

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### **Recommendation**

I have reviewed the attached application for a Class I permit and a variance submitted by the City of Miami. Based upon the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 and Section 24-48.25 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code), I recommend that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the issuance of a Class I permit and approve the requested variance for the reasons set forth below.

### **Scope**

The site is in Miamarina at Bayside Marketplace, 401 Biscayne Boulevard, Miami, in Commission District 5 (Comm. Barreiro).

### **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

Not applicable

### **Track Record/Monitor**

The Coastal and Wetlands Resources Section Manager, Lisa Spadafina, within the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Division of Environmental Resources Management, will monitor the terms and conditions of the proposed permit.

### **Background**

This Class I permit application and variance requests authorization to install non-water-dependent canopies at the Miamarina at Bayside Marketplace located at 401 Biscayne Boulevard, Miami. Because non-water-dependent fixed structures are prohibited by Section 24-48.24 of the Code, the applicant is seeking a variance from this prohibition at a public hearing before the Board.

The proposed project site is a commercial and recreational marina adjacent to the Bayside Marketplace. The marina is owned and operated by the City of Miami and the docking structures along the north and west sides of the marina are occupied by commercial vessels and rental boats. The marginal docks and adjacent walkways are used by the customers and employees of these operations as well as the general public.

In order to provide shade and protection from the elements for the public, the applicant is proposing to install four (4) permanent canopies along the north and west marginal docks and walkways. The 649 linear feet of canopies will cover 8,761.5 square feet at heights compatible with the view corridors from the main pedestrian areas. The canopies will not extend waterward of the existing marginal docks and the shaded water areas are within existing permitted boat slips. The canopies will be graded towards the uplands in order to prevent positive drainage of stormwater to tidal waters, and are not expected to result in cumulative environmental impacts.

The canopies are non-water-dependent fixed structures that are prohibited by Section 24-48.24 of the Code. Therefore, the applicant has requested a variance in order to allow the canopies. Section 24-48.25 of the Code lists factors for consideration of variance requests, including but not limited to: visual or physical access by the general public to Biscayne Bay and its adjacent tidal waters, historical significance, environmental impact, navigation, public safety and aesthetics. The canopies will provide the proprietors, marina patrons and the general public with protection from the elements, thereby increasing public safety. In addition, staff have evaluated the remaining factors for consideration and determined that the proposed project is not reasonably expected to result in adverse impacts. Therefore, the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Division of Environmental Resources Management, recommends that the requested variance be granted.

The project is located within an area identified by the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan as essential manatee habitat for the *Trichechus manatus* (West Indian Manatee). Because the installation of the canopies does not include any in-water work, the proposed project is not expected to adversely impact manatees.

The proposed project has been designed in accordance with all relevant Miami-Dade County coastal construction criteria and is consistent with all other Miami-Dade County coastal protection provisions. Please find attached a Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources Project Report which sets forth the reasons the proposed project is recommended for approval pursuant to the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 and 24-48.25 of the Code of Miami-Dade County. The conditions, limitations, and restrictions set forth in the Project Report attached hereto are incorporated herein by references hereto.

**DATE: November 8, 2012**

Staff's recommendation of approval for the above-referenced permit application is based on the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code), Florida. The following is a summary of the proposed project with respect to each applicable evaluation factor:

1. **Potential Adverse Environmental Impact** –The installation and maintenance of the proposed canopies are not expected to have any adverse environmental impacts. The footprint of the canopies will be located over the existing upland walkways and marginal docks, and the in-water areas that will be shaded are existing permitted boat slips in an artificial boat basin that have been in use since at least 1970.

The proposed project is located within an area identified by the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan (MDCMPP) as essential manatee habitat for the *Trichechus manatus* (West Indian Manatee). However, no in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies.

