

**Subject:** Amendment to the FY 1998 - 2013 Annual Action Plans for Community Development Block Grant and Home Investment Partnerships Program Funds

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to substantially amend the FY 1998 through 2013 Action Plans to:

- Recapture \$6,181,625.04 in FY 1998 - 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from a total of 67 projects and reallocate to 26 projects under the *Finish What We Started Policy* or to projects that applied in the FY 2013 Request For Applications (RFA) process.
- Allocate \$260,362.00 of FY 2013 CDBG funds to Commission Districts 11 and 12. These Commission District Fund (CDF) allocations for Commission Districts 11 and 12 were not included in the FY 2013 Action Plan Funding Recommendations that the Board recently approved March 5, 2013.
- Waive the provision of Resolution No. R-596-12 for two infrastructure projects located outside the Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas (NRSA) in North Miami Beach, under the *Finish What We Started Policy* and a waiver to allow funding of twenty-six percent (26%) of total project cost for one project.
- Recapture and reallocate \$2,213,467.52 in FY 2007, 2010 and 2013 Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds from one activity to four housing rental new construction projects that applied in the FY 2013 RFA that have demonstrated financing commitments are in place and one project administered by the Department of Regulatory and Environmental Resources.
- Authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute all contracts, agreements, and amendments necessary to carry out the above programs.
- Authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the cancellation provisions contained therein.

## **SCOPE**

Exhibits I and II include the proposed recapture and reallocation funding recommendations for the FY 1998 through 2013 Annual Action Plans and the Commission District location for each activity recommended in this amendment.

## **FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE**

The recapture and/or reallocation of prior years' CDBG and HOME funds will not create a new fiscal impact to the County. This item allocates funds which either (a) have already been identified for use for CDBG-eligible projects or (b) were previously allocated to projects but are being recaptured pursuant to this resolution.

## **TRACK RECORD/MONITORING**

Gregg Fortner will monitor all CDBG and HOME funded activities. PHCD will monitor these projects to ensure compliance with federal guidelines and County policies, through review of quarterly progress reports.

**BACKGROUND**

Funded activities (as part of the FY 2013 and prior years' Action Plans) are monitored throughout the year to ensure agencies are in compliance with federal regulations, such as the progress of each activity towards accomplishing the national objectives, as set forth by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (U.S. HUD). As such, PHCD recommends the recapture of CDBG and HOME funding from activities that: 1) have been completed, have unexpended balances, and were able to meet a U.S. HUD National Objective; 2) were no longer feasible or unable to meet a U.S. HUD National Objective; 3) unable to expend funds; 4) have expired contracts; or 5) agency declined funding. This item reallocates funds to eligible activities that: 1) received partial or no funding through the FY 2013 RFA and were next in line for funding; 2) received prior funding but have a current funding gap, and meet the conditions for additional funding under the County's *Finish What We Started* policy; 3) CDF allocation; 4) County department allocation; 5) requested remaining funds, or 6) requested funds for low-moderate residential neighborhoods.

**FY 1998 – FY 2012 CDBG FUNDS (\$6,181,625.04)**

The allocation of funds will enable the implementing entities to complete their project delivery objectives in a timely manner. For entities that have commenced project development, the supplemental funding will allow for the entity to better meet their objective which is consistent with the County's policy of *Finish What We Started* policy— an approach to the allocation of CDBG program funds designed to give priority funding to previously funded projects, which, for varying reasons, may require additional funds to ensure completion of the activity. This funding approach has been adopted to address the number of incomplete projects which have not been closed out and consequently have impacted the County's 1.5 expenditure ratio with U.S. HUD.

For agencies that applied in the FY 2013 RFA process, the brief descriptions provided in this memorandum, which accompany the recommendations for allocations of reprogrammed CDBG funds, are based upon the detailed scope of work provided in each Agency's application. The contracts ultimately entered into between the Agency and the County will include a detailed scope of work based upon each Agency's application.

