SUBJECT: RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING SW 90TH AVENUE BETWEEN SW 28TH STREET AND SW 32ND STREET AS "MAJOR GARY SHIMMINGER WAY"

Ordinance No. 13-29, adopted on April 2, 2013, requires the Office of the Commission Auditor (OCA) to complete background research on any person, organization, place or thing that is the subject of a naming, re-naming or co-designation item.

In accordance with the Ordinance we are providing this report as a supplement to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) Agenda Item 5(N).

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 13-29, the OCA completed background research regarding BCC Agenda Item 5(N), Resolution co-designating SW 90th Avenue between SW 28th Street and SW 32nd Street as "Major Gary Shimminger Way" and there were no adverse findings.
