Subject: Resolution Authorizing Competitive Contract Awards, Rejections, and Modifications

Agenda Item No. 8(F)(8)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached competitive contract awards, rejection of bids, and competitive contract modifications, with authority to exercise options-to-renew (OTRs). The items are described below and in more detail in the accompanying attachments:

Section 1: Award of Competitive Contracts

Item 1.1 - Sodium Permanganate: Awards a contract so that the Water and Sewer Department can purchase sodium permanganate for the treatment of potable water to lower color, reduce organic carbon, and as a disinfectant. The requested allocation for the five-year contract is \$3,161,000.

Section 2: Rejection of Bids

Item 2.1 – Various Lab Instruments: Rejects all nine bids received under solicitation 9666-0/17 *Various Laboratory Instruments*. The fiscal impact for the five-year contract term would have been \$6,129,000. This item is related to Item 3.2 below that extends the existing Lab Instruments contract.

Section 3: Competitive Contract Modifications

Item 3.1 – Landscaping and Lawn Services: Modifies this contract for an additional \$207,000 in spending authority to allow the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Department to provide landscape and lawn maintenance services to additional sites.

Item 3.2 – Various Lab Instruments, Pre-qualification: Modifies this contract for an additional 60 months and \$5,675,000 in spending authority to allow various County departments to continue to purchase, install, service and/or maintain laboratory instruments, equipment, and related items. This modification continues the existing pre-qualification pool for lab instruments and consolidates contract *EPP7877-4/12 Mass Spectrometers Accessories and Maintenance*.

Item 3.3 – Meters for Water Service: Modifies this contract for an additional 60 months and \$9,800,000 in spending authority to allow the Water and Sewer Department to continue purchasing water metering equipment for the County's water distribution infrastructure.

Item 3.4 – Financial Advisory Services, Aviation Segment: Modifies this contract for an additional \$633,000 in spending authority for the Aviation Department to continue purchasing financial advisory services.

Item 3.5 – Continuous Stock Pin Feed Paper: Modifies this contract for an additional six months and \$150,000 in spending authority for the Information Technology Department to continue purchasing continuous stock pin feed paper.

Item 3.6 – Process Control Equipment and Instrumentation: Modifies the existing pre-qualification pool contract for an additional 60 months and \$13,550,000 in spending authority for the Water and Sewer and Regulatory and Economic Resources departments to continue purchasing units, parts, and services for process control equipment and specialized instrumentation.

Item 3.7 – Professional Training Pre-Qualification Pool: Modifies the existing pre-qualification pool contract for an additional \$162,000 in spending authority for the Human Resources Division of the Internal Services to continue purchasing professional training services for various County departments.

Scope

The impact of the items in the attached package are countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The allocation and funding source, by department, is listed in the attached items.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance/compliance issues with the vendors recommended for award in this package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the attached items.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew periods and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of each contract.

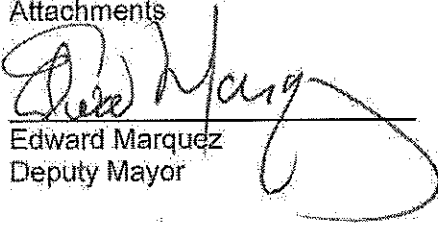
Due Diligence

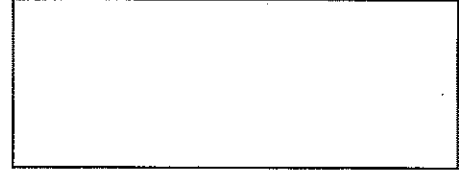

Subject: Recommendation for Award: Sodium Permanganate



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve award of contract 7868-0/17 Sodium Permanganate to F2 Industries, LLC (primary vendor) and Carus Corporation (secondary vendor) to purchase sodium permanganate in a 20 percent solution for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD). Sodium permanganate is used in the treatment of potable water to lower color, reduce organic carbon, and as a disinfectant.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact and Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the total five year term is \$3,161,000. These costs will be covered by WASD's proprietary funds.

The previous contract amount was \$4,478,000 for five years and six months. The proposed contract amount is based on anticipated usage and includes lower estimated quantities and improved pricing compared to the previous contract.