On July 3, 2012 the Board approved Resolution No. R-596-12 which assumes that sixty percent (60%) of CDBG funds will be allocated to County Departments or for the administration of the program. Of the remaining forty percent (40%) of the CDBG funds, Resolution No. R-596-12 requires that a minimum of fifty percent (50%) of those CDBG funds be used for economic development activities and requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board for any infrastructure projects located outside of an NRSA. The recommended projects in this resolution are consistent with the policies set forth in R-596-12, except where an exception and waiver of the R-596-12 is specifically requested.

A waiver of Resolution No. R-596-12 is being requested on behalf of the City of North Miami Beach for the Allen Park Renovation Project and the NE 172<sup>nd</sup> Roadway improvements. These projects are not located within an NRSA. Additionally, the amount of CDBG funds contributed toward the total project cost for the Allen Park Renovation Project will be twenty-six percent (26%), exceeding the twenty-five percent (25%) restriction placed on the allocation of CDBG funds. Approval of this waiver requires a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board. The City of North Miami Beach is a participating Unit of General Local Government in the County's annual CDBG allocation. Additionally, the City of North Miami Beach was previously funded in 2010 for this project. The City of North Miami Beach submitted a request for an additional \$200,000.00 to complete the renovations of Allen Park, which includes roof replacement, interior renovations and installation of an elevator for ADA access.

Notwithstanding the recommendations to projects in the RFA, agencies that have pending liability issues are required to address and resolve all outstanding liability issues with Miami-Dade County prior to any expenditure of funds.

Activities that are proposed for recapture of funds are identified in Exhibit I. Listed below are brief descriptions by category for all activities recommended to receive reallocation of funds from FY 2008 - 2013 Action Plans, as identified in Exhibit II.

### ***Economic Development***

1. Partners for Self-Employment, Inc. – Entrepreneurial Institute (\$10,696.00) (District 3-Comm. Edmonson)  
Provide technical assistance to small businesses; this activity will create four (4) jobs.
2. Hialeah Dade Development Inc. - Hialeah Dade Development Inc. 2013 (\$119,819.00) (District 6-Comm. Sosa)  
Provide technical assistance to businesses in Hialeah, Hialeah Gardens, Miami Lakes, Miami Springs, Doral, Virginia Gardens, Medley, and Unincorporated Miami-Dade; this activity will create a minimum of seven (7) jobs.
3. North Dade Community Development Federal Credit Union - Technical Assistance 2013 (\$200,000.00) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Provide technical assistance to small businesses; this activity will create six (6) jobs.
4. Dynamic Community Development Corporation - Economic Development/Tech Assistance 2013 (\$80,000.00) (District 3-Comm. Edmonson)  
Provide technical assistance to small businesses within the Melrose NRSA; this activity will create three (3) jobs.
5. Neighbors and Neighbors Association, Inc. - ESBH Business Incubator (\$150,000.00) (District 3-Comm. Edmonson)  
Business Incubator providing services to ten (10) small businesses; this activity will create four (4) jobs. A business incubator is a service that helps sustain existing businesses and attract new businesses into low-and moderate-income communities by providing cost-effective business support services and resources under one roof.
6. Anaias Investment LLC - Zoe Palacio de Los Jugos 2013 (\$659,819.00) (District 5-Comm. Barreiro)  
Development of restaurant from former auto repair shop, creating a minimum of twenty (20) jobs within the NRSA.
7. Contractors Resource Center, Inc. - Community Contractors & Residents Construction Program 2013 (\$250,000.00) (District 3 - Comm. Edmonson)  
Provide technical assistance to low- to moderate-income business clients to obtain construction contracts; this activity will create seven (7) jobs. The agency was previously awarded funds, completed the activity but had \$3,406.13 left over. These funds are being recaptured and reallocated to this new 2013 activity, as described above.
8. South Florida Urban Ministries - Assets Miami 2013 (\$31,815.91) (District 2-Comm. Monestime)  
Provide technical assistance to small businesses countywide and create one (1) job. The agency was previously awarded funds, completed the activity but had \$6,815.91 left over. These funds are being recaptured and reallocated to this new 2013 activity, as described above.