2. **Potential Cumulative Adverse Environmental Impact** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to result in potential cumulative adverse environmental impacts.
3. **Hydrology** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect surface water drainage or retention of stormwater. The canopies will be graded towards the uplands in order to prevent positive drainage of stormwater to tidal waters.
4. **Water Quality** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to result in impacts to water quality. Although the canopies will cast a shadow outside of their footprint, the in-water areas that will be shaded are existing permitted boat slips that have been in use since at least 1970.
5. **Wellfields** – Not applicable.
6. **Water Supply** – Not applicable.
7. **Aquifer Recharge** – Not applicable.
8. **Aesthetics** – The project is designed to be aesthetically compatible with the surrounding area. The canopies will be located at elevations that will not impact the view corridors associated with the existing facilities and walkways at Bayside Marketplace. Therefore, the proposed canopies are not reasonably expected to have negative aesthetic impacts.
9. **Navigation** – No in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies; therefore, the proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect navigation.
10. **Public Health** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect public health.
11. **Historic Values** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect historic values.
12. **Archaeological Values** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect archaeological values.
13. **Air Quality** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect air quality.
14. **Marine and Wildlife Habitats** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect marine and wildlife habitats. The footprint of the proposed canopies will be located over the existing upland walkways and marginal docks, and the in-water areas that will be shaded are existing permitted boat slips in an artificial boat basin that have been in use since at least 1970.  
  
The proposed project is located within an area identified by the MDCMPP as essential manatee habitat for the West Indian Manatee. However, no in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies.
15. **Wetland Soils Suitable for Habitat** – There are no wetland soils suitable for habitat in the footprint of the proposed work.

16. **Floral Values** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect floral values, for the reasons set forth in Number 1 above.
17. **Fauna Values** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect marine fauna, for the reasons set forth in Number 1 above.
18. **Rare, Threatened and Endangered Species** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect any rare, threatened or endangered species. The over-water proposed work area is not located in critical habitat for Johnson's seagrass, a Federally Listed Threatened Species. The proposed project is located within an area identified by the MDCMPP as essential manatee habitat for the West Indian Manatee. However, no in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies.
19. **Natural Flood Damage Protection** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect surface water drainage or retention of stormwater.
20. **Wetland Values** – The proposed project does not involve dredging or filling of wetlands.
21. **Land Use Classification** – Pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(B)(7), of the Code, a substantiating letter shall be submitted stating that the proposed project does not violate any zoning laws. Said letter will be submitted after the approval by the Board of County Commissioners and prior to the issuance of a Class I permit.
22. **Recreation** - The proposed project does not conflict with the recreation element of the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan.
23. **Other Environmental Values Affecting the Public Interest** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect other environmental values affecting the public interest. The submerged lands over which the project will occur are owned by the applicant.
24. **Conformance with Standard Construction Procedures and Practices and Design and Performance Standards** – The proposed project includes the installation of non-water-dependent fixed structures. Therefore, the project is not in full conformance with the Biscayne Bay Management Plan or with Section 24-48.24 of the Code. However, the applicant is requesting a variance to the water dependency requirement of the Code, and the installation of non-water-dependent structures is not reasonably expected to create adverse environmental impacts.
25. **Comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement (CEIS)** – In the opinion of the Director, the proposed project will not result in environmental impacts and is not reasonably expected to result in cumulative adverse environmental impacts. Therefore, a CEIS was not required by the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources to evaluate the project.
26. **Conformance with All Applicable Federal, State and Local Laws and Regulations** - The proposed project is in conformance with the following applicable State, Federal and local laws and regulations:
  - a) Miami-Dade County Public Works Manual
27. **Conformance with the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP)** - In the opinion of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, the proposed canopies are not in full conformance with the CDMP. However, the applicant is requesting a variance from the Section of Code relating to these non-water dependent structures as they pertain to the proposed project. The following is a summary of the proposed project as it relates to the CDMP:

#### **LAND USE ELEMENT I:**

**Objective 3/Policies 3A, 3B, 3C** - Protection of natural resources and systems. – The proposed project is consistent with the Conservation and Coastal Management Elements of the CDMP. The project is compatible with surrounding land uses and does not involve development in the Big Cypress area of Critical State concern or the East Everglades.

#### **TRANSPORTATION ELEMENT II**

**Aviation Subelement/Objective 9** - Aviation System Expansion - There is no aviation element to the proposed project.

**Port of Miami River Subelement/Objective 3** - Minimization of impacts to estuarine water quality and marine resources. The proposed project will not take place within the tidal waters of the Miami River.

**CONSERVATION, AQUIFER RECHARGES AND DRAINAGE ELEMENT IV:**

**Objective 3/Policies 3A, 3B, 3D** - Wellfield protection area protection. - The proposed project is not located within a wellfield protection area.

