a contract to Palm Peterbilt Truck Centers, Inc. for purchase of ten truck tractors for the Public Works and Waste Management Department.

Contract Number and Title

9594-0/13, Truck Tractors

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact and Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the initial one year term is \$1,408,000 budgeted from Public Works and Waste Management Department's Proprietary Funds.

Track Record/Monitor

This contract is used by the Public Works and Waste Management Department. The contract manager is Olga Espinosa-Anderson. Aylin Borrego of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Due Diligence

Due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There

were no adverse findings relating to contractor responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

The Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference and Local Preference were applied in accordance with the Ordinances. The services provided are not covered under the Living Wage Ordinance. This contract includes the two percent User Access Program provision, which will be collected on all purchases.

Background

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on January 20, 2012 for the purchase of ten truck tractors for the Public Works and Waste Management Department. Two bids were received, of which one of the offers was a "no bid" from Atlantic Truck Center who claimed the specifications were unique to a single original equipment manufacturer. The County contacted an Atlantic Truck Center representative to determine whether the specifications were unnecessarily restrictive. The representative indicated they were unable to bid because their vehicle's manufacturer does not have the front axle brake lining size specified in the solicitation. The County conducted market research and determined that there are multiple manufacturers that could supply the required brake lining in the size required. Staff confirmed the specifications required a certain brake lining size, which do not require a specific manufacturer for this component. Therefore, the specifications were not found to be unduly restrictive.

The truck tractors will replace existing heavy equipment, based on operational needs and the life span of the equipment currently in use. Truck tractors are essential to the continuity of operations and are used daily for hauling refuse transfer trailers that carry waste and residue to and from the County's transfer stations, landfills, the Resources Recovery Facility, and the Waste to Energy Plant.



RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT 9594-0/13, TRUCK TRACTORS, TO PALM PETERBILT TRUCK CENTERS, INC, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$1,408,000 FOR THE ONE-YEAR TERM, AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO MODIFY THE CONTRACT, EXERCISE CANCELLATION AND RENEWAL PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN, AND EXERCISE ANY OTHER RIGHTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award Contract No. 9594-0/13, Truck Tractors, to Palm Peterbilt Truck Centers, Inc, in a total amount of \$1,408,000 for the one-year term; authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to modify the contract, exercise cancellation and renewal provisions contained therein, and exercise any other rights in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract on behalf of Miami-Dade County.