9. Florida Venture Foundation Inc. - Small Business Support Center Technical Assistance (\$57,052.00) (District 12-Comm. Diaz)

Reallocation of program income in lieu of FY 2013 CDF allocation by District 12. Provide technical assistance to 50 small businesses; this activity will create two (2) jobs.

**Prior Year CDF and Other**

1. Hialeah Dade Development Inc. - Hialeah Dade Development Inc. 2013 (\$55,891.93) (District 6-Comm. Sosa)

Provide technical assistance to businesses in Hialeah, Hialeah Gardens, Miami Lakes, Miami Springs, Doral, Virginia Gardens, Medley, and Unincorporated Miami-Dade; this activity will create a minimum of two (2) jobs. The agency was previously awarded District 6 CDF monies, completed the activity and had \$55,891.93 left over. These funds are being recaptured and reallocated to a new 2013 activity, as described in Item No. 2 under the economic development category.

2. RMV Culinary Enterprises LLC - RMV Culinary Experience Center Special Economic Development (\$250,000.00) (District 8-Comm. Bell)

Activity includes \$100,000 of District 9 CDF monies that are being recaptured and reallocated to this new 2013 activity, which is located in Leisure City and Naranja NRSA. Renovation of existing building to create the Culinary Enterprise Center for training students and entrepreneurs; this activity will create ten (10) new jobs.

3. Neighbors and Neighbors Association, Inc. - ESBH Business Incubator (\$2,584.50) (District 3-Comm. Edmonson)

Business Incubator providing services to 10 small businesses. The agency was previously awarded funds, completed the activity and had \$2,584.50 left over. These funds are being recaptured and reallocated to a new 2013 activity, as described in Item No. 5 under the economic development category..

**Housing**

1. Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services - Housing Rehabilitation Project (\$750,000.00) (Countywide-All Commission Districts)

Housing rehabilitation/weatherization to include storm mitigation and service to approximately 120-140 low- to moderate-income clients.

2. Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services - Housing Assistance Grant Program (\$106,000.00) (Countywide-All Commission Districts)

Tenant-based Rental Assistance (TBRA) for security deposit and utility deposit assistance.

3. Miami-Dade Community Action and Human Services - Housing Assistance Grant Program Delivery (\$22,950.00) (Countywide-All Commission Districts)

Program delivery to administer the Tenant-based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program to provide security deposit and utility deposit assistance.

