Subject: Resolution Ratifying the Submission of a Grant Application to the Florida Inland Navigation District, Waterways Assistance Program for up to \$500,000.00 in Grant Funds Providing Matching Funds from the Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond Program to Construct Two (2) Sections of the Miami River Greenway

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached resolution ratifying the submission of a grant application to the Florida Inland Navigation District, Waterways Assistance Program for up to \$500,000.00 in grant funds for the construction of two (2) sections of the Miami River Greenway, and further authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to receive and expend funds and execute contracts and amendments as required.

SCOPE

These sections of the Miami River Greenway are located at sites on the Miami River as follows: the North Shore beneath the Metrorail on SW 1 Avenue, and the South Shore beneath the Metrorail on SW 1 Court. All sites are located within the City of Miami, in Bruno A. Barreiro's Commission District 5. The Miami River Greenway will provide public access to the Miami River for all residents and visitors to Miami-Dade County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

The total construction cost for this project is \$1,327,680.00, of which \$1,024,025.00 are considered eligible for the Florida Inland Navigation District Grant program. Of the \$1,024,025.00 in eligible costs, the County is applying for \$500,000.00 in grant funding and will provide a County match of \$524,025.00. The grant match of \$524,025.00, along with the balance of \$303,655.00, will be provided by future bond funding from the Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond Program. The funding index code for this project is CPG126PW1283, and the Capital project number is 6010960.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

No additional authority is being requested within the body of this contract.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

The grant will be administered by the Miami-Dade County Public Works and Waste Management Department (PWWM). The Project Manager responsible for monitoring project construction is Bassam Moubayed, CFM, Chief, Construction Division, PWWM.

BACKGROUND

On November 2, 2004, voters approved the Building Better Communities General Obligation Bond and associated capital improvement projects throughout the County. The list of projects includes Project No. 126 - "Miami River Greenway." The project consists of the construction of six (6) separate County-owned parcels which will provide continuity to the Miami River Greenway Network. A previous grant application was approved by the Florida Inland Navigation District for Miami River Greenway Sites 1, 2, 3 and 6, which are currently under construction.

This application is being submitted to provide funding for Miami River Greenway Sites 4 and 5. Project items will include the construction of a 25-foot wide public pedestrian/bicycle shared use riverwalk, featuring a minimum 16-foot wide unobstructed concrete pathway, buffer zone with bollard lighting along the waterfront, landscaping, benches, trash receptacles, decorative lighting, wayfinding signage, bike racks, and pet stations.

The Florida Inland Navigation District is a Special State Taxing District for the continued management and maintenance of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway. The Waterways Assistance Program is a grant program established by the Florida Legislature and the District for the purpose of financially cooperating with local governments to alleviate problems related to the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway and associated waterways within the District. The Miami River Greenway is located along a Federal Navigable Channel, which directly connects to the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway. The Florida Inland Navigation District required the submission of an application by April 1, 2013. As a component of the application, a copy of the attached Resolution must be submitted by no later than May 31, 2013. If the application is successful, grant funds will be available in October 2013.

The project is tentatively scheduled to begin construction in February 2014, and is anticipated to be completed by the end of October 2014.

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT, WATERWAYS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR UP TO \$500,000.00 IN GRANT FUNDS PROVIDING MATCHING FUNDING FROM THE BUILDING BETTER COMMUNITIES GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND PROGRAM TO CONSTRUCT TWO (2) SECTIONS OF THE MIAMI RIVER GREENWAY AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO RECEIVE AND EXPEND FUNDS, AND TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County is interested in carrying out the following described project for the enjoyment of the citizenry of Miami-Dade County and the State of Florida:

Project Title: Miami River Greenway

Total Estimated Construction Costs: \$1,327,680.00

Total Estimated Grant-Eligible Costs: \$1,024,025.00 (Waterways Assistance Program eligible costs)

Brief Description of Project: Construction of two (2) sections of the Miami River Greenway, on separate County-owned parcels, which will provide continuity to the Miami River Greenway Network. The project includes the construction of a 25 ft wide pedestrian/bicycle shared use riverwalk including lighting,

landscaping, and hardscape elements such as benches and trash receptacles, seawall construction, drainage, landscape architecture details, and all of the necessary incidental items for a complete project; and

WHEREAS, Florida Inland Navigation District financial assistance is required for the program mentioned above,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board ratifies the submission of a Grant Application to the Florida Inland Navigation District Waterways Assistance Program to apply for up to \$500,000.00 in grant funds from the Florida Inland Navigation District for the construction of sections of the Miami River Greenway and that the project described above be authorized;

AND, be it further resolved that said Miami-Dade County makes application to the Florida Inland Navigation District in the amount of approximately 48.8% of the actual grant-eligible costs of the project on behalf of said Miami-Dade County;

AND, to comply with the conditions of the Grant Program, be it further resolved by Miami-Dade County that it certifies to the following:

1. That it will accept the terms and conditions set forth in Florida Inland Navigation District Rule 66B-2 F.A.C. and which will be a part of the Project Agreement for any assistance awarded under the attached proposal.
2. That it is in complete accord with the attached proposal and that it will carry out the Program in the manner described in the proposal and any plans and specifications attached thereto unless prior approval for any change has been received from the District.
3. That it has the ability and intention to finance its share of the cost of the project and that the project will be operated and maintained at the expense of said Miami-Dade County for public use.

