Subject: Resolution Waiving Formal Bid Procedures and Ratifying Emergency Contract Awards

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(7)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) waive competitive bidding procedures for the purchase of goods and services pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter, and approve the attached emergency contract awards with authority to exercise options-to-renew. Specifically, the items being considered by the Board are described briefly below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Item 1 - Furnish and Install Chiller - Waives formal bid procedures to ratify an emergency contract award of \$191,504 to furnish and install a replacement chiller at the Miami Beach Regional Library. The chiller was inoperable and could not be repaired.

Item 2 - Central A/C and Related Ductwork – Pre-qualification - Waives formal bid procedures to ratify an emergency contract award of \$510,750 for the supply, installation and servicing of central air conditioning systems for low-income and elderly residents.

Scope

The impact of the items in the attached Bid Waiver Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source for the departments are listed in the attached Bid Waiver Package.

The contract amounts and departmental allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by the department. Funding will be expended only if the department's budget can support the expenditures approved in its annual budget adopted by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the attached Bid Waiver Package. The departments' contract managers are reflected in the attached Bid Waiver Packages.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING WAIVER OF FORMAL BID PROCEDURES FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES, AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO AWARD SAME, WITH AUTHORITY TO EXERCISE OPTIONS-TO-RENEW ESTABLISHED THEREUNDER, PURSUANT TO SECTION 5.03(D) OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER AND SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE COUNTY CODE BY A TWO-THIRDS (2/3S) VOTE OF THE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to waive formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services which cannot be purchased under normal bid procedures,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board waives formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award such contracts, with authority to exercise options-to-renew established thereunder, pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1 of the County Code by a two-thirds (2/3s) vote of the Board members present.



 This emergency contract was awarded to replace the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) system chiller unit that failed at the Miami Beach Regional Library. The Library Department's air conditioning team attempted to repair the chiller unit; however, it was determined to be inoperable and could not be repaired. In order to maintain the facility operational, an emergency contract was established for the immediate purchase and installation of a replacement chiller. The timely replacement ensured the comfort and safety of employees and library patrons.

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Type of Non-competitive Award: Bid Waiver Sole Source Emergency Award

Justification:

The Community Action and Human Services Department (CAHSD), through its Energy Programs Division, was awarded American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds for the purpose of rehabilitating and weather-proofing privately-owned homes for low-income residents under the Weatherization Assistance Program. Two additional ARRA grants were awarded in February 2012 for the purpose of rehabilitating and weatherizing multifamily units. These services included removal of existing air conditioning units prior to new installation, installation of digital thermostats, inspection, sealing, insulation and replacement of existing ducts.

CAHSD's existing allocation on contract 8933-1/13-1, Central A/C and Related Ductwork Pre-qualification, did not provide sufficient expenditure authority to procure the goods and services, complete and pay for the work, and complete all grant close-out activities associated with the June 5, 2012 deadline associated with the ARRA funds. As such, it was necessary to establish an emergency allocation of \$510,750 in order ensure that the maximum amount of utilization/services was provided to these low income and elderly residents prior to expiration of the grant funding.