***Public Facilities and Capital Improvements***

1. Miami-Dade Public Housing and Community Development – Rehabilitation Project (\$1,032,997.55) (Countywide-All Commission Districts)  
Rehabilitation of five (5) public housing developments to include interior and exterior repairs, exterior painting, re-roofing of entrance and stucco repairs.
2. Miami-Dade Public Works and Waste Management - Roadway Improvements in District 12 (\$73,129.00) (District 12-Comm. Diaz)  
Roadway Improvements in District 12 as part of the 2013 CDF Allocation.
3. City of North Miami Beach - NE 172<sup>nd</sup> Roadway Improvements (\$307,000.00) (District 4-Comm. Heyman)  
The City of North Miami Beach applied and was awarded \$737,470.69 through the FY 2009 RFA process. The City requested additional dollars to complete the remaining work. This project requires a waiver of Resolution No. R-596-12 as it is not located in an NRSA. Pursuant to Resolution No. R-596-12, an approval is required by a two-thirds (2/3) vote to award funds to projects outside the NRSA. The Resolution further imposes a cap on the allocation not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total project cost. The total project cost is \$1,707,471.00; the funding reallocated here is eighteen percent (18%) of the total project cost.
4. City of North Miami Beach - Rehabilitation of the Allen Park Recreation Center (\$200,000.00) (District 4-Comm. Heyman)  
The City of North Miami Beach applied in FY 2012 for \$400,000.00 and was awarded \$200,000.00 through a substantial amendment to complete the project. The rehabilitation work will include a roof replacement, interior renovation and the installation of an elevator for access of persons with disabilities at 1770 N.E. 162nd Street. This project is subject to the provisions of Resolution No. R-596-12, which requires that the project be located in an NRSA and a cap on the allocation not to exceed twenty-five (25%) percent of the total project cost, unless waived by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board. The total project cost is \$772,720.00; the funding request is twenty-six percent (26%) of the total project cost, exceeding the cap by \$6,820.00.
5. Assistance to the Elderly, Inc- Dementia/Memory Care Unit Capital Improvements 2013 (\$171,029.32) (District 6-Comm. Sosa)  
New construction of a Dementia/Memory Care Unit for sixty (60) low-to-moderate income dementia clients in an assisted living facility.
6. The Family Christian Association of America - Youth and Family Development Complex (\$726,871.00) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Renovation of existing daycare center; will serve 100 low- to moderate-income children and their families.
7. City of Opa Locka - Ali Baba Avenue Roadway Improvements Project 2013 (\$504,573.58) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Roadway improvements to consist of the upgrade of an existing roadway drainage system, sidewalk widening, median islands, bike lanes and pavement reconstruction and resurfacing.

8. Miracle League – Construction/Rehab Project at Tamiami Park (\$54,727.00) (District 11-Comm. Zapata)  
Develop a baseball facility/field in Tamiami Park for special needs youth with physical disabilities to include the installation of a specialized rubberized field to enable kids with physical disabilities to play baseball at the park.
9. Miami Bridge – Capital Improvements at Miami Bridge Facility (\$18,863.00) (District 5-Comm. Barreiro)  
Rehabilitation facility improvements to the agency's Central Campus located at 2810 NW South River Drive, Miami, Florida, which supports services for abused and neglected children.

**Public Services**

1. Youth Co-Op, Inc.-Youth Co-Op Employment Asst. Center 2013 (\$200,000.00) (District 5-Comm. Barreiro)  
Provide employment and training services for 225 youth in Opa-Locka NRSA and surrounding areas.
2. Ascension Community Development Corporation –Ascension Health Education Leadership Program (Ascension HELP) 2013 (\$89,215.25) (District 9-Comm. Moss)  
Provide health, fitness and educational services to seniors and youth.
3. Miami Bridge - Programmatic Support At-Risk Youth Program (\$37,863.00) (District 5-Comm. Barreiro)  
Provides respite care in its two emergency shelter facilities for more than 700 children annually. The program offers: 24-hour emergency shelter for eligible kids; formal on-site education program with certified Miami-Dade County Public School teachers; structured daily living programs; mental health counseling; and, substance abuse prevention services.
4. Society of Saint Vincent De Paul Archdiocesan Council Miami, Inc. – Food Program For the Needy at Mother of Christ Catholic Church (\$18,728.00) (District 11-Comm. Zapata)  
Purchase of a new freezer to support its Food Program for the Needy, administer/operated at Mother of Christ Catholic Church located at 14141 SW 26<sup>th</sup> Street, Miami, FL. The program serves a minimum of 1,000 low- to moderate-income persons annually on a countywide basis.

**HOME FUNDS (\$2,213,467.52)**

Pursuant to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (U.S. HUD) issued CPD Notice 12-007: FY 2012 HOME Appropriation Requirements for Miami-Dade County require projects to be determined feasible. The purpose of these requirements is to improve project and developer selection by participating jurisdictions and to ensure that there is adequate market demand for the prospective HOME projects. The projects that are recommended for HOME funding in this resolution did not receive a favorable report in the initial Preliminary Feasibility review. However, they have since demonstrated that financing commitments are in place, as required by the U.S. HUD requirement of CPD Notice 12-007. Therefore these projects are recommended for funding. Notwithstanding the foregoing, projects recommended for HOME funding are required to resolve outstanding liability issues with Miami-Dade County and/or close on financing no later than six months after this award of funds.

