

SUBJECT: RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CITY OF HIALEAH CO-DESIGNATION OF THAT PORTION OF WEST 1ST AVENUE FROM WEST 5TH STREET TO WEST 6TH STREET AS "WOMAN'S CLUB AVENUE"

Ordinance No. 13-29, adopted on April 2, 2013, requires the Office of the Commission Auditor (OCA) to complete background research on any person, organization, place or thing that is the subject of a naming, re-naming or co-designation item.

In accordance with the Ordinance we are providing this report as a supplement to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) Agenda Item 3(A).

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 13-29, the OCA completed background research regarding BCC Agenda Item 3(A), Resolution approving the co-designation of that portion of West 1st Avenue from West 5th Street to West 6th Street as "Woman's Club Avenue" and there were no adverse findings.

The General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC), founded in 1890, has been a unifying force, bringing together local women's clubs from around the country and throughout the world. Although there is considerable diversity in the ages, interests, and experiences of GFWC clubwomen, all are united by a dedication to community improvement through volunteer service.

The GFWC Woman's Club of Hialeah was founded on May 4th, 1923 and incorporated on January 25th, 1930. It is federated with General Federation of Women's Clubs, 1926; GFWC Florida Federation of Women's Clubs, 1925; and Dade County Federation of Women's Club, 1923.

The GFWC Woman's Club of Hialeah is a 501(c)3 non-profit volunteer service organization providing opportunities for education, leadership training and community service enabling the members to make a difference and an impact in the life of others.

On March 12, 2013, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hialeah, through Resolution No. 13-17, co-designated that portion of West 1st Avenue from West 5th Street to West 6th Street as "Woman's Club Avenue."