**Objective 3/Policy 3E** - Limestone mining within the area bounded by the Florida Turnpike, the Miami-Dade/Broward Levee, N.W. 12 Street and Okeechobee Road. - The proposed project is not located within this area.

**Objective 4/Policies 4A, 4B, 4C** - Water storage, aquifer recharge potential and maintenance of natural surface water drainage. - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect water storage, aquifer recharge potential or natural surface water drainage.

**Objective 5/Policies 5A, 5B, 5F** - Flood protection and cut and fill criteria. - The proposed project does not compromise flood protection, involve filling for development purposes, and is not related to cut and fill activities.

**Objective 6/Policy 6A** - Areas of highest suitability for mineral extraction. - The proposed project is not located in an area proposed or suitable for mineral extraction.

**Objective 6/Policy 6B** - Guidelines for rock quarries for the re-establishment of native flora and fauna. - The proposed project is not located in a rock quarry.

**Objective 6/Policy 6D** - Suitable fill material for the support of development. - The proposed project does not involve filling for the purposes of development.

**Objective 7/Policy 7A** - No net loss of high quality, relatively unstressed wetlands. - The proposed project will not result in a net loss of any such wetlands.

**Objective 9/Policies 9A, 9B, 9C** - Protection of habitat critical to Federal, State-designated threatened or endangered species. - The proposed work is not located in critical habitat for Johnson's seagrass, a Federally Listed Threatened Species. The proposed project is located within an area identified by the MDCMPP as essential manatee habitat for the West Indian Manatee. However, no in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies.

**COASTAL MANAGEMENT ELEMENT VII:**

**Objective 1/Policy 1A** - Tidally connected mangroves in mangrove protection areas. - The proposed project is not located within a designated "Mangrove Protection Area."

**Objective 1/ Policy 1B** - Natural surface flow into and through coastal wetlands. - The proposed project will not affect natural surface flow into and through coastal wetlands.

**Objective 1/ Policy 1C** - Elevated boardwalk access through mangroves. - The proposed project does not involve access through mangroves.

**Objective 1/Policy 1D** - Protection and maintenance of mangrove forests and related natural vegetational communities. - The proposed project does not involve work in mangrove forests, coastal hammock, or other natural vegetational communities.

**Objective 1/Policy 1E** - Mitigation for the degradation and destruction of coastal wetlands. Monitoring and maintenance of mitigation areas. - The proposed project does not involve the degradation and destruction of coastal wetlands and therefore does not involve monitoring of mitigation for impacts to coastal wetlands.

**Objective 1/Policy 1G** - Prohibition on dredging or filling of grass/algal flats, hard bottom or other viable benthic communities, except as provided for in Chapter 24 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. - The proposed project does not involve the dredging or filling of grass/algal flats, hard bottom or other viable benthic communities.

**Objective 2/Policies 2A, 2B** - Beach restoration and renourishment objectives. - The proposed project does not involve beach restoration or renourishment.

**Objective 3/Policy 3E, 3F** - Location of new cut and spoil areas for proper stabilization and minimization of damages - The proposed project does not involve the development/identification of new cut/spoil areas.

**Objective 4/Policy 4A, 4C, 4E, 4F** - Protection of endangered or threatened animal species. - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to affect endangered or threatened animal species, as set forth in Number 18 above.

**Objective 5/Policy 5B** - Existing and new areas for water-dependent uses - The proposed project has the potential to enhance existing water dependent uses, by providing protection from the elements to proprietors and patrons of the marina.

**Objective 5/Policy 5D** - Consistency with Chapter 33D, Miami-Dade County Code (shoreline access, environmental compatibility of shoreline development) - The proposed project has been approved by the Shoreline Development Review Committee (SDRC) Board of the Miami-Dade Planning and Zoning Department prior to permit issuance.

**Objective 5/Policy 5F** - The siting of water dependent facilities. - The proposed project does not involve the creation of any new water-dependent facilities.