1. Magnolia North 2145 Apartments - Magnolia North 2145 Apartments 2013 (\$475,000.00) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Acquisition and demolition of an existing building and new construction of 12 units of affordable housing.

2. 143 NW 77<sup>th</sup> Street, LLC - St. John Bahamas Village Apartments 2013 (\$900,000.00) (District 3-Comm. Edmonson)  
New construction of nine (9) affordable rental apartments to provide housing for low income families.
3. Magnolia North Johnson Street Apartments, LLC - Magnolia North Community Center 2013 (\$280,000.00) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Rehabilitation of a quad-plex rental development in the Opa Locka Magnolia North Neighborhood.
4. Magnolia North 15037 Duval Apartments, LLC - 15037 Duval Apartments, LLC 2013 (\$464,000.00) (District 1-Comm. Jordan)  
Public facility funds for the Magnolia North Community Center project located within the City of Opa Locka.
5. Miami-Dade County Regulatory and Environmental Resources - McFarlane District Historic Preservation Initiative (\$90,000.00) (District 7-Comm. Suarez)  
Historic Preservation and rehabilitation of three (3) homes located within the McFarlane Homestead Historic District located in Coral Gables, FL (between Grand Avenue and US-1).
6. Miami-Dade Public Housing and Community Development- Unallocated HOME CHDO Reserve To-be-determined HOME activities (\$4,467.52) (Countywide-All Commission Districts)  
Funding to be allocated to qualified CHDO at future date.


#### **CITIZEN PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS**

U.S. HUD requires that substantial amendments to Annual Action Plans be made available for public comments for a period of 30 calendar days prior to the final adoption of the funding recommendations by the Board. **On March 25, 2013 the County issued a public notice informing the public of the availability of the funding recommendations through a notice published in *The Miami Herald* and posting the notice via PHCD's website and to the Community Advisory Committees (CACs). The 30 day public comment period for the recommendations of Substantial Amendments is from March 25, 2013 through April 29, 2013.** Pursuant to Resolution No. R-697-11 to ensure community participation, the CACs were provided a copy of the recommendations in this resolution **on March 25, 2013.**

#### **SUMMARY**

Approval of the recommendations herein will enable Miami-Dade County to demonstrate efforts to comply with the U.S. HUD Work Out Plan for CDBG, reduce the inventory of open HOME projects and maximize the use of Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds. Miami-Dade County is committed to continuing to serve the low- and moderate-income residents and neighborhoods throughout the County and achieving the U.S. HUD National Objective. The County continues to work with its community development partners to enhance its programs and to meet the public service, economic development, historic preservation, housing, and capital improvement needs of low- and moderate-income residents and neighborhoods.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO AMEND THE FY 1998 THROUGH FY 2013 ACTION PLANS TO RECAPTURE AND REALLOCATE \$6,181,625.04 OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS; ALLOCATE \$260,362.00 OF FY 2013 CDBG FUNDS TO COMMISSION DISTRICTS 11 AND 12; AMEND THE FY 2013 ACTION PLAN TO RECAPTURE AND REALLOCATE \$2,209,000.00 HOME FUNDS; WAIVE THE PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION NO. R-596-12 FOR INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS UNDER THE FINISH WHAT WE STARTED POLICY WHICH REQUIRES A 2/3 VOTE OF THE BOARD; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE ABOVE PROGRAMS; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE THE CANCELLATION PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, including Exhibits I, II and A, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:**

**Section 1.** The Board approves the recaptures and reallocations recommended in the justification memorandum attached hereto and described in Exhibits I and II. The Board authorizes the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to file with United States Housing and Urban Development substantial amendments to the FY 1998 through FY 2013 Action Plans to reflect (a) the recapture and reallocation of \$6,181,625.04 in FY 1998 - 2012 (of prior years) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds; (b) allocate \$260,362.00 of FY 2013