4. That it will not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color or national origin in the use of any property or facility acquired or developed pursuant to this proposal, and shall comply with the terms and intent of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, P. L. 88-352 (1964) and design and construct all facilities to comply fully with statutes relating to accessibility by handicapped persons as well as other federal, state and local laws, rules and requirements.

5. That it will maintain adequate financial records on the proposed project to substantiate claims for reimbursement.

6. That it will make available to the Florida Inland Navigation District if requested, a post-audit of expenses incurred on the project prior to, or in conjunction with, request for the final 10% of the funding agreed to by the Florida Inland Navigation District.

AND, be it resolved that the Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute such contracts and agreements as are required by this governmental body following approval by the County Attorney's Office; to receive and expend all monies for the purposes described in the funding request; and to file and execute any necessary amendments to the agreement for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.








2 SITE 4 ELEVATION




1 SITE 4 PLAN





SEA TURTLE AND SMALLTOOTH SAWFISH CONSTRUCTION CONDITIONS

The permittee shall comply with the following protected species construction conditions:

- a. The permittee shall instruct all personnel associated with the project of the potential presence of these species and the need to avoid collisions with sea turtles and smalltooth sawfish. All construction personnel are responsible for observing water-related activities for the presence of these species.
- b. The permittee shall advise all construction personnel that there are civil and criminal penalties for harming, harassing, or killing sea turtles or smalltooth sawfish, which are protected under the Endangered Species Act of 1973.
- c. Siltation barriers shall be made of material in which a sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish cannot become entangled, be properly secured, and be regularly monitored to avoid protected species entrapment. Barriers may not block sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish entry to or exit from designated critical habitat without prior agreement from the National Marine Fisheries Service's Protected Resources Division, St. Petersburg, Florida.
- d. All vessels associated with the construction project shall operate at "no wake/idle" speeds at all times while in the construction area and while in water depths where the draft of the vessel provides less than a four-foot clearance from the bottom. All vessels will preferentially follow deep-water routes (e.g., marked channels) whenever possible.
- e. If a sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish is seen within 100 yards of the active daily construction/dredging operation or vessel movement, all appropriate precautions shall be implemented to ensure its protection. These precautions shall include cessation of operation of any moving equipment closer than 50 feet of a sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish. Operation of any mechanical construction equipment shall cease immediately if a sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish is seen within a 50-ft radius of the equipment. Activities may not resume until the protected species has departed the project area of its own volition.
- f. Any collision with and/or injury to a sea turtle or smalltooth sawfish shall be reported immediately to the National Marine Fisheries Service's Protected Resources Division (727-824-5312) and the local authorized sea turtle stranding/rescue organization.
- g. Any special construction conditions, required of your specific project, outside these general conditions, if applicable, will be addressed in the primary consultation.

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STANDARD MANATEE CONDITIONS FOR IN-WATER WORK

2011

The permittee shall comply with the following conditions intended to protect manatees from direct project effects:

- a. All personnel associated with the project shall be instructed about the presence of manatees and manatee speed zones, and the need to avoid collisions with and injury to manatees. The permittee shall advise all construction personnel that there are civil and criminal penalties for harming, harassing, or killing manatees which are protected under the Marine Mammal Protection Act, the Endangered Species Act, and the Florida Manatee Sanctuary Act.
- b. All vessels associated with the construction project shall operate at "Idle Speed/No Wake" at all times while in the immediate area and while in water where the draft of the vessel provides less than a four-foot clearance from the bottom. All vessels will follow routes of deep water whenever possible.
- c. Siltation or turbidity barriers shall be made of material in which manatees cannot become entangled, shall be properly secured, and shall be regularly monitored to avoid manatee entanglement or entrapment. Barriers must not impede manatee movement.
- d. All on-site project personnel are responsible for observing water-related activities for the presence of manatee(s). All in-water operations, including vessels, must be shutdown if a manatee(s) comes within 50 feet of the operation. Activities will not resume until the manatee(s) has moved beyond the 50-foot radius of the project operation, or until 30 minutes elapses if the manatee(s) has not reappeared within 50 feet of the operation. Animals must not be herded away or harassed into leaving.
- e. Any collision with or injury to a manatee shall be reported immediately to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) Hotline at 1-888-404-3922. Collision and/or injury should also be reported to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Jacksonville (1-904-731-3336) for north Florida or Vero Beach (1-772-562-3909) for south Florida, and to FWC at ImperiledSpecies@myFWC.com
- f. Temporary signs concerning manatees shall be posted prior to and during all in-water project activities. All signs are to be removed by the permittee upon completion of the project. Temporary signs that have already been approved for this use by the FWC must be used. One sign which reads *Caution: Boaters* must be posted. A second sign measuring at least 8 ½" by 11" explaining the requirements for "Idle Speed/No Wake" and the shut down of in-water operations must be posted in a location prominently visible to all personnel engaged in water-related activities.