28. **Conformance with Chapter 33B, Code of Miami-Dade County** (East Everglades Zoning Overlay Ordinance) - The proposed project is not located within the East Everglades Area.
29. **Conformance with Miami-Dade County Ordinance 81-19** (Biscayne Bay Management Plan Sections 33D-1 through 33D-4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County) - The proposed project includes the installation of non-water-dependent fixed structures. Therefore, the project is not in full conformance with the Biscayne Bay Management Plan. However, the applicant is requesting a variance to the water dependency requirement of the Code. In addition, the installation of the non-water-dependent structures is not reasonably expected to create adverse environmental impacts.
30. **Conformance with the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan** - The proposed project is located within an area identified by the MDCMPP as essential manatee habitat for the West Indian Manatee. However, no in-water work is proposed to occur in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies.
31. **Consistency with Miami-Dade County Criteria for Lake Excavation** - The proposed project does not involve lake excavation.
32. **Municipality Recommendation** - Pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(B)(7), Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a substantiating letter shall be submitted stating that the proposed project does not violate any zoning laws. Said letter will be submitted after the approval by the Board of County Commissioners and prior to the issuance of the Class I permit.
33. **Coastal Resources Management Line** - A coastal resources management line was not required for the proposed project, pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(B)(10)(b) of the Code of Miami-Dade County.
34. **Maximum Protection of a Wetland's Hydrological and Biological Functions** - The proposed project is not expected to impact wetland hydrological and biological functions.
35. **Class I Permit Applications Proposing to Exceed the Boundaries Described in Section D-5.03(2)(a) of the Miami-Dade County Public Works Manual** - the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources has considered the following factors:
  - i. **Whether the proposed exceedance is the minimum necessary to avoid seagrasses or other valuable environmental resources** - Not applicable.
  - ii. **Whether the proposed exceedance is the minimum necessary to achieve adequate water depth for mooring of a vessel** - Not applicable.
  - iii. **Whether the applicant has provided notarized letters of consent to the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources from adjoining riparian property owners** - Not applicable.
  - iv. **Whether any letters of objection from adjoining riparian property owners were received by the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources** - Not applicable.

The proposed project was evaluated for compliance with the standards contained in Section 24-48.3(2), (3), and (4) of the Code. The following is a summary of how the standards relate to the proposed project:

**24-48.3 (2) Dredging and Filling for Class I Permit** - The proposed project does not involve dredging and filling activities.

**24-48.3 (3) Minimum Water Depth Required for Boat Slips Created by the Construction or Placement of Fixed or Floating Docks and Piers, Piles and Other Structures Requiring a Permit Under Article IV, Division 1 of Chapter 24 of the Code of Miami-Dade County** - The proposed project does not involve the creation of boat slips.

**24-48.3 (4) Clean Fill in Wetlands** - The proposed project does not involve placing clean fill in wetlands.

The proposed project was also evaluated based upon the applicable factors set forth in Section 24-48.25 of the Code.

36. **Visual or physical access by the general public to Biscayne Bay and its adjacent tidal waters** - The subject canopies will not impact existing visual or physical access to adjacent waters, and will provide protection from the elements to those utilizing the marginal docks within the project areas.

37. **Historical significance** - The marginal docks and associated facilities have existed in their current location since at least 1970.

38. **Need for covered vessel repair facilities** - Not applicable.

39. **Environmental impact or cumulative environmental impact** - The installation of the proposed canopies is not reasonably expected to create adverse environmental impacts.

40. **Navigation** - No in-water work is proposed in association with the installation and maintenance of the canopies; therefore, the proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect navigation.

41. **Public safety** - The installation of canopies will provide protection from the elements, increasing the public safety of users.


42. **Aesthetics** - The project is designed to be aesthetically compatible with the surrounding area. The canopies will be located at elevations that will not impact the view corridors associated with the existing facilities and walkways at Bayside Marketplace. Therefore, the proposed canopies are not reasonably expected to have negative aesthetic impacts.


43. **Biscayne Bay Management Plan** - In the opinion of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, the proposed canopies are not in full conformance with the Biscayne Bay Management Plan. However, the applicant is requesting a variance from the Section of the Code relating to non-water dependent-structures as it pertains to the proposed project.

44. **Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve Act** - The proposed project is not in conformance with the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve Act. However, the applicant is requesting a variance from the Section of the Code relating to non-water-dependent structures as it pertains to the proposed project.

45. **Rules of the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve** - The proposed project is not in conformance with the rules of the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve. However, the applicant is requesting a variance from the Section of the Code relating to non-water-dependent structures as it pertains to the proposed project.

BASED ON THE FOREGOING, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT A CLASS I PERMIT BE APPROVED.