CDBG funds to Commission Districts 11 and 12 (These Commission District Fund (CDF) allocations for Commission Districts 11 and 12 were not included in the FY 2013 Action Plan Funding Recommendations that the Board recently approved March 5, 2013.); and (c) the recapture and reallocation of \$2,209,000.00 in FY 2013 Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds from one activity to four housing rental new construction projects that applied in the FY 2013 RFA that have demonstrated financing commitments are in place and one project administered by the Department of Regulatory and Environmental Resources, as set forth in more detail in the accompanying justification memorandum.

**Section 2.** The Board waives the provisions of Resolution No. R-596-12 for two infrastructure projects, Allen Park renovation and NE 172nd Roadway improvements under the “Finish What We Started” Policy to allow funding of twenty-six percent (26%) of total project cost for renovations to Allen Park and to approve funding of both projects outside of Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Areas (NRSAs). This waiver requires a 2/3 vote of the Board.

**Section 3.** The Board authorizes the County Mayor or the County Mayor’s designee to execute the Conditional Loan Commitment attached herein as Attachment A, which may be modified by the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee, in consultation with the County Attorney’s Office, if such modifications are in the best interest of the County and/or to accomplish the purposes set forth in this resolution; to negotiate and execute all contracts, agreements, amendments, and subordination agreements necessary to accomplish the purposes set forth in this resolution and authorizes the County Mayor or the County Mayor’s designee to exercise the cancellation and other provisions contained therein.



This Conditional Loan Commitment is made based upon the application submitted by Borrower in response to, for HOME funds, the Miami-Dade County Consolidated Request for Applications for FY 2013 Funding – Housing Application, Book Two or, for Surtax funds, the Miami-Dade County Consolidated Request for Applications for FY 2013 Funding – Documentary Stamp Surtax Funding, Book Three (the "RFA") and is subject to the following terms and conditions:

**Loan Amount:** The loan amount of not-to-exceed \$ \_\_\_\_\_ is the amount approved by the BCC in Resolution No. R- \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ and includes all terms and conditions of such BCC approval, including project scope, activity type and, for federal funds, national objective to be achieved (the "Loan"). The loan amount may be decreased as determined by the Mayor or the Mayor's designee, based on the information and documentation provided by Developer

**Conditions:** The Loan is conditioned upon the terms, conditions and requirements set forth below (the "Conditions"). The County shall not issue a final unconditional loan commitment, enter into a funding contract, close on the Loan or disburse the Loan funds until all the Conditions are met.

**Collateral:** Upon satisfaction of the Conditions, Miami-Dade County (County) and Borrower will enter into a funding contract and loan agreement. The Loan shall be evidenced by a promissory note and secured by a construction/permanent mortgage with assignment of leases and rents, a collateral assignment of leases and rents, a collateral assignment of construction documents, a rental regulatory agreement (where applicable), and any other security or collateral as deemed appropriate by the Mayor or Mayor's designee, in his or her sole discretion, with approval of the County Attorney's Office. Borrower shall additionally be required to provide the County with an environmental indemnification agreement, a UCC-1, title affidavit, partnership affidavit (if applicable), corporate resolution approving the loan documents, opinion of counsel, certification of borrower to borrower's counsel, and title policy making the County an insured. The Collateral shall be determined based upon financial feasibility and subsidy layering underwriting to be performed by County staff in an internal process and by an

independent underwriter and paid for by Borrower ("Underwriting") following review of a current title search. Additional forms of security may be required if liens, encumbrances, restrictions or covenants exist on the Property which the Mayor or Mayor's designee determines, in his or her sole discretion, threaten the County's Collateral. The Mayor or Mayor's designee shall determine, in his or her sole discretion and in consultation with the County Attorney's Office, whether the Collateral provided by Borrower is sufficient to close and disburse the Loan.

