

RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_\_\_

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING WEST 12 AVENUE FROM WEST 37 STREET TO WEST 49 STREET AS "OPERATION PEDRO PAN AVENUE"; URGING THE CITY OF HIALEAH TO JOIN IN THIS CODESIGNATION

**WHEREAS**, in the spring of 1960, Cuban Dictator Fidel Castro announced his intention to close secondary, religious and private schools and open revolutionary youth camps, taking children away from their families and homes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Castro regime intended to take Cuban children from their parents at age five and indoctrinate them to Castro's communist beliefs and Marxist-Leninist ideology; and

**WHEREAS**, Cuban parents urgently began looking for way to get their children out of the island nation; and

**WHEREAS**, a secret plan was developed to evacuate children from Cuba by parents in Cuba, Monsignor Bryan O. Walsh, who was the director of the Catholic Welfare Bureau for the Archdiocese of Miami, James Baker, who was head of the Ruston Academy, an American school in Havana, and the United States Government; and

**WHEREAS**, Cuban children began boarding flights from Havana to Miami on December 26, 1960, and between then and October 23, 1962, more than 14,000 Cuban youths, most of whom were between the ages of 12 and 18, arrived alone in the United States through a secret program now known as Operation Pedro Pan; and

**WHEREAS**, Operation Pedro Pan was the largest recorded exodus of unaccompanied minors in the history of the Western Hemisphere, carried out at great danger to parents and other individuals who assisted in Cuba; and

**WHEREAS**, approximately half of the Cuban youths who arrived in Miami through Operation Pedro Pan were united at the airport with relatives already living in the United States, while the other half who did not have relatives yet here were placed in the care of Monsignor Walsh and the Catholic Welfare Bureau; and

**WHEREAS**, the youths under the care of Monsignor Walsh initially were placed in temporary shelters in Miami-Dade County, including Camp Matecumbe at Southwest 137 Avenue and 120 Street in South West Miami-Dade County, as well as shelters in Florida City, Kendall, Opa-Locka, St. Raphael's and Casa Carrión; and

**WHEREAS**, many Operation Pedro Pan children eventually were relocated to stay with families in more than 30 states until such times as their parents arrived in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, most but not all of the children of Operation Pedro Pan were eventually reunited with their parents in the United States although events such as the Bay of Pigs Invasion and the Cuban Missile Crisis delayed the arrival of parent in many cases for a number of years; and

**WHEREAS**, many Operation Pedro Pan alumni are today leading citizens in Miami and hold high positions around the United States and abroad; and

**WHEREAS**, well known Pedro Pan alumni include former United States Senator Mel Martinez, musician Willy Chirino, developer Armando Codina and City of Miami Mayor Tomás Regalado; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1991, a number of alumni of Operation Pedro Pan created the Operation Pedro Pan Group, Inc. to help needy children and preserve the history of Operation Pedro Pan; and

**WHEREAS**, brave Cuban youths who came to the United States through Operation Pedro Pan were uprooted from their homes and separated from their families; and

**WHEREAS**, thousands of Cuban parents made incredible and dangerous sacrifices on behalf of their children through Operation Pedro Pan so that their children could live in a free society; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Resolutions R-1432-02 and R-498-03, this Board previously codesignated Southwest 120 Street from Southwest 117 Avenue to Southwest 147 Avenue as Monsignor Bryan O. Walsh Street for his important role in Operation Pedro Pan; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Resolution R-862-12, this Board on October 23, 2012 approved the City of Miami codesignation of Southeast 15 Road from Brickell Avenue to Biscayne Bay as “Elly Chovel Road” in honor of the founder and chairperson of Operation Pedro Pan Group, Inc.; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board also would like to honor all of the youths, parents, religious leaders and government officials who made Operation Pedro Pan a success with this codesignation; and

**WHEREAS**, West 12 Avenue from West 37 Street to West 49 Street is a County road located in the City of Hialeah; and

**WHEREAS**, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 13,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates West 12 Avenue from West 37 Street to West 49 Street as “Operation Pedro Pan Avenue.”

**Section 2.** Urging the City of Hialeah to join in this codesignation.

**Section 3.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Mayor of the City of Hialeah, the Hialeah Police Department, the Hialeah Fire Department, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Public Works and Waste Management Department and the Development Services Division of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner \_\_\_\_\_ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