Track Record/Monitor

WASD is the user department, and Gregory Hicks is the contract manager. Herman Ramsey of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Officer.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, at their discretion, contract modifications and extensions in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

An Invitation to Bid was issued under full and open competition on April 26, 2012. Award was made to the two responsive and responsible bidders offering the lowest aggregate price.

Background

The use of sodium permanganate is dependent on climatic conditions, such as low or high water and vegetation cycles, which cannot be predicted. For example, when decayed vegetation seeps into the Biscayne Aquifer and causes treated potable water to turn yellow, more sodium permanganate is required to eliminate the yellowish color. When there are no color issues, the use of the chemical might be reduced or even stopped.

Subject: Recommendation to Reject all Bids Received; Various Laboratory Instruments
Equipment



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the rejection of all nine bids received under solicitation 9666-0/17 *Various Laboratory Instruments Equipment Pre-qualification*. The purpose of the solicitation was to pre-qualify vendors for future pricing competition(s) in order to purchase, install, service, and/or maintain laboratory instruments, equipment, and related items, as required by various County departments.

This pool contract was to be a consolidation of two existing County pool contracts (*EPP7877-4/12 Mass Spectrometers Accessories and Maintenance Pre-qualification* and *8348-0/12 Various Laboratory Instruments Pre-qualification*) that were comparable in scope of work, equipment, and requirements. This solicitation had only nine respondents, who are already in the existing pre-qualification pools. The larger of the two existing pool contracts (*8348-0/12 Various Laboratory Instruments Pre-qualification*) includes 29 pre-qualified vendors. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the County to reject the responses received for this solicitation and continue using the existing pool contract that allows for greater participation.

A five-year extension of *8348-0/12 Various Laboratory Instruments Pre-qualification*, which expires on February 28, 2013, will be presented to the Board for approval to ensure continuity of these goods and services. Contract *EPP7877-4/12 Mass Spectrometers Accessories and Maintenance Pre-qualification* will be allowed to expire, and the vendors under that contract will be added into the contract that is to be extended, therefore consolidating the contracts.

Scope

The impact of this item would have been countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact of the total five-year contract term would have been \$6,129,000. The allocations were budgeted as follows:

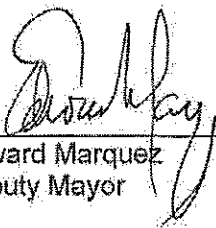

Contract Description and Reason for Change:

Approval is requested to modify the existing prequalification pool contract for purchase of Various Lab Instruments. Originally, a solicitation (9666-0/17) was issued for the purpose of consolidating this existing contract with another, similar existing contract (Mass Spectrometer Accessories and Maintenance). However, only nine vendors responded to the solicitation whereas the existing Various Lab Instruments contract has 29 vendors. Additionally, the nine vendors that responded were already part of the existing Various Lab Instruments contract. As such, and included as Item 2.1 in this agenda item, the new solicitation is being rejected. This modification requests to extend the existing Various Lab Instruments Prequalification Pool for an additional five years and \$5.675 million. The allocation requested reflects the combined allocation of the former Mass Spectrometer Accessories and Maintenance contract and Various Lab Instruments contract.

Authorization is requested for additional time and spending authority to allow the Water and Sewer and the Regulatory and Economic Resources departments to continue to purchase units, parts and services for process control equipment and specialized instrumentation. These process, control, and instrumentation devices are critical to maintaining a working infrastructure that serves 2.5 million residents daily. The infrastructure includes: 105 raw water wells, three water plants, and 7,600 miles of water distribution pipe along with 1,041 sewer pump stations, 6,200 miles of sewer collection pipe, and three wastewater treatment plants, which must be in compliance with applicable laws and operating permits.

This contract covers the various manufacturers of process control and instrumentation equipment located throughout the Water and Wastewater treatment infrastructure. The existing prequalification pool offers the county a competitive advantage when purchasing process control equipment and instrumentation. Extension of the pool enables departments to continue accessing this contract for these units, parts and services. The proposed allocations are consistent with the anticipated usage levels of this contract.