**Interest Rate:** Loan terms, including the interest rate, are those set forth in the RFA, on page 19 for HOME funds or page 9 for Surtax funds, as modified prior to closing by the Mayor or Mayor's designee in accordance with the results of Underwriting.

**Repayable:** There will be no penalty for prepayment of the Loan (payment of Loan balance before the end of the repayment term). Repayment terms are those set forth in the RFA, on page 19 for HOME funds or page 9 for Surtax funds, as modified prior to closing by the Mayor or Mayor's designee in accordance with the results of Underwriting. The prepayment of any Loan shall not affect the term of affordability set forth in the Rental Regulatory Agreement or in any of the other Loan Documents.

**Term:** The Loan will be for the period of time set forth in the RFA, on page 19 for HOME funds or page 9 for Surtax funds, as it may be modified prior to closing by the Mayor or Mayor's designee in accordance with the results of Underwriting.

**Conditions:**

1. Underwriting, as explained above, shall include financial feasibility review, subsidy layering review, and credit review. Underwriting is performed to protect the County's scarce affordable housing funds and is performed to ensure that the Project has sufficient financing to be completed timely and that the Project is not over-subsidized, meaning the Loan is not needed or the Loan Amount is too high. The County reserves the right to reduce the Loan Amount subject to Underwriting. The County further reserves the right to refuse to issue a final, unconditional loan commitment to Borrower or to enter into a contract for the Loan or to close on the Loan in the event that Underwriting determines that the project is financially unfeasible or otherwise is unfeasible. The costs of Underwriting are to be paid by Borrower.
2. Borrower must prove control of the Property through purchase or lease, as evidenced by a deed or lease and recorded memorandum of lease in Borrower's name. Absence of any threat of foreclosure, taking by eminent domain, or pending bankruptcy are additionally required.
3. Borrower must provide the County with written financing commitments showing committed financing for the entire Development Cost of the Project, including any gaps between the Loan and the overall costs to develop the Project. The Development Cost of the Project means the total cost of completing the entire Project, from acquisition to the issuance of Certificate of Occupancy, including but not limited to the costs for acquisition, design and planning, zoning and variances, financing costs, legal costs, construction, and permitting. In the event of a dispute as to what amount constitutes the

actual Development Cost, Borrower and County will use the amount determined by Underwriting to be the Development Cost.

4. Conformance of the Project design with the application submitted in the RFA, unless changes are approved by the Mayor or Mayor's designee.
5. Complete plans and specifications of the Project.
6. Payment and performance bond in the amount of the entire construction budget or otherwise in conformance with applicable law. Where a payment and performance bond is not required by law, the Mayor or Mayor's designee may alternatively accept – at the Mayor or Mayor's designee's sole discretion – a letter of credit in an amount acceptable to the Mayor or Mayor's designee.
7. Appraisal of the Property showing that the value of the Project and Property, when completed, exceeds the total amount of debt from all sources to be secured by the Project, unless waived by the Mayor or Mayor's designee.
8. A Phase I environmental report requiring no further action.
9. Such other conditions which are customary and reasonable for a loan of this nature, such as adhering to all Federal, State and local regulations, ordinances, codes and standards.
10. Meeting all requirements of the [[HOME]] [[Surtax]] program.

This Conditional Loan Commitment **will expire in six (6) months** if not extended by Miami-Dade County. An extension of this Conditional Loan Commitment must be signed by the Mayor or Mayor's Designee to be valid. If the loan does not close prior to the expiration or extension of this Conditional Loan Commitment, the funds will be subject to recapture and allocated to other projects.

This Conditional Loan Commitment is not assignable. This Conditional Loan Commitment is the sole and complete agreement between the parties as to the terms of the Loan described herein. The terms of this Conditional Loan Commitment may only be changed in writing in a document signed by the Mayor or the Mayor's designee. No representations, written or verbal, of Miami-Dade County employees, or others purporting to act on behalf of Miami-Dade County, may change the terms of this Commitment.
