**Subject:** Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Non-Competitive Contracts

## **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in their discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item. More specifically, this item will allow the County to exercise the remaining two, one-year OTR terms for maintenance and technical support services for the existing LiveScan Software System provided by 3M Cogent, Inc. Each of the remaining OTR terms is estimated at \$22,000 each, for a total of \$44,000. Approval of this item will extend the services through October 31, 2014.

Ordinance No. 07-139 provides for committee review exemption.

## **Scope**

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

## **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

This contract is used by the Human Resources Division of the Internal Services Department. The additional \$44,000 allocation will be covered from the General Fund.

This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount will be expended. Funding will be expended only if the department's budget can support the expenditures as approved in its annual budget adopted by the Board.

## **Track Record/Monitor**

There are no known performance issues with the vendor recommended for award. The department's contract manager is reflected in the attached OTR package.

## **Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

## **Due Diligence**

Due Diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine Contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to Contractor responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

## **Background**

The non-competitive contract listed in this item requires approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract. This contract was awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated

authority (\$100,000 for non-competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any OTR periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for the contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

**JUSTIFICATION**

This contract is used by the Human Resources (HR) Division of the Internal Services Department (ISD) to procure ongoing maintenance and technical support services for the existing LiveScan System provided by 3M Cogent, Inc.

The LiveScan System is an automated criminal background check software system that provides HR with the ability to conduct thorough background checks during the recruitment process for all potential County employees. The system captures applicant fingerprint images and securely transmits criminal background checks via the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and Federal Bureau of Investigation through the State's Volunteer Employee Criminal History System program.

The original contract for purchase of the System was awarded in 2005 under a competitively established State of Florida Contract awarded to 3M Cogent, Inc. The existing non-competitive contract for continued maintenance and support services was established through a non-competitive process for continuity of services with 3M Cogent. ISD is requesting to exercise the remaining two Option-To-Renew (OTR) periods for the continuity of services.

The Cogent application is proprietary software, developed supported and owned by 3M Cogent, Inc. Cogent is the sole provider of software maintenance and technical support services for this product. There are other vendors, iTouch Biometrics, LLC, Alternate Force, Cross Match Technologies, and Secure Outcomes, Inc. that can provide similar livescan systems; however, these vendors cannot provide the required maintenance and support services to the existing system. The vendor has agreed to the same pricing for the remainder of the contract. It is recommended that the OTR be exercised as it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County.
