RESOLUTION NAMING BASEBALL FIELD NUMBER 5 AT TAMAMI PARK, LOCATED AT 11201 SOUTHWEST 24TH STREET, AS THE "OVIDIO ACOSTA BASEBALL FIELD," AFTER A PUBLIC HEARING, AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO COORDINATE WITH THE DISTRICT 11 COMMISSIONER TO INSTALL APPROPRIATE SIGNAGE INDICATING DESIGNATION USING DISTRICT 11 QUALITY NEIGHBORHOODS IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (QNIP) FUNDS

WHEREAS, Ovidio Acosta, born in Cuba on July 12, 1919, founded the Miami Friends Baseball Association, Inc., in 1986 as a non-profit corporation that provides baseball programs to Miami-Dade County's youth; and

WHEREAS, Ovidio Acosta served as President of the Miami Friends Baseball Association from its founding until his death on April 9, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Miami Friends Baseball Association has been tremendously successful in giving the youth of Miami-Dade County access to baseball programs, growing from 13 teams and 124 participants in 1986 to 98 teams and 1,201 participants in 2012; and

WHEREAS, by waiving league fees and providing financial assistance and spiritual guidance to underprivileged families, Ovidio Acosta ensured that access to Miami Friends Baseball Association's successful program was not limited to those children whose families had the financial means to afford it; and

WHEREAS, in addition to providing a successful and accessible baseball program to Miami-Dade County's youth, Ovidio Acosta and the Miami Friends Baseball Association were instrumental in securing substantial improvements to the baseball fields at Tamiami Park, including the lighting on fields 9 through 12; and

WHEREAS, the successes and contributions of Ovidio Acosta and the Miami Friends Baseball Association have been consistently recognized by local governments—including Miami-Dade County in 1992, 1996, 1997, 2000, and 2010 and the City of Sweetwater in 1993—and merited the receipt, in 2002, of the Diamond Award from United to Serve America; and

WHEREAS, by naming a field at Tamiami Park as the “Ovidio Acosta Baseball Field,” this Board desires to make a lasting recognition of Ovidio Acosta’s legacy as a selfless servant to the Miami-Dade County community and mentor and friend to the thousands of baseball players that have played at Tamiami Park,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. After a public hearing, desires to honor Ovidio Acosta’s legacy by naming baseball field number 5 at Tamiami Park, located at 11201 Southwest 24th Street, as the “Ovidio Acosta Baseball Field”.

Section 2. Further directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to coordinate and work with the Commissioner of District 11 to install an appropriate marker to indicate this designation using District 11 Quality Neighborhoods Improvement Program (QNIP) funds.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Ovidio Acosta’s next of kin.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan C. Zapata. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
